## CLASSES BEGIN AT 9:00AM AND END AT 10:15AM

Queen of Angels Church has a long tradition of providing catechetical instruction for youth of all ages. Our program includes a class for Preschoolers and continues through Confirmation.

We honor the parents in our community as the primary teachers and models for their children. We provide a comprehensive, grade level specific catechesis, and our catechists are well formed, with a true passion for teaching.

We provide a safe and welcoming environment for the students and offer many activities and opportunities throughout the school year.

#### CURRICULUM

Our middle school program is a three-year rotating curriculum, and is a combined class for 6<sup>th</sup>, 7<sup>th</sup>, and 8<sup>th</sup> grade students. This year we will use the YouCat.



Developed with the help of young Catholics and written for high-school age people and young adults. YOUCAT is an accessible, contemporary expression of the Catholic Faith. Includes questions and answers, commentary, readable summaries, definitions of key terms, Biblical citations and quotes from the saints. Keyed to the Catechism of the Catholic Church. Explains doctrine, sacraments, moral life, prayer and spirituality. We will be using the VCat, which is a video catechism that is utilized in conjunction with the YouCat. The YouCat was developed several years ago as a way to present the Catechism of the Catholic Church to youth in language they can more easily comprehend.
