The Assumption: A Sign of Hope

Is the resurrection a concept or reality? For many of us, the resurrection of the dead may be a stray idea recite in the Nicene Creed. Heaven we discuss. But resurrection? The feast of the Assumption is a reminder to us that heaven gets even better! We pray that the souls of the faithful departed would soon be united to God in heaven. The truth is, the separation between our souls and our bodies was not God's original plan for things. It's one of the results of the Fall, of original sin. At the end of time and Jesus' second coming, our bodies and souls will be reunited. Lest we forget, Mary's Assumption is the reminder. Today, we celebrate that Mary is enjoying what we, too, hope to participate in - complete joy in heaven with our God, experienced body and soul. Today and every day, let's pray for those who have died and that we may meet them again in the heavenly kingdom.

Question:

What lessons should I learn from the Assumption of Mary?

Answer:

Growing in holiness is similar to training in a sport. We need someone to show us how we can live our faith well. Mary is a model of sanctity. She shows us how to be faithful to God's will, living each day with confidence in God's mercy and love. At the Nativity, in Jesus' public ministry, and at the Crucifixion, we see her steadfast trust. She allows the Lord to use her life to accomplish his plan for her and for all of us. In the Preface of the Mass for the Assumption of Mary, we pray: "For today the Virgin Mother of God was assumed into heaven as the beginning and image of your Church's coming to perfection and a sign of sure hope and comfort to your pilgrim people."

It is this image of holiness that we strive to imitate. In the office, at home, or in our community, we look for signs of God's grace that call us to an ever greater love of him and each other. A greater awareness of God is a sign of our conversion of heart that lives the lessons Mary teaches.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

As we continue our deep dive through the Scriptures in search of the Eucharist, both in the ways it is foreshadowed in the Old Testament (OT) and revealed in the New Testament (NT), we need to make huge jump from Genesis 4, where we left off last time, and skip all the way to... Genesis 14. That's right! In case it wasn't already obvious, when we use the Eucharist to unlock God's revelation to His people throughout human history, we start to see the bread crumb trail (pardon the pun, but it was too easy) that He left behind for us – sometimes literally! – so we would be able to recognize the Second Person of the Trinity when the Word became flesh and dwelt among us (cf. Jn 1:14).

It's just a few verses, Gen 14:18-20, but it sets the stage for so much and helps us understand in a greater way the idea of sacrifice, worship, and thanksgiving – all things that we also describe the Eucharist. And of course, we get another great Christological archetype who foreshadows Jesus himself. Abram (whose name has not been changed to Abraham yet, but who, as the patriarch from whom God's chosen people descends, symbolically stands in for all of those who will one day believe in God and follow Him) has just returned from an improbable victory, leading the 318 men of his household against the combined forces of four hostile kings (perhaps one for each corner of the earth?) and

men of his household against the combined forces of four hostile kings (perhaps one for each corner of the earth?) and launching a daring night attack. When he returns, we are told that:

Melchizedek king of Salem brought out bread and wine; he was a priest of God Most High. And he blessed him and said, "Blessed be Abram by God Most High, maker of heaven and earth; and blessed be God Most High, who has delivered your enemies into your hand!" And Abram gave him a tenth of everything. (Gen 14:18-20)

A small but important detail from the previous verse tells us that all of this takes place in "the King's Valley" (v.17), which is near the vicinity of Jerusalem. Then, just to make sure that we don't miss the importance of this detail, when we are first introduced to Melchizedek (more on him in a moment), we are told that he is the "king of Salem," the ancient city that will one day become Jerusalem, where the King of a united Israel will establish his throne, where the Ark of the Covenant will one day reside, and where God's people will worship the LORD in truth and offer sacrifice to Him in the Temple. Jerusalem is so important and so central to the story because in the time of Jesus you could pray anywhere, and you would hear the Scriptures proclaimed and taught at your local synagogue, but the only place you could offer sacrifice – and consequently, the only place you could truly worship God – was... you guessed it: Jerusalem, and specifically the temple. So establishing that all of this is taking place at or near Jerusalem is hugely significant!

And yet, it's even more significant than we realize, because later on we will hear Jesus claim that, "something greater than the Temple is here" (Mt 12:6), and he will also challenge his opponents to, "tear down this Temple and in three days I will rebuild it" (Jn 2:19). We are told that when he says this he is referring to the temple of his body. That is because Jesus Himself is the New Temple of the New Jerusalem (cf. Rev 21:22), in whom and through whom right worship and right sacrifice is offered to God the Father! And that sacrifice is nothing other than his own body and blood, words that should immediately recall to us Christ's words at the Last Supper. Jesus is both priest and victim – and, we can add, also the temple and the altar.

Back to Melchizedek. Remember how he was the "king of Salem"? If we opt to translate the name of his city, guess what that means he is called? "King of peace." No, really. It means "king of peace." And the name he's given in Scripture (which was probably an honorific) means, "King of Righteousness." And when he offers up sacrifice to God on Abram's behalf, it is a sacrifice of thanksgiving and blessing.

So let's recap to make sure we have our facts straight... The King of Righteousness and Prince of Peace – who is also the King of Jerusalem and a priest of God – offers a sacrifice of thanksgiving ("thanksgiving" in Greek: *eucharistia*) to God Most High (dare we say God the Father?) on behalf of Abram (symbolically standing in for all of God's chosen people), and that sacrifice is comprised of... oh, wait, this is the detail you probably noticed immediately, right? Bread and wine! **He offers bread and wine!** And to think, somehow all of these little details are PERFECTLY fulfilled by Jesus, starting at the Last Supper (Mt 26:17-29; Mk 14:12-26; Lk 22:7-39) and continuing until, "It is finished!" (Jn 19:30) at Calvary! This goes way beyond coincidence. Talk about Christological archetypes!

We don't even have time to get into Psalm 110 or the Book of Hebrews right now, but even though his role in Genesis is over before we get to the end of chapter 14, this won't be the last time we hear about Melchizedek. But considering what he shows us and how well he foreshadows the sacrifice that Jesus himself will offer many centuries later... I think he has done enough for now. Next time we'll see how immediately following this episode, God makes a covenant with Abram and changes his name to Abraham, once again foreshadowing even greater mysteries to come.

I look forward to continuing this journey together as we fall more in love with our Lord, hidden in the Eucharist. Grace and peace be with you all.

PARISH SANCTUARY IMPROVEMENT PROJECT UPDATE

Friends,

An important update regarding our Sanctuary Improvement Project, and a special thank you to everyone who has volunteered to help with all of the little but extremely important details along the way!

First, by this Sunday evening, the plan is to have everything moved off of the sanctuary so that work can begin, and to have everything necessary for Mass moved up to the "old church" (the current parish hall), so that **starting this Tuesday, August 15th, on the Solemnity of the Assumption, we will begin celebrating Mass up in the original church building**. I honestly had to chuckle at the beautiful irony of it all: the work of this project hopefully kicking off on such an important feast day of Our Lady, and the privilege of using the original church building to celebrate Mass on her feast. Frankly, it's pretty exciting.

The work itself should take about a month, give or take, so allowing for a worst case scenario, that means we can reasonably expect to move back down from the parish hall to the church building by the end of September. I will keep you all posted on that as we move forward. This will also potentially shift the start date of Faith Formation this fall, but we can cross that bridge if and when we get there.

Finally, I want to say thank you to everyone who has helped so far, and everyone who has volunteered to help this Sunday, as we move ahead. I am excited to journey with you on this adventure as we seek God's will for our parish family. Grace and peace to you all.
