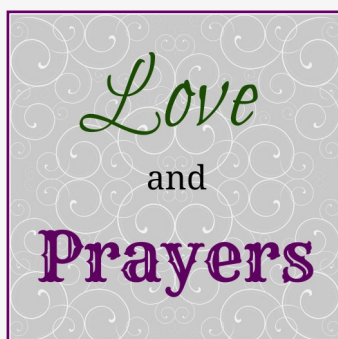

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

There is (or was, the internet moves quickly) a viral video going around Twitter a little while ago showing a very young Ukrainian boy singing in front of a Cross outside a church (I am enclosing a link here for those who, like me, are not on Twitter: <https://aleteia.org/2022/04/04/viral-video-of-a-child-singing-in-front-of-a-cross-in-ukraine/>). Aside from how amazing this young boy's faith is, there were several things that absolutely blew me away. It's very clear that although he is very young, he has clearly been paying attention in church, because he is singing what I assume is an eastern chant sung at Mass; at the very least, it closely mimics the style of eastern chant that is commonly sung in eastern rite liturgies, even down to the ascending and descending "Alleluias" at the end. I was also impressed by his posture as he prayed, again likely in imitation of what he has seen. I was also very impressed by how he remained so focused even when someone was coming around for a moment to video him. Twice, for about a split second, his eyes flick almost over to where the person with the camera is, but in both cases he immediately refocuses on the prayer he is singing to God. That, brothers and sisters, is a level of focus I hope I can bring to my own prayer. But maybe the thing that I was most impressed by was the prayer he spoke in his own words when he finished the short song. The translation offered is thus:

"And I say, 'God, save us and Ukraine.' I say to God, 'I love you.'"

There is a part of me that truly marvels at the faith of this little one. It is easy to say to God, "I love you," when everything is going well. It is hard to say that when everything is crumbling around you. And yet here is this boy, praying with all of his heart as he sees war, destruction, and death press in all around him, and the last thing he says to God is, "I love you!" THAT is faith in action, my friends. Our little brother in Ukraine may be small, but he is a mighty warrior and champion for Christ. And although he doesn't look old enough to go to school, he might just understand the Paschal Mystery better than most of us old enough to teach about it. Because that is exactly the right response to whatever we are going through at all times, whether good or evil. It was the response of Jesus on the Cross: what are the words, "Father, into your hands I commend my spirit" expressing but the same trust in and love of God that this little one is expressing in his prayer? Easter is meant to be a time of joy, yes, but the reason we are able to experience that joy in such great measure is precisely because we have gone through the betrayal of Holy Thursday, the pain of Good Friday, and the abandonment of Holy Saturday.

Psalm 8 says, "Through the praise of children and infants you have established a stronghold against your enemies, to silence the foe and the avenger." Our little brother in faith has reminded us that our love of God must always be steadfast, especially in the worst moments that we face, holding firm to the hope we have that Easter will come and Christ Jesus will triumph. May his prayer always remain ours, and may the Lord indeed silence the foe and the avenger, in Ukraine and throughout the whole world, through his prayers and the prayers of all of God's faithful. "And I say, 'God, save us and Ukraine.' I say to God, 'I love you.'"

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

April 24, 2022

We will have a special hour of adoration from 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm on Divine Mercy Sunday.

We will begin with exposition and the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and close with the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and benediction. Please join us as we come together and ask for God's Mercy.

The Second Sunday of Easter, April 24th this year, is designated as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. To encourage the celebration of God's infinite Mercy, Pope St. John Paul II established this feast day and bestowed it with a plenary indulgence. This favor is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions:

- (1) Going to confession (within eight days, before or after, though before is typically better)
- (2) Receiving Holy Communion
- (3) Praying for the intentions of the Holy Father
- (4) Complete detachment from all sin, including venial sin

If one does not have complete detachment from all of his sins, he may still receive a partial indulgence.

Most of the requirements for a plenary indulgence are satisfied by attending Sunday Mass:

*In the Penitential Rite we implore the mercy of God to be detached from all affection for sin.

*In the general Intercessions we pray for the Holy Father and his intentions, and for greater fidelity in our own lives to works of charity and mercy.

*In the Creed and the Our Father, we thank God for His mercy and ask to be forgiven as we forgive those who sin against us.

*We receive the Eucharistic Lord in Holy Communion.

The Lord Jesus gave the celebration of His Divine Mercy through private revelations to Saint Maria Faustina from 1925 until her death in Krakow in 1938. Jesus promised great graces to the faithful who keep this devotion. For more information please visit: www.thedivinemercy.org

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA and CHAPLET

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy can be said at any time; however, Jesus encouraged us to pray it during the hour of mercy (3 pm, the hour He died on the Cross) and especially to pray it with and for those who are dying. He also asked Saint Faustina that the chaplet be recited as a novena, specifically on the nine days before the Feast of Divine Mercy, which places the start date on Good Friday every year. This year the novena of Divine Mercy starts on Friday April 15, 2022.

At Queen of Angels Church we will begin pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet 15 minutes before each weekend Mass on the Second Sunday of Easter (23-24 April). Please arrive early to join us.

Andrew Tompkins Memorial College Scholarship Award



Andrew Joseph Tompkins was born to Diana and Paul Tompkins on Easter Sunday, April 12, 1998. He is survived by two sisters, Marion, 32, and Julia, 19. He received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation at our family parish, Queen of Angels Church in Alpine, California. He was very active in our parish as a member of the children's choir, a long-time altar server, a member of the 412 Church Youth Ministry Group, and he attended the Steubenville Youth Conferences throughout his high school years.

Andrew graduated from Granite Hills High School in 2016 and attended the University of La Verne (ULV) on an academic scholarship to study business marketing. He received the Knights of Columbus scholarship award for the two years he attended ULV and was grateful to the Knights Council for the financial support. Andrew had a passion for learning. He was an Honor Student and an accomplished swimmer and diver in high school and college.

Unfortunately, Andrew was diagnosed with cancer in his second year of college and was forced to suspend his studies while he had surgery and went through chemotherapy for several months. After a very tough battle, the Lord called him home on September 22, 2019 at the age of 21. While Andrew's time at ULV was short, he completed enough units to receive his Associate of Arts degree (posthumous). He was a natural born student and loved school and university life. He would be honored to know that this scholarship fund is now named after him. Indeed, his family is honored that Andrew's memory will live on through all students who go off to college with big hopes and dreams and remain strong in the Catholic faith.

The Knight of Columbus will once again be awarding scholarships to practicing Catholics and members of Queen of Angels Parish. Applicants must be a senior in a Catholic, Public, Charter or accredited Home High School or a full-time student at an accredited College or Trade School.
