

#### **Everyday Stewardship**

It took five years of marriage before I was ready to have that first baby. Of course, now that I have three children I cannot imagine a life without them. After twenty-five years, I cannot imagine life without my wife as well.

And I know that I am lucky. I know those who have lost children or have been widowed. They couldn't imagine life without their loved ones either.

The tough reality to digest is that we don't own those whom we love. They are all gifts from God, entrusted to each of us as good stewards. If we cling too tightly, we become like the steward who buried his talents in the ground. If we don't care enough, we become like the prodigal son who squandered his gifts on gambling and frivolous living.

But can we love our loved ones too much? I am not sure it is possible to love others too much if it is genuine love. However, if we truly love them, then we will want to lead them to the One that gave them to us in the first place: God. We do that by demonstrating that no one comes before God in our lives, not even our family.

In this world, our loved ones make living meaningful. But this world is not the end. As much as we love them here, our ultimate goal is for them to live eternally with God. May my wife and kids never think I chose them over God, so that they may choose God over all else, as well.

#### God Is Love

I was recently at a Catholic conference and had a conversation with someone living in the thick of Hollywood culture. He was Catholic and spoke of how hard it was to live out his faith amid tremendous temptation and negativity toward religion. He spoke about how going to daily Mass helped to keep him centered and stay strong in his faith. He was a great witness to living out one's faith in the face of disbelief.

One thing that he told me stood out above all the rest. He spoke of his engagement to his fiancé and how important it was to him that God was a major part of their relationship and their lives as individuals as well. He told me he said something to her like, "If you don't love Jesus more than you love me, this is never going to work." What an amazing and truly moving witness!

Songs and books are written about the intense longing one human being can have for another. We can describe another as meaning everything to us. We speak of wanting to offer our complete selves to our beloved. However, true love is about more than wanting to be with that person. It is about wanting that person to know a love even greater than theirs: the love of God. No love can last without God. My Hollywood friend knew this to be the case. He showed his true love for his wife-to-be by sharing more than himself — he shared the very One who created love.

#### Lord, I want to see with your eyes.

In my young adult life, I have had the privilege of walking with mothers. Mothers who had the amazing courage to say "yes" amidst hard circumstances and suffer heroically for their children.

And incredibly brave mothers who have received outrageous grace to claim their maternity and the mercy of God after having an abortion.

One story in particular has been a life-changing grace for my life. (Isn't it interesting how that happens, how our graces—especially those of mercy—aren't just ours? That they affect everyone else too?)

This particular mother, Marie (name changed for privacy purposes), was pregnant with her third child. Circumstances were hard, finances were tight, she had no support, and she felt afraid and alone. As we dreamed about all the possibilities, she wanted to say yes...

However, after not hearing back from her after a few months of reaching out, she admitted that she made a different decision. We cried and grieved together, realizing quite poignantly that her heart was broken in a way she never thought it could be.

But God does not leave us in our brokenness or misery! This woman, this hero of mine, asked if there was a way to be whole again. This stunned me. After everything she had been through, she was strong enough to seek out something more. She was Catholic and knew that there was confession. She hadn't gone since she was a child but was desirous to "get right with herself, and get right with God."

We made a few appointments with the priests, and she kept skipping them. It was too scary. When finally, THE day came.

"Marie, we are in your neighborhood and Father can hear your confession this afternoon if you want a ride?"

"Okay, yes. I want to do this. Come get me."

As Marie got in the car, she looked nervous and heavy. Laying out all her fears, she practiced her Act of Contrition and went over the things she wanted to say to Father (not a necessary thing to do, but sometimes it helps to have a friend in it with you!)

When she arrived at the church, Father came and greeted her warmly and invited her to the front of the confession line. She went in.

10 minutes passed. 20 minutes passed. 30 minutes passed. Finally, Father came out of the confessional.

"Marie had a very powerful experience and is 'resting in the Holy Spirit.' She is praying in her heart with God right now, so maybe you could pray with her until she is ready to leave... I, actually, need to start Mass!"

Marie's countenance completely changed. She looked totally different. Younger. Radiant. Peaceful. Whole. It was amazing. It was like encountering the person that had always been inside of her. When she was finished praying, Marie exclaimed, "Wow. I never knew there were so many colors!!!"

Marie had a very special encounter with Jesus that day after receiving his mercy. He gave her new eyes to see. To see the world in all its splendor, its glory, its heavenly mystery.... its outrageous and beautiful color!

I couldn't help but think how this echoed Luke 7:36–50, when the woman anointed the feet of Jesus with her tears. Her love and his mercy became one.

We all want to be healed. We want to be seen and to see as God sees, but sometimes it is scary to take the necessary steps to make this healing begin. Friends, June is the month of the Sacred Heart of Jesus—the tender, merciful, warm heart that is beating in heaven for you and for me.

This month, I invite you to ask yourself, "What is the thing that I have been holding onto? What is the thing that keeps me bound in fear? What keeps me seeing the world, others, myself, and God in grey? What do I want—deep down at least—to bring to his mercy and tender, loving gaze?"

As each of us journeys together in these years of Revival, our courageous "yes(es)" to God's healing and mercy has the power to unleash grace upon grace in the lives of all our brothers and sisters—and in the whole Church.

Do not be afraid! I am grateful to be in this spiritual car ride together.

#### **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

July 2, 2023 13th Sunday in Ordinary Time

As a boy my favorite board game was "Chutes and Ladders." The players roll dice to move from the start to the finish, from the bottom of the board to the top. If you land on a chute, you slide back and down. It was a bummer. Land on a ladder, and you jump well up the board and near the goal. It was a thrill to find a ladder and draw closer to the goal. That's life, isn't it? At every moment, we're either moving closer or farther from the goal of our lives.

How do we win? Jesus tells us the secret of life's chutes and ladders hinges on getting our loves rightly ordered. What we love in life is meant to be a ladder, drawing us up into God's love — including our family, friends, work, play, food, and drink. Even to give your water to someone out of love for Christ leads to a sure reward.

But those ladders of our loves can become chutes. If we love even our family members more than Christ, we slide down and back. If we love the persons and things in our life for the sake of Christ, He says we "surely will not lose our reward." The key difference between a chute and ladder, between our spiritual regression and advancement, is our willingness to renounce everything — even our own life — for the love of Jesus. To allow everything and everyone we love to draw us to love him more — that's the difference between chutes and ladders.

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
