
Parish Office The parish office will be closed November 22-November 24, in order to celebrate Thanksgiving with our families and friends. We will re-open at 9:00



GOSPEL MEDITATION

November 19, 2023 33rd Sunday in Ordinary Time

When I was a kid, I hated playing Monopoly because my siblings and friends always seemed to win. But worse was how it happened. Scared to risk my fake money on buying properties, I'd hold on to it. My opponents hungrily bought up the various real estate squares on the board. Then, inevitably, my poor, low-equity self would land on their spots, pay them rent, and my money would drain to zero. It seemed so unfair. The rich get richer, and the poor get poorer. I had to learn that monopoly money is meant to be spent. I was scared to lose some of it. So, I lost all of it.

How do we see what we possess? Jesus' parable about the talents is not really about economics but about the invest ability of everything he entrusts to us. How marvelous that everyone in the fable who places talents in the open market doubles their investment. The only one who doesn't is the man who fearfully buries his one talent. Jesus' success strategy for us seems to be, whatever we have, get it out of our possession. Risk it as quickly and as fully as we can.

You and I have precious gifts. We have valuable things to invest — time, talents, treasure. The Lord invites us to be brave and even somewhat reckless, to give as much away as possible. If we give it away in the direction of love and truth, it will grow. If we hold on to it in fear, the little we have will be taken away. Let me challenge you this week: find something in your life you're holding on to, and risk it by giving it away. It won't double if you hold on to it.

"Master, you gave me five talents. See, I have made five more.' His master said to him, 'Well done, my good and faithful servant. Since you were faithful in small matters, I will give you great responsibilities. Come, share your master's joy."

Dear Friends,

"You will hear of wars and reports of wars; see that you are not alarmed, for these things must happen, but it will not yet be the end." (Mt. 24:6)

At a time in history when we are literally experiencing wars and rumors of wars, these words of Jesus are both unsettling and consoling. He told us what to expect. Even in our fallen world, men and women still have free will, and we can so readily turn against our Creator and one another for innumerable reasons.

As we confront this stark reality, Jesus doesn't abandon us in our feelings of fear, anger, and helplessness. When he sits with his disciples at the Last Supper, Jesus says: "I have told you this so that you might have peace in me. In the world you will have trouble, but take courage, I have conquered the world." (Jn 16:33)

What is most important? That, no matter what, Jesus promises us that in him, we will find our peace. This past Sunday, the Office of Readings (part of the Liturgy of the Hours) included this timely excerpt:

"That earthly peace which arises from love of neighbor symbolizes and results from the peace of Christ which radiates from God the Father. For by the cross the incarnate Son, the Prince of Peace, reconciled all men with God. By thus restoring all men to the unity of one people and one body, he slew hatred in his own flesh; and, after being lifted on high by his resurrection, he poured forth the spirit of love into the hearts of men. For this reason, all Christians are urgently summoned to do in love what the truth requires, and to join with all true peacemakers in pleading for peace and bringing it about." (*Gaudium et Spes*, no. 78)

War in Ukraine, war in the Middle East—in a very real way, wars on the streets of our own cities where gang violence, drug trafficking, and human trafficking are a daily reality. The only way to respond to this is through a radical act of love. And Jesus gives us the perfect model, "Take, eat, this is my Body.... Take, drink, this is my Blood."

We are united with Christ, the Prince of Peace, every time we receive him in Holy Communion. Our bond with him deepens at Mass and in our personal prayer. Our relationship with Jesus, however, is not free. It costs us something now... and ultimately, it will cost us everything.

How is Jesus inviting you, today, to offer yourself as he does in the Eucharist? How is he calling you to be a peacemaker? How can we, united as his Mystical Body, intercede for peace, for the end of war, and for the universal brotherhood that our loving God so desires for his children?

Jesus is the Prince of Peace. Let's run to him now with all that weighs upon our hearts. He longs to hear from us and desires to help us. I pray especially that the life of this month's American Eucharistic Witness, Dorothy Day, will inspire each of us to be men and women of peace!

This year we continue our Giving Tree practice with its home in the back of the church. Take an envelope off the Giving Tree and donate cash for the Rancho Nazareth and Villa Anahuac, or monetary donations; cash or checks for Children of the Immaculate Heart of Mary and East County Pregnancy Care Center.

PLEASE NOTE:

We can only accept CASH donations for the Rancho Nazareth and Villa Anahuac.

- Rancho Nazareth: An orphanage for boys in the outskirts of Tecate that houses approximately 50 boys. The children range in age from 3 to 17 and all leave daily to go to school on buses. The grounds are near a prison and a dump. The buildings are over 35 years old and are very worn down and in need of repair or replacement. Four nuns and two workers run the orphanage.
- Villa Anahuac: A monastery of 10 nuns south of Tecate. The Sisters of Villa Anahuac, who are of the order of St. Brigida, are desperately in need of more cells for their expanding convent. The Sisters are semi-cloistered, similar to the Poor Clares and Carmelities. They do work in the community and stay close to the people. These very poor families work locally and earn only a few dollars a day.
- Children of the Immaculate Heart of Mary: The mission of Children of the Immaculate Heart of Mary is to serve survivors of human trafficking and open the door to their restoration in Jesus Christ.
- East County Pregnancy Care Clinic exists to serve women and their unborn children. They provide accurate information about the developing life in the mother's womb and life- affirming alternatives to abortion.




