






### PASTOR'S PAGE


Friends,

As promised, I will be trying to give everyone a chance to see what our Parish Sanctuary Improvement Project Committee, and those who have assisted us in the past year, have accomplished. To that end I have enclosed a diagram of the layout of our worship space below. I hope in the coming weeks to have an enlarged copy of the plans, along with other relevant information, set up outside of the main entrance of the church after Mass so that you can see better and ask questions about any and all of this. A few important notes that won't be clear from the diagram below, since I had to cut out the architectural notes in order to make it fit...

First, you will notice that the tabernacle will be getting moved straight back along the same axis, so that it will be closer to the wall. The darker blocks in the rectangle back where the tabernacle is are "pillars," which are more façade than structural, to give the whole space a more sacred feel. The statues of Mary and St. Joseph will get moved closer to the center, up near the tabernacle as opposed to tucked behind the piano or the pews as they currently are. Since we have to eliminate the handicapped ramp, which currently is behind the tabernacle, we will be replacing that with a handicap-access lift on stage left (the right side as you're looking at the plans from the top). The sanctuary itself will be slightly expanded and rounded out in the front to make it feel at once more open and more sacred. The last main point from this that I would like to point out is the addition of a dedicated confessional. That will be placed in the opposite corner of the cry room that the current "confessional" is right now, corresponding to where the leftmost window is as you look into the cry room from the outside. There were a number of reasons for this, but with the diagram, I am already running out of space, so I will have to fill you in on that another time. I look forward to continuing on this journey with all of you.

# The Nine First Fridays

"I promise you, in the excessive mercy of my Heart that my all powerful love will grant to all those who receive Holy Communion on the first Friday for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance; they shall not die in my disgrace nor without receiving the sacraments; my divine Heart shall be their safe refuge in that last moment."

Our Lord to St. Margaret Mary

### How to Complete the First Fridays Devotion:

1. Receive Holy Communion on each First Friday;

- 2. The nine Fridays must be consecutive;
- 3. They must be made in honor and in reparation to His Sacred Heart.

#### 12 Promises of the Sacred Heart to St. Margaret Mary

- I will give them all the graces necessary for their state of life.
- 2. I will give peace in their families.
- 3. I will console them in all their troubles.
- I will be their refuge in life and especially in death.
- 5. I will abundantly bless all their undertakings.
- Sinners shall find in my Heart the source and infinite ocean of mercy.
- 7. Tepid souls shall become fervent.
- Fervent souls shall rise speedily to great perfection.
- I will bless those places wherein the image of my Sacred Heart shall be exposed and venerated.
- I will give to priests the power to touch the most hardened hearts.
- Persons who propagate this devotion shall have their names eternally written in my Heart.
- 12. In the excess of the mercy of my heart, I promise you that my all powerful love will grant to all those who will receive Communion on the First Fridays, for nine consecutive months, the grace of final repentance: they will not die in my displeasure, nor without receiving the sacraments; and my Heart will be their secure refuge in that last hour.

#### **Everyday Stewardship**

There are times in our lives that we get the chance to see a glimpse of heaven. It may be through the love of another, loved one or stranger. Sometimes it may even be an event that seems unexplainable, perhaps even supernatural. These occurrences may be the answer to prayer or they may surprise us by coming out of nowhere. But no matter their nature or origin, they give us hope and strength to carry on through life.

When we journey on a pathway of stewardship, we are bound to experience moments of grace where we see even the smallest seeds we planted grow into something amazing. At these moments, we are reminded that God is real and that our stewardship is not in vain. The giving of our gifts and talents is not just a response to God's calling. The giving is one way that God breaks through into the lives of others. As we use what God has given us for his glory, he uses us as instruments of grace to be truly present to others.

The greatest example of this occurs at the Mass. Through the hands of an ordained priest taking the gifts of bread and wine, God is really present with us. When we then take Christ into our bodies, we accept the offer to take him into the world to others. The world cannot see Jesus in us with human eyes, but through our works of stewardship, they can see Jesus in us. One could say they even have a chance to see a glimpse of heaven.

Catholics are taught to prize holiness—to admire it in others and to strive for it in our own lives. But we're never quite told what holiness is.


