

## All Saints' Day 2021

"As the dispensation from attending Mass on Sundays and Holy Days of Obligation was lifted back in July, please remember that Monday, November 1<sup>st</sup>, All Saints' Dav. is a Holy Day of Obligation in the Catholic Church. All of the Faithful are expected to attend Mass on a Holy Day of Obligation except in cases of grave necessity. Attending Mass the previous Sunday, which is a separate obligation, does not exempt one from observing the Holy Day."

Queen of Angels will have two Masses on November 1<sup>st</sup>, at 9 AM and 7 PM. November 2<sup>nd</sup>, All Souls' Day, is not a Holy Day of Obligation, but it is observed, so daily Mass will take place at the usual time.

**Tues:** 8 AM (All Souls' Day is NOT a Holy Day of Obligation, even if it's very popular like Ash Wednes-



### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

#### Friends,

As we continue to walk-through the parts of the Mass, this weekend we are hearing about the Liturgy of the Eucharist, and we pick up where we left off last week. The Liturgy of the Word ends with the prayers of the faithful, as we bring all of our burdens and lay them at the feet of Jesus. This flows directly into the Liturgy of the Eucharist, because those prayer requests, along with our gifts of bread and wine, and yes, even the weekly collection, are what we bring to the altar during the Offertory. God always takes the little that we bring, no matter how imperfect or broken it is, and makes something beautiful with it, so we trust Him to do the same with our lives as we offer ourselves and our comparatively pathetic gifts to Him, knowing that He will give us something even greater in return and bring beauty out of brokenness. And He does just that in the Liturgy of the Eucharist.

As the gifts (the bread and wine) are brought forward, the priest or deacon prepares the altar. When the gifts arrive, there are a series of silent prayers that the priest offers up as he asks God to accept the sacrifice that His people are about to offer Him. The priest then asks the people to join him in asking God for this in what is called the Offertory Prayer. Before we get to the "main event" of the Liturgy of the Eucharist, we have the Preface, where the priest again says, "The Lord be with you." As we have noted before, this is a form of the greeting God's people receive when they are about to be asked to do something for Him. And so it is here: we acknowledge in that brief exchange that we are about to enter into the presence of the Lord as we join Jesus in offering up to the Father, with the Holy Spirit, the once-for-all sacrifice of Christ on the Cross. We transition to the Eucharistic Prayer with the heavenly hymn, the Sanctus, or "Holy, Holy, Holy!" We actually encounter these words in the Old Testament, when the prophet Isaiah has a vision of heaven and hears the Seraphim angels singing this song as they worship around the throne of God (Isa 6). The second part of the Sanctus comes from John 12, when Jesus enters into Jerusalem. Both of these taken together announce to us, in case there was any confusion, that we are about to enter the Holy of Holies and be in the very presence of God Himself!

Whole books can and have been written about the Eucharistic prayers that take place after we kneel following the Sanctus. In fact, each Gospel centers around the Passion Narrative, which begin with the accounts of the Last Supper and the Institution Narrative. The words of institution that Jesus speaks at the Last Supper when he first turned bread and wine into His own body and blood are repeated at every Mass, as the priest, acting in persona Christi (in the person of Christ) makes Christ's once-for-all sacrifice present again. It is the priest's hands we see and his voice we hear, but it is Jesus Himself who speaks the words and performs the miracle, and as the host and chalice are each elevated in turn, we know and believe that He is with us! And not just in an esoteric or spiritual sense, but truly and physically present among us! At every Mass Jesus fulfills the promise made to the house of David (Isa 7), when God declared, "He will be called Immanuel, 'God-with-us!'" He also keeps His own promise to us, His disciples. The last spoken words of Jesus as he ascended into heaven (Mt 28) are a call to evangelize the world and a promise of His own presence among us: "Go therefore and make disciples of all the nations, baptizing them in the name of the Father, and of the Son, and of the Holy Spirit, teaching them to obey everything I have commanded you. And lo, I am with you always, to the very end of the age." In the Eucharist Jesus keeps his promise to us to be with us always, until the end of all things, all the way to eternity. Although I probably should write more about Christ's true presence in the Eucharist, in the interest of brevity, we will leave it there for now. Our responsibility as the Faithful, as we approach the Lord in Holy Communion, is to believe what we are receiving – or rather, to believe **who** we are receiving. And we acknowledge this throughout the Communion Rite, first as we hear the words of St. John the Baptist ("Behold the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world!" Jn 1) and the words of the angel who showed St. John the Evangelist the vision of heaven in Revelation ("Blessed are those invited to the wedding feast of the Lamb!" Rv 19) and then as we all respond with the words of great faith spoken by the Centurion (Lk 7) who recognized that there was nothing he could do to adequately prepare himself to receive the presence of Jesus: "Lord, I am not worthy that you should enter under my roof, but only say the word..."

Ultimately the Eucharist reminds us of our complete dependence on God and opens us up to the healing and constant conversion that we all need in our lives, but is only available to us through Christ. And hopefully it also reminds us to be grateful that, even though none of us could ever hope to be worthy, Jesus still loves us enough to be present to us and unite himself with us. Blessed are we, who though unworthy, have been invited to the wedding feast of the Lamb of God who heals us and takes away our sins, and those of the whole world!
