PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

Over the next three weeks we will be spending the first five or so minutes before Mass begins going over the parts of the Mass as a way to remind ourselves the beauty of the liturgy and the significance of everything we do as we pray the Mass every Sunday as a family. This week we will hear about the introductory and concluding rites; next week we will hear about the Liturgy of the Word; and the third and final week we will hear about the Liturgy of the Eucharist. I intend to include here, in the bulletin, a brief summary of the main points each week, or on occasion, those points that I think deserve a little bit more of a deep dive.

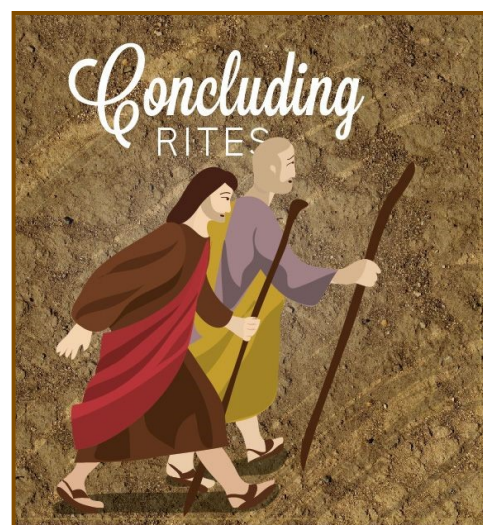
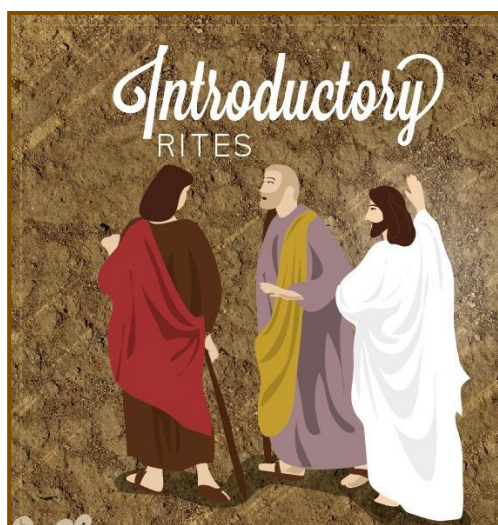
This week, as I said, we are reviewing the introductory and concluding rites. Although it may sound like these are the least important parts of the Mass, in fact, they carry a great deal of importance.

We begin the Mass, as we begin every prayer, with the Sign of the Cross. Immediately the presider (priest or bishop) says, "The Lord be with you," which ought to be a frightening thing for us to hear, because every time in the Old Testament that someone hears those words spoken to them, it means that God is calling them to follow Him in a radical way. And that is precisely how we begin every Mass, with a reminder of God's call for each and every one of us. But since none of us are able to live out our call to holiness on our own without the grace of Jesus Christ, we must first acknowledge our own sinfulness and our need for His mercy. We confess to all of our brothers and sisters, both those assembled with us and those praying with us and for us in heaven, that we are sinners: in our thoughts, in our words, in our deeds, and in our failure to do good when we had the opportunity. And we pray for one another and for ourselves in that moment, asking for God's mercy, that we might approach the rest of the Mass with worthy hearts. On Sundays and major feast days, we sing the Gloria, a hymn whose first words are taken from the angelic hymn sung by the choirs of heaven to announce the birth of Christ (Lk 2:14), as we prepare for Jesus to be present among us once again, in Word and in Sacrament. The introductory rites end with the Collect prayer, which does exactly what its name implies, as we collect together all of the requests and burdens that we have brought with us and present them to the Lord, and even more importantly, collect ourselves as we enter in the Liturgy of the Word to hear God speak His truth into the darkness of our lives...

The concluding rites, which takes place after the Communion rite, is very short, and likely very familiar. It probably is many people's favorite part of the Mass, because it is the part where we finally get to go home. The whole rite is just three lines of dialogue between the presider and the people, but once again, something very important is taking place. We hear the same blessing that began the Mass – "The Lord be with you," – so immediately we know that we are being called by God in a radical way to accomplish His will somehow. We receive the priestly blessing and conclude our prayer as we began it, with the Sign of the Cross. Then the presider speaks some of the most important words of the whole Mass as he says, "Go forth, the Mass is ended," or "Go in peace, glorifying the Lord by your life," or my personal favorite, "Go and announce the Gospel of the Lord." I used to laugh as a child whenever I heard the first option, because when we would all reply, "Thanks be to God!" it sounded like everyone was so relieved that Mass was finally over! But in reality, we are giving thanks to God for all that He has given us in the last hour through the mystery of the Mass, and that He has now given us the grace to share what we have received, knowing that He is with us!
