# Queen of Angels Giving Cree; November 27 - December 26



This year we continue our Giving Tree practice with its home in the entrance of the church. Below is a brief description of the groups to help you decide which charity (or charities) you want to choose.

- The orphanages of Tecate and the Sisters of Villa Anahuac, of the Order of St. Brigida are part of the Giving Tree for Advent. Your donation will help these wonderful ministries which represent the Love of God in our world, continue in their ministry to orphan children and ministry to the poor. In the words of Pope Benedict XVI, "Love of neighbor is grounded in the Love of God."
- Villa Anahuac: A monastery of 10 nuns south of Tecate. The Sisters of Villa Anahuac, who are of the order of St. Brigida, are desperately in need of more cells for their expanding convent. The Sisters are semi-cloistered, similar to the Poor Clares and Carmelities. They do work in the community and stay close to the people. These very poor families work locally and earn only a few dollars a day.
- Children of the Immaculate Heart of Mary: The mission of Children of the Immaculate Heart of Mary is to serve survivors of human trafficking and open the door to their restoration in Jesus Christ.
- East County Pregnancy Care Clinic exists to serve women and their unborn children. They provide accurate information about the developing life in the mother's womb and life- affirming alternatives to abortion.

## **PASTOR'S PAGE**

#### Friends,

This year the Third Sunday of Advent – Gaudete Sunday – falls on the same day as the Feast of Our Lady of Guadalupe. But rather than recount the entire story of Our Lady of Guadalupe, I would like to share some of the amazing and beautiful insights into the image of her that appeared on St. Juan Diego's tilma when he brought the sign to Bishop Zumarraga as he had been instructed. This is just a cursory overview of part of the codex that the image was to the Aztec people at that time, but I hope that you enjoy reading these as much as I did. Special thanks to the Shrine of Our Lady of Guadalupe.

- Our Lady of Guadalupe appeared to Saint Juan Diego on December 9, 10 and 12, 1531.
- The image on Juan Diego's tilma has remained intact with all its original vibrancy for 475 years. The natural life span of a cloak made with fiber from the agave or maguey plant is about 30 years at most.
- The image itself is a pictograph or codex which could be read and understood by the Aztec Indians.
- Our Lady appears as a beautiful young mestiza maiden that is, part Aztec and part Spanish, a group of people who were commonly treated as outcasts by both sides during that time but also a Queen.
- ♦ Her eyes are looking down with humility and compassion. She is human, not God.
- ♦ She is wearing a blue-green mantle (the color worn by Aztec royalty) covered with stars.
- The stars on her mantle signify she comes from heaven and is the Queen of Heaven. The constellations are in the exact position as they appeared before dawn on the morning of December 12, 1531.
- ♦ Her robe is colored rose or pale red and covered with Aztec flowers, symbolic of an Aztec princess.
- She wears a black maternity band around her waist, signifying she is with Child.
- In the center of her robe, overlying her womb, is a four petal quincunx flower in the shape of a cross which is the sign of the Divine and the center of the cosmic order to the Aztec. The Virgin's Baby, Jesus, is Divine and the center of the universe.
- ♦ The eight petal flowers on her robe symbolize the day of new creation, with the blossom in the form of a hill and the stem presented as a river. "Hill-water" represented the concept of civilization, and the hill in particular represented the highest point of encounter between God and man.
- ♦ Her hands are joined in prayer which the Spaniards would recognize and if you look closely, her knee is also raised, indicating that she is dancing which the Aztecs understood to mean that she is praying so since she is in prayer herself, she is not God, but she points her finger to the cross on her brooch.
- That black cross on her brooch signifies that she is a follower of the God of the Spanish Missionaries, Jesus Christ, who died on the cross for all humanity.
- ♦ She stands in front of the sun. The sun symbolizes the greatest Aztec god Huitzilopochtli. She announces the God who is greater than the Aztec sun god.
- ♦ She stands on the moon. The crescent moon symbolized the Aztec god Quetzalcoatl, the feathered serpent. She has crushed and defeated him.
- An angel with eagle's wings supports the Mother of God. The eagle was the "bird of the sun." Here the eagle is the servant of the Virgin. She holds her mantle in one hand and robe with the other, signifying the Son she bears is from both heaven and earth.
- ◆ The image on the tilma was able to do what, up to that time, the missionaries were not able to do significantly, namely, to clearly explain Christianity to the indigenous people. After the apparitions, however, eight million Native Americans in Mexico converted to Catholicism from 1531 to 1538 roughly the equivalent of a Pentecost every single day for seven years.


Looking for a unique, inexpensive and useful Christmas gift for family and friends?
