

## Faithful Citizenship: Election 2022

The U.S. Catholic Church offers a variety of resources as voters face what is one of the most consequential elections in U.S. and California history.

The Church encourages Catholics to exercise their rights and responsibilities as active participants in the American democracy, offering guidance through teaching documents, state voter guides and statements from their local bishops.

The Church does not endorse any candidate. However, the Church does ask Catholics, as faithful citizens, to make their election decisions based on a properly formed conscience, based on Catholic social teaching.

The U.S. bishops caution that their teachings should not be used selectively to serve partisan interests.

In 2020, the Church launched a campaign called <u>"Civilize It,"</u> which asks Catholics to pledge to be civil and compassionate when they engaged in political conversations with members of their families, parishes and other communities.

#### **2022 Election Information**

General Election Day is Nov. 8. California mails a ballot to every registered voter a few weeks before the election. Be sure to mail it back or drop it at a designated drop-box before Nov. 8. You can also vote in person. California offers early voting at certain sites.

#### **Voting deadlines**

Every active registered voter will automatically receive a ballot in the mail. Ballots will begin to go out on Oct. 8.

Return ballot by mail (postmarked by): Nov. 8 Return ballot in person: Nov. 8 by 8 p.m.

#### VOTE "NO" ON PROPOSITION 1

Proposition 1 is a worst-case scenario for abortion in California. It is an expensive and misleading ballot measure that allows unlimited late-term abortions — for any reason, at any time, even moments before birth, paid for by tax dollars.

Prop 1 isn't needed. Sadly, California already has some of the most permissive abortion laws in the nation that would remain in effect without the amendment, including our current limit on late-term abortions that are permitted only for the life and health of the mother. Prop 1 destroys this common-sense limit.

California does not limit state spending on abortion, and with thousands more traveling from other states, the cost will be in the hundreds of millions. Don't hand lawmakers a blank check to pay for abortions, and don't let them make California an "abortion sanctuary.

On this day, bless those who have given their time, talents, and in some cases their lives, to protect our freedoms. Guide them in their tours of duty. Comfort the wounded and their families.






