


PLEASE Consider Assisting As attendance at Masses are growing, so does the need for more *Altar*

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

This Sunday marks the end of the Easter Octave, as Easter Day (like Christmas) is considered such a HUGE feast that we actually celebrate it for 8 days! But this, the Second Sunday of Easter, is also the Sunday of Divine Mercy. And with respect to Saint Maria Faustina who received the allocutions from our Lord, and Saint Pope John Paul II who gave us this second feast within the Easter Octave, perhaps instead of going into the story of how this particular feast came to us, we can briefly reflect on God's mercy itself.

All through the Gospels Jesus talks a great deal about coming judgment for those who reject him, but over and over again he also keeps pointing us back to the mercy of His Father, and He demonstrates that same mercy in the way he approaches sinners, even gaining a bit of a reputation as someone who frequently associated with the moral dregs of society! He gives us the Parable of the Lost Sheep, the Parable of the Prodigal Son (or the Parable of the Two Brothers, if you prefer), the Parable of the Patient Gardener, the Parable of the Sower, the Parable of the Publican and the Pharisee, and so on. And those are just some of his parables where we can see a glimpse of His great mercy! There is also the woman caught in adultery whom Jesus saves from a rabid, bloodthirsty mob; or delivering Mary Magdalene from seven demons; or any of the other times that he saved someone from demonic possession, or a life of slavery to sin, or even a physical malady or sickness. Jesus' life was spent revealing the love of the Father, and nowhere is that more obvious than in the moments when he shows us Divine Mercy.

My encouragement for all of us this weekend, in addition to hopefully praying the Divine Mercy Chaplet as we reflect on Him who died and rose for us, is to take some time to really think on the love and mercy of God revealed in the face and the wounds of Jesus. Think about your favorite story from the Gospels that talk about or show us His mercy: consider why it is that *that* story in particular resonates with you, and take some time to thank Jesus both for that revelation of God's love in Sacred Scripture and for the reason that it speaks to you so powerfully. But please take some time to thank God for his love and mercy for you and for all of us, because without His Divine Mercy, we would all still be lost.
