


Lectio: Philippians: Life in Christ



Dear Friends,

I know I've already reflected on this a bit before, but it bears repetition: there are some moments that are so defining that, after having lived through them, we can only describe our life in terms of *before and after*. These experiences truly change us, for better or for worse.

As I continue pondering with you what Jesus did for us during the 10th National Eucharistic Congress, I keep returning to my awareness of how different I am from who I was just 22 days ago. My mind, my heart, and my soul have been somehow deeply touched, and I simply can't live the way I did before.

The last before and after experience I had was nine years ago this month. I was privileged to make a 30-day silent retreat before I professed final vows in my religious community, the Franciscans of the Eucharist of Chicago. As I was led through the Spiritual Exercises of St. Ignatius of Loyola, spending between 5 and 6 hours a day in prayer, Jesus was forming me from the inside out. The Lord was so good to me, the graces abounded, and I left that retreat a different person: a little more generous, a little more joyful, a little more aware of my sinfulness, and certainly more open than ever before to how God wanted to lead my life.

Toward the end of that retreat, Jesus began working a grace in me that I literally saw brought to fruition by serving the National Eucharistic Revival, in particular during the Congress. If you had told me nine years ago that there would be a Eucharistic Revival in our country, it would have been hard for me to imagine. It would have been even more challenging for me to believe I'd be involved in any significant way!

Dear brothers and sisters, God wants to delight each of us! Please join me as we pause for a few moments and make some "space" to wonder in the presence of the Lord.

- *Come, Holy Spirit, help us to listen, help us to be aware of your presence in our lives.
- *Read and ponder this passage:

If then you were raised with Christ, seek what is above, where Christ is seated at the right hand of God. Think of what is above, not of what is on earth. For you have died, and your life is hidden with Christ in God. When Christ your life appears, then you too will appear with him in glory (Col 3:1–4).

- *Ask Jesus to help you see with the eyes of your heart any way in which you have been touched through the graces of the National Eucharistic Revival and Congress. Let Jesus show you how it might be a *before and after* experience for you.
- *Write down what you perceive the Lord revealing to you.
- *Thank God for this gift of grace. Ask him to help you keep your heart open to the gifts he desires to give you, so that you may be in turn a gift to others so that they, too, may encounter the transformative power of a relationship with Jesus in the Eucharist.

God Bless you all! You are always in my prayers.

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

GOSPEL MEDITATION

August 18, 2024 20th Sunday in Ordinary Time

A priest I know was asked by a door-to-door evangelist, "Do you believe in Jesus?" He answered, "Yes, I do. But if I may ask you," he continued, "Where do you experience Jesus' body and blood?" His interlocutor responded somewhat confusedly, "I don't. I just believe in him. That's all that is needed." Later my priest friend would relate to me, "The more I thought about it, that response struck me as totally inadequate. As human beings, we need to encounter Jesus' body and blood, not just hear about him and mentally believe. Otherwise, Jesus is just a ghost."

This week we see this central point as we arrive at the climactic moment of Jesus' teaching on the Eucharist. Jesus has established the importance of believing in him as the "bread of life come down from heaven." Belief deeply matters because it leads to a real, bodily encounter with Jesus through eating and drinking. That's why Jesus emphasizes to an almost outrageous degree the non-metaphorical necessity to "eat my flesh and drink my blood" (John 6:54). The real presence of Jesus' body and blood — he himself, truly, really, substantially — has been the Church's treasure since Holy Thursday. Internal belief in the heart and the ritual act of eating and drinking the Eucharist, the Church has stubbornly insisted on both, not just one or the other.

This is not meant to criticize non-Catholic Christians who deeply trust and love Jesus, nor is it a triumphal elitist claim about the Catholic Mass. Rather it is a humble, trusting acknowledgement that God in Jesus comes to us in a way most proper to human beings: in our hearts and our bodies, faith and the Eucharist.
