

you have called people to follow you faithfully.


Humans have heard that call and many choose to follow your call in varied and faith-filled lives.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

While listening to a sports interview recently, I heard a great quote from probably the greatest college football coach ever, Nick Saban, who said, "I think at the end of the day, when you create an atmosphere where someone's tentatively committed to what they're trying to accomplish, you have to evaluate, is that really a good thing? Because we all need to be totally committed to whatever our goals and aspirations are, the sense of purpose that we have if we're going to have a chance to be successful."

This is brilliant. And it is so true. Joel Klatt, who interviewed him that day, looked back on it later and summarized it thus: when we're tentatively committed to whatever we're trying to accomplish, we will always fall short. And that's true for all of us, no matter who we are, or what we're trying to accomplish.

When we are tentatively committed, we will never accomplish our goal. I would apologize for repeating this several times with only some slight rewordings, but to be honest, the longer I think about it, the more profound – and the more convicting – it becomes. It's worth asking then, what is my goal? What is it that I hope to accomplish? Because whatever I'm most committed to, that's what I will end up becoming. As Jesus says, "where your treasure is, there your heart will be also" (Luke 12:34). So where is my treasure? What do I value above everything else? And before I rush to say, "Jesus!" or "my faith!" I need to look at how I spend my time, my energy, my talents, my money... Because that's a much greater indicator as to what I value than my words.

But while we're asking this, I would like to propose that the only goal we should really care about when all the other lights go out is whether or not we have become saints – that is, friends of God. The French novelist Leon Bloy once said, "The only real sadness, the only real failure, the only great tragedy in life, is not to become a saint." So that begs the question, in the journey to sainthood, as we strive towards the only goal that matters, becoming a true friend of God, are we tentatively committed? Because if we are tentatively committed to become God's friend, we will fall short. We have to be fully committed, fully engaged in our pursuit of holiness, not half-hearted. And this, by the way, is what Jesus says in various and different ways throughout the gospel, as he warns us about the cost of discipleship, the cost of being his friend (cf. Luke 14:25-34, etc.).

Dear brothers and sisters, my encouragement for you, for all of us, is that we not be tentative in our commitment to becoming saints and friends of God.

Dear Friends,

"Mass is boring."

Before I had truly *encountered* Jesus, this statement described my experience at times. Perhaps it does for you as well. We go to Mass and feel the same holy water on our foreheads, participate in the same rituals, speak the same words, see the same things... But is Mass really boring?

Just to help keep myself honest, I looked up the definition of boring. My source indicates boredom comes from restlessness, because I am not interested in something. Hmm. Yet Mass is not about some *thing*. It is about the *One* who loves me.

Mass—I can say it, we each can say it—is about the Someone who loves me so much that not only did he die for me, but he literally defeated sin and death, crushed Satan, and opened up the gates of heaven for me so that I could live in eternal bliss forever. Even if I were the only human in the universe, the only person in need of rescue, he would have done it all for me, just for me.

And guess what? He would have done it just for you, too.

Friends, this is what the Mass is about: entering into the depths of self-giving love that Jesus poured out on the cross and continues to pour out every time his self-sacrifice is renewed at Mass. And he wants us there, all of us. No, not just meaning each and every one of us (although that is true too!), but our whole selves—our minds, our hearts, our bodies, our souls—100% of me, all there; 100% of you, all there—for him, through him, with him, in him.

It is possible to perceive Mass as boring, but the objective truth of the matter is that this just isn't reality. Mass is the most exciting, passionate, profound experience we could ever have with another Person. And that Person happens to be the Son of God, Jesus Christ, in perfect communion with his Father, through the Spirit.

The same thing over and over? I don't think so.

Each day of Lent, spend ten minutes with John Bergsma as he reads and reflects on one chapter of the Book of Exodus and then gives you a daily challenge to complete.




Children of the Immaculate Heart
