Next weekend is World Mission Sunday. The theme of this year's World Mission Day – "We cannot but speak about what we have seen and heard" (Acts 4:20), is a summons to each of us to "own" and to bring to others what we bear in our hearts. This mission has always been the hallmark of the Church, for "she exists to evangelize" (SAINT PAUL VI, Evangelii Nuntiandi, 14). Our life of faith grows weak, loses its prophetic power and its ability to awaken amazement and gratitude when we become isolated and withdraw into little groups. By its very nature, the life of faith calls for a growing openness to embracing everyone, everywhere.

On World Mission Day, which we celebrate each year on the penultimate Sunday of October, we recall with gratitude all those men and women who by their testimony of life help us to renew our baptismal commitment to be generous and joyful apostles of the Gospel. Let us remember especially all those who resolutely set out, leaving home and family behind, to bring the Gospel to all those places and people athirst for its saving message.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

I recently watched a portion of an interview between Catholic apologist and evangelist Chris Stefanick and Father Ripperger, who is an exorcist. Based on the context the response given in this excerpt, I believe Father Ripperger had been asked if he had ever been afraid during an exorcism, and I was struck by his response as he related a story that happened to him:

"One time this one demon would not obey, so I just turned to God the Father, mentally, and I just said, "Punish him in a way he's never been punished before.' And there was a full blown preternatural manifestation right there. And the demon was screaming... The fear [I had] wasn't in relationship to the demons, because they're not really to be feared because they're on a short leash. It's what I was looking at, it's the severi-

ty of God's punishment for those who disobey Him and reject Him ... If that doesn't strike the fear of God in you, nothing will, right? Literally looking, this is what hell looks like, so there was that fear [of God's just judgment]... But in relationship to the demons, an experienced exorcist doesn't have any fear. He's cautious. You have to be careful. But there's no fear because they can only do what Christ permits. And so you know they're restricted, and you know that as long as you stay under Christ's protection, which is basically staying in the lane that the Church has said to stay in, you're not going to suffer any [from demons]."

After hearing this story, Chris Stefanick observed, "Faith and fear don't coexist," to which Father Ripperger replied, "No, they don't."

There is almost too much to talk about from this little conversation between these two men of faith. There is the story of the exorcism itself; there is the discussion of God's justice and righteous judgment; there is the filial fear we ought to properly have towards God who is all good and deserving of all our love (the *only* fear we ought to have, incidentally); there is the consoling truth that the demonic is kept on a short leash by God and that we have nothing to fear from the evil one if we stay united to Christ; and there is the reminder that faith and fear don't coexist – or in the words Sacred Scripture, "perfect love casts out fear" (1 Jn 4:18). Rather than attempt to unpack all of that myself, I simply offer it to you to think on and pray with, and I encourage you to take some time today or this week in your own personal prayer and see if the Lord wants to highlight any of those points, or even something else, with you from this brief conversation. The spiritual realm is very real, and we ignore it, and the lessons we can learn from it, at our own peril. But we can also receive great blessing from the Lord if we accept what He wants to show us and teach us through it.
