## PASTOR'S PAGE

### Friends,

As we continue our Lenten journey and our reflection on our Lenten observances, we conclude with alms-giving. Unsurprisingly, it is intricately connected to both prayer and fasting. In fact, we can hear Jesus refer to all three, back-to-back-to-back, smack dab in the middle of the Sermon on the Mount (cf. Mt 6:1-18).

There are a few key things to keep in mind when we consider alms-giving as we as set forth for us on the pages of Sacred Scripture. First, as Jesus himself says (v.1), our good works are not meant to bring attention to ourselves, but to see and help the other, and ultimately to bring glory to God. This is maybe the most important thing to remember: every blessing we have received was given to us freely by

God, and every gift he gives to us is meant to be shared with others. Consequently, nothing that we do is ever meant to be done just for ourselves, and we should never do good with the expectation or hope that everyone (or even anyone) in the world, other than perhaps the person we are helping or sharing our gift with, will notice. We would do well to remember this, because there are few things more odious than false piety or false humility. Second, as regards alms-giving specifically (rather than "sharing our gifts" in a more general sense), remember that we are always supposed to give joyfully! Saint Paul tells us that, "God loves a cheerful giver" (cf. 2 Cor 9:7). I once heard a very wise and holy man, while talking about that passage, tell a group of children, "don't give 'til it hurts; give 'til it tickles!" Jesus, in the generosity of His own life to us, demonstrates this joyful giving of self as he followed the will of His Father in heaven. So my encouragement to you is to follow the example of Jesus, who "for the joy set before him, endured the cross" (cf. Heb 12:2a), but to never give more than you can do joyfully. And if I can't give very much of any of my gifts with any joy yet, then that is what I can pray for. Third and finally, at least for today, Scripture is very clear that as we give alms to our brothers and sisters in need, the Lord turns His face towards us and shows us the same mercy that we have shown others (cf. Tob 4:7-11, 12:9; Dan 4:27; Ecc 3:30, 4:1-5, 29:12-17, 34:21; Ps 41:1-3; Prov 19:17; Isa 58:6-8, Mt 25:23; Lk 11:41; Acts 20:35; James 2:15-17, 1 Jn 3:17; etc.). So make no mistake: alms-giving is, and always has been, important!

Please don't overlook this third Lenten observance. Authentic alms-giving comes from a merciful heart that has itself received mercy and is connected to the Lord in prayer and fasting, proving that these three really must go hand-in-hand with each other. Let us share with those in need the mercy that we have received from the hand of God.

# Andrew Tompkins Memorial College Scholarship Award



Andrew Joseph Tompkins was born to Diana and Paul Tompkins on Easter Sunday, April 12, 1998. He is survived by two sisters, Marion, 32, and Julia, 19. He received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation at our family parish, Queen of Angels Church in Alpine, California. He was very active in our parish as a member of the children's choir, a long-time altar server, a member of the 412 Church Youth Ministry Group, and he attended the Steubenville Youth Conferences throughout his high school years.

Andrew graduated from Granite Hills High School in 2016 and attended the University of La Verne (ULV) on an academic scholarship to study business marketing. He received the Knights of Columbus scholarship award for the two years he attended ULV and was grateful to the Knights Council for the financial support. Andrew had a passion for learning. He was an Honor Student and an accomplished swimmer and diver in high school and college.

Unfortunately, Andrew was diagnosed with cancer in his second year of college and was forced to suspend his studies while he had surgery and went through chemotherapy for several months. After a very tough battle, the Lord called him home on September 22, 2019 at the age of 21. While Andrew's time at ULV was short, he completed enough units to receive his Associate of Arts degree (posthumous). He was a natural born student and loved school and university life. He would be honored to know that this scholarship fund is now named after him. Indeed, his family is honored that Andrew's memory will live on through all students who go off to college with big hopes and dreams and remain strong in the Catholic faith.
