# Sacramental Preparation for Second Grade Students

## CLASSES BEGIN AT 9:00 AM AND END AT 10:15AM

At Queen of Angels Church we honor the parents in our community as the primary teachers and models for their children.

We provide Sacramental Preparation for students in the Second Grade in order that they may receive the Sacraments of Reconciliation and Holy Communion.

The students will receive their preparation during the normal religious education hour on Sundays. The curriculum utilizes scripture, the catechism of the Catholic Church, the lives of the saints and family activities.

This year the children will celebrate their First Holy Communion during a special Mass Saturday May 16, 2020 at 11:00a.m.

#### To enroll in this class your child must:

Be a second grade student for school year 2019/2020

> Have been baptized in the Catholic Church

#### PARENTS MUST:

Commit to bringing the child to class every Sunday (23 sessions total)

Commit to attend Mass every Sunday

Commit to attending parent meetings and catechetical sessions

Classes are every Sunday beginning September 8<sup>th</sup>, 2019 and continuing through May 17<sup>th</sup>, 2020 with the following exceptions;

### WHY DO I HAVE TO PREPARE MY CHILD FOR THE SACRAMENT OF HOLY COMMUNION?

When you presented your child to the Church for Baptism, you were reminded that you have the responsibility of "raising them in the practice of the faith" (The Rite of Baptism for Children, 109). This obligation and privilege extends to sacramental preparation. You also know your child better than anyone else, which places you in the best position to help your child uncover the mystery of the Eucharist with words and experiences he or she will understand. No matter what else is done in the parish or school to prepare your child, it is only as effective as the support received in the home. Think of this as an opportunity to deepen your own faith and understanding as well as vour child's.

### WHAT IF I DO NOT GO TO MASS?

As you probably already know, what you do or do not do speaks volumes. If this is the case, now may be a good time for you to look at why you have made the choice not to participate in the worship life of the community. Examine your reasons. Is it because you have serious questions about the Church? Have you just let other things take priority on the weekend? Are you alienated for a specific reason? Are you willing to speak to a priest or someone on the parish staff about it? Whatever your reasons are, it is important for you to know that if your child is going to celebrate First Communion, you have a responsibility to make sure he or she is able to get to Mass every Sunday during the preparation and after.



We appreciate your commitment to your child's faith formation and understand the challenges facing modern day families. It is of particular importance that while your child is preparing to receive the Sacraments, your family is attending Mass every weekend. A log will be available for you to record which Mass your child attended, or the name of the parish if not Queen of Angels. The Catechism of the Catholic Church states, "The Sunday Eucharist is the foundation and confirmation of all Christian practice. For this reason the faithful are obliged to participate in the Eucharist on days of obligation, unless excused for a serious reason (for example, illness, the care of infants) or dispensed by their own pastor. Those who deliberately fail in this obligation commit a grave sin" (CCC 2181). If your family is traveling, you can find a nearby church at www.masstimes.org
