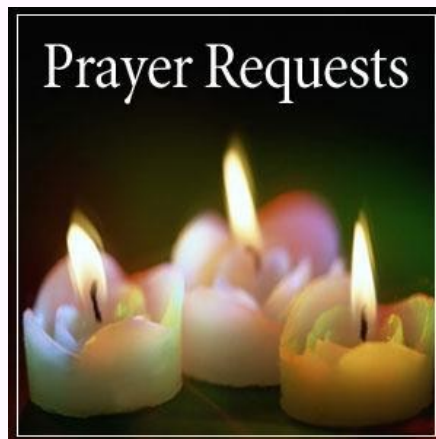

Friends,

Were it not for my younger brother and sisters, I may have missed the news of Queen Elizabeth II's passing back on September 8th. Of course, it probably would have been impossible to not hear about that eventually, given that one of my sisters and her family currently live in the United Kingdom. Thanks to modern technology, that ended up not only being an amazing experience for their family, but also a very cool, if also very surreal, experience for me and the rest of us as we get to occasionally see pictures or even short videos of what it is like there as a country mourns the passing of its sovereign. One such video that she shared was when the local magistrate or sheriff (I'm not sure of his title) made the proclamation in the town square of the crowning of King Charles III. Honestly, I think my first thought was, "Only the Brits could pull something like this off without it feeling ostentatious." But as I continued to listen to the proclamation, I was struck by how religious and deeply spiritual the language being used was. There were mentions of God's mercy, His grace, and recognizing the responsibility of the English Monarch to be the "Defender of the Faith." In particular, towards the end there was the solemn acknowledgement and request to God Himself, when the magistrate said, "beseeching God, by whom Kings and Queens do reign, to bless His Majesty..." And of course, the royal pronouncement ended with, "God save the King!" It is easy to joke about freedom and liberty when we bring up the United Kingdom, especially given how our own country first got its start. But I think this can serve as a good reminder to us of many things, perhaps most notably in this case the importance that religion and faith do have and must have in all areas of life, including public life, and yes, even in politics and the shaping of culture. And while we can and should pray for both the new King of England in addition to our own civil and religious leaders, let us also give thanks that our True Sovereign, Jesus Christ, is not only King of Kings and Lord of Lords, but is also the Prince of Peace.

VOTE "NO" ON PROPOSITION 1
