## **PASTOR'S PAGE**

My Dear Friends,

Every year we are invited to participate in the Diocesan Annual Catholic Appeal (ACA), which is an opportunity for each and every one of us to be a part of the work of Christ in and through many essential ministries that support and help the local Church in San Diego. And before we go any further, I really need to thank everyone who participated in our ACA last year. For the first time in many years, we not only hit our target on time, but also went slightly over – but more on that later.

There is, I have found, sometimes an idea that the Church in general, and the Diocese in particular, is rolling in dough, or that its coffers are filled to the brim, or however people think about money. In short, there is a misconception that the Church is just sitting on piles of money, and that is simply not true. The truth is that the Church is completely dependent on the generosity of regular people like you and me just to keep the lights on and keep functioning. In particular, we see this bear out when it comes to the Annual Catholic Appeal.

The theme for this year's ACA is "United in Christ," and the money from it goes to various ministries and programs that are operated and supported at the diocesan level. This includes, but not limited to: Catholic schools, catechist training, Pro-Life events, retreats for married and engaged, assisting retired priests and consecrated religious, training seminarians, and serving the poor. Our parish has been asked to contribute \$25,607.00 to the ACA to go towards these ministries, each of which is essential in its own way to the life and work of the Church. As recently as 8 years ago, the ACA was helping me as I was finishing up my time at the seminary, so I can directly attest to its importance and its effect.


I mentioned earlier that last year was the first time in many years that we as a parish not only hit our goal well before the expected deadline, meaning that we did not have to pull the remaining difference from our savings in order to reach our expected target, but we actually slightly exceeded our goal. Which makes this the perfect time to remind everyone that every cent that we go over is returned to the parish for all of local ministries and needs that we have.

With all of this said, I would like to invite each of you to prayerfully consider how the Lord is inviting to give towards the ACA this year. We are told in Scripture to give back to the Lord, and to do so joyfully. We can participate in the ACA by using the response card to make a pledge and return it via the weekend collection or directly to the office, or you may visit the diocesan website. Even if you are unable to donate at this time, what I do ask of everyone is that you pray for our Church, for our Diocese, and for our Church leaders, especially Pope Francis and Cardinal McElroy, that they become saints and lead us to Christ in full fidelity to the truth.

Your participation, regardless of the size or amount, makes a difference. Remember that Jesus fed the multitudes with 5 loaves and 2 fish, then did it again just for good measure with 7 loaves, and each time there was more than enough left over. The amount is always less important than the heart that gives it.

## **GOSPEL MEDITATION**

February 18, 2024 1st Sunday of Lent

When I feel down, I sometimes watch the famous "Double Rainbow" video on YouTube to feel better. It's hilarious. A young man camping in Yosemite Park sees two rainbows stretching across the sky. He bursts into a kind of ecstasy. "Double rainbow, all the way! Oh my God!" he announces. Then he starts to weep. He cries out, "What does it mean?" Beneath the humor of his glorious overreaction is the deep intuition we all have, I think, when we see the colorful bow in the sky. This Sunday, God sends a rainbow to Noah, and to us. What does it mean?

Long before YouTube had the double rainbow, Dante's medieval poem The Divine Comedy featured one in his image of paradise. Seeing two rainbows, he muses that one is born of the other. The bow is God's promise of peace. For Dante, it's even more: nature's encrypted image of the Trinitarian God. One visible rainbow (God the Son) is begotten of another usually invisible one (God the Father) united by invisible light between them (God the Spirit). Like invisible light, Trinitarian glory surrounds us in every moment — but Jesus has made it visible in his glorious body.

Lenten challenge: This might seem silly, but this Lent I invite you to find a rainbow and meditate on it. You might have to make one yourself, like this current desert-dweller will. Gaze on it. See there a natural gift from the Creator, saying to you, "Here I am! I will love and protect you, surrounding you in My glory." This Lent let's embrace that with confidence, rain, or shine.
