

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

A little bit of a change of pace this morning...

Before he left, Father Tim started planning a sanctuary improvement project, to reinforce, expand, and beautify the area of the church where we hear the proclamation of the Word of God and celebrate the Eucharist. Before the questions start flying, I want to point out that at the very least, the steps and floor boards of the sanctuary need to be replaced and/or reinforced. A compelling argument can be made for expanding the sanctuary back towards the wall to provide more space for ministers, lectors, priests, etc.

Obviously, Father Tim and I both moved before much headway could be made: him to Julian, and me here. The parish had already started raising a little money for said project, and since it is expressly earmarked for it, it can only legally be used towards that project. The Finance Council has also advised me that we still have a sizeable amount of capital designated for the building fund that could be put towards this. So we, as a parish family, have a decision to make. As I see it, there are 3 main options:

Option 1: Minimalist. Fix the floor boards and perhaps modify the appearance of the sanctuary slightly.

Option 2: Go all in. Use the seed money and some portion of the leftover capital (while it is still worth something – thank you, inflation) to make the sanctuary and the entire church (which longtime parishioners will remember was originally intended to be the new parish hall) feel more like a church.

Option 3: Attempt to strike a balance between the two.

I know that any time something like this comes up, people frequently have strong opinions, and for good reason. So to that end, the Parish Finance Council and I would like to invite all parishioners to a **Town Hall Meeting** specifically for discussing the matter of the sanctuary project, on **Sunday, 12 June, following the 10:30 AM Mass**, in the parish hall. We will do our best to release additional information regarding the main options in the coming weeks, but in the meantime, please mark your calendars. While I hope to see you there, in the event that you will not be able to attend the meeting because you will be out of town or something, but you still have some thoughts that you would like to share, I invite you to send them, via email, to Regina.Angelorum.Alpine@gmail.com. The Finance Council and I all agreed that this was a decision that should involve everyone, or at least invite everyone to have a say, since it will affect all of us. So as I said, please mark your calendars, and come prepared for a lively and charitable family debate.

Assembly Bill 2223, if passed, will decriminalize the killing of born-alive children through neglect or otherwise.
