

The weekend begins at 8pm on Friday and ends at 4pm on Sunday.



PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

I want to briefly clear up some possible confusion from last week regarding the announcement of liturgical ministers. The establishment of "term limits" (which I acknowledge may not have been the best wording) is not intended to put a moratorium on anyone's time in a given ministry; in fact, I expect that most individuals will continue to serve for many years. There is no limit to the number of terms a person can serve, but having "terms" (for lack of a better word) does provide the following for us. Terms provide regular opportunities for training and staying up to date. This is something that is common in every walk of life. Terms also provide regularly scheduled face time with the pastor on how things are going, and if the ministers or the priest have feedback for one another in the absence of other meetings. They also help safeguard against stagnation in our approach to ministry, something that is important for all of us, including priests, deacons, and religious. Priests are actually canonically required to take certain steps each year to ensure that this does not happen to them in their own ministry, so it is not unreasonable to ask lay ministers to do the same once every two years.



As regards serving in one ministry at a time, the way that was worded was far more confusing, for which I apologize, but this actually has a very practical reason behind it. Since both lectors and extraordinary ministers of Holy Communion are officially "commissioned" by the pastor of a parish to serve that parish family, it stands to reason that we ought to limit the overlap of these two ministries in particular, as they serve different functions within the life of the parish. This is something we see reflected in the formation of men for the priesthood: as they progress, they are given different "roles" to serve within the community and specifically within the liturgy, and while they never lose their roles from before, the expectation is that they allow someone else to fill those roles unless circumstances dictate otherwise. For our purposes at Queen of Angels, when it comes to support ministries such as usher, sacristan, etc., there is no reason why someone could not serve in that capacity and one of the "big two" (lector and extraordinary minister) at the same time. But those two are ideally performed by different people when delegated to the laity, so I am asking that you choose only one of the big two, not both. I do not, however, have any objection at all to someone serving as EITHER a lector OR an extraordinary minister, plus serving in one of the other support ministries. I apologize again for that being unclear.

Thanks to all of you for your patience with me as we figure out how to move forward together as a parish family coming out of the past year under COVID protocols. Be assured of my constant prayers for all of you, and please keep praying for me as well.

Rediscovering Greatest Gift

The Eucharist is the "source and summit of the Christian life," in the words of "The Catechism of the Catholic Church."

To increase local Catholics' understanding of and affection for the Blessed Sacrament, the Diocese of San Diego is launching a seven-week Eucharistic renewal program that will be presented at every parish.

"It is my deepest hope that these weeks will be for us all a time to grow in our love for and understanding of this most beautiful sacrament and, in doing so, come closer to the God who has bestowed upon us every blessing we know in this world," Bishop Robert McElroy said in a recorded message that will be played for parishioners attending the Saturday vigil and Sunday Masses on **September 11 and 12**.

The first phase of the renewal program will begin that weekend and continue through **September 26**.

On three consecutive weekends, videotaped homilies will be presented at every parish on the following themes:

- "The Eucharist is a direct personal encounter with Jesus Christ" (Sept. 12),
- "The Eucharist is the sacrificial memorial of Christ's Passion, Death and Resurrection by which we have been redeemed" (Sept. 19), and
- "The Eucharist is the sacred meal that nurtures us, bonds us together and sends us forth to transform the world" (Sept. 26).

These homilies will be available in English, Spanish and Vietnamese. In addition to being shown at Masses, the parishes will be sharing them through electronic communication and social media to reach parishioners who still haven't returned to Mass even after the dispensation from the obligation to attend Mass was lifted in July.

"Even for those who've always been coming to Mass," said Bishop Robert McElroy, "the more people understand about the grace, and the depth, and the richness of this self-donation of Christ in the Eucharist, the deeper the relationship between the people and God will be."
