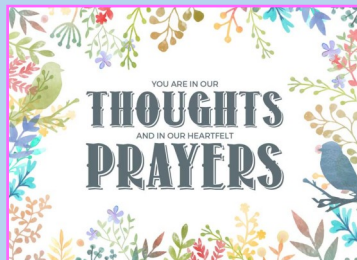

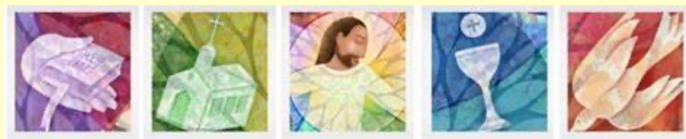

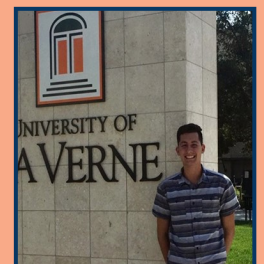

## ***PASTOR'S PAGE***

---

Dear Friends,

Providentially, the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus follows the Feast of Corpus Christi, the Body and Blood of Jesus. I say “providentially” because even though it was completely intentional when the Church Fathers placed the Feast of the Sacred Heart the Friday after Corpus Christi, it is still a great reminder of not just what we are receiving in Communion, but **Who**. *Last Sunday was all about Christ's true presence in the Eucharist; this past Friday focused on the divine love that enflames the heart of Jesus for our salvation. But the two are very closely related, and while it's not particularly hard to see why, a surprising outside source actually confirms this for us.*

There are many accounts of Eucharistic miracles – that is, when the “accidents” (sorry, philosophical term) of bread and wine start to bleed or even change into actual human flesh and blood on the altar. That includes the past century or two, after we were “sophisticated” enough to test these phenomena and find out what they are, since something that clearly used to be bread suddenly and inexplicably started bleeding. To make sure that no bias creeps in, the Church always tries to choose for the scientific testing (to verify that the miracle is genuine) an atheist scientist who is not informed ahead of time where the particle he is testing came from. Care to guess what happens? The scientists always find the same thing: the unidentified sample they were given is **living human heart tissue**. *To be clear, that's impossible on multiple levels, or at the very least there is no rational scientific explanation for how that can be possible, so we must conclude that these are real miracles.*

A lot could be said or written about that by itself, or how in every case that has ever been tested, the blood type is always the same: AB positive, the universal receiver. But I'd like to instead refocus on how the Sacred Heart of Jesus actually meshes perfectly with Holy Communion. The Eucharistic Host, when scientists look at the miracles under a microscope, is living human heart tissue. Friends, this means that the Eucharist isn't just the generic body of Jesus – it's His Sacred Heart! The same Heart that is on fire with Divine Love for us is what He gives us for our spiritual nourishment and healing in Holy Communion! The same fire that engulfed the burning bush but didn't consume it surrounds us and engulfs us each and every time we approach the altar of the Lord to receive Him! The Eucharist truly is Jesus present among us, Body, Blood, Soul, and Divinity, but more than that (if it's even possible to use the word “more” after speaking about Christ's infinite love and mercy), it's His own Sacred Heart that He gives us each and every time we draw near to Him.

I encourage you to dive into the Sacred Heart of Jesus with great confidence and joy in every way and at all times, but especially when you approach Him in the Eucharist. The Sacred Heart longs for us to be plunged into its infinite depths and set on fire with His Divine Love. Never run from Him, but instead allow Him to receive you even as you receive Him in Holy Communion.

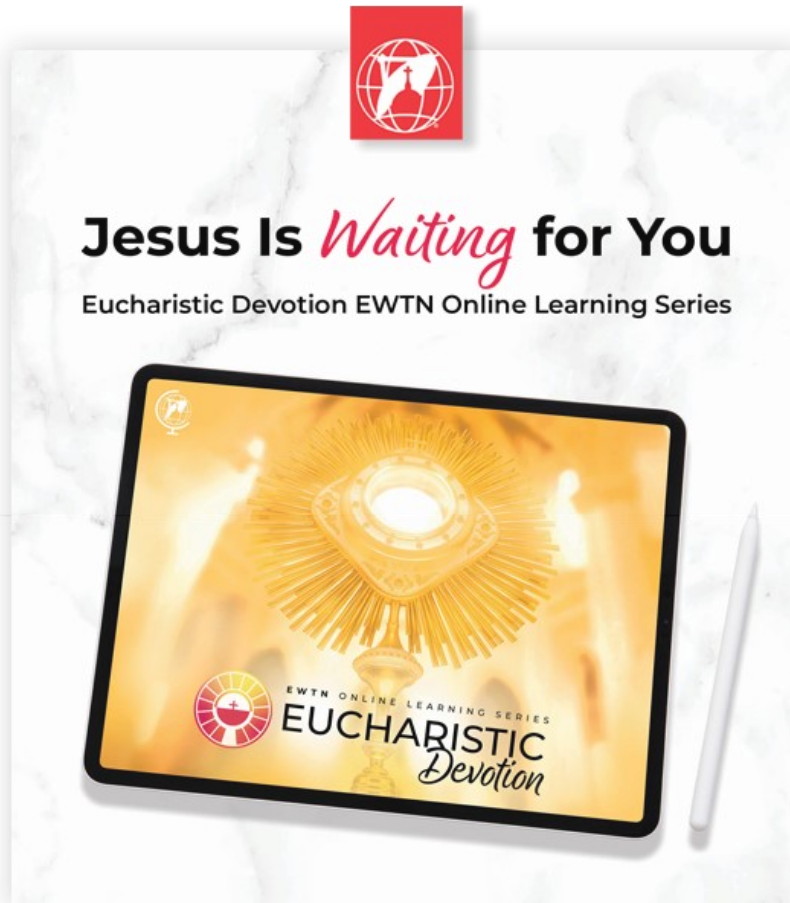


### **Everyday Stewardship**

I have coached all three of my children in soccer at some time in their lives. I loved teaching them and their teammates the importance of functioning as one unit. If we were not all moving together toward victory, we would all find ourselves together in defeat. We used to go through one drill I called the "human foosball." We would scrimmage with players in lines like on a foosball table. If you ever got too far behind or too far ahead of those in your line, play would stop and the ball would go to the other team. The goal was to help build an awareness of where your teammates were on the pitch and to teach the lesson that no one player is a team onto themselves.

As disciples and stewards, we sometimes find ourselves far behind or maybe even too far ahead. As a consequence, our actions either hinder the ability of the Body of Christ to evangelize and pass on the faith to a new generation or present the Church as an entity that sees itself as judgmental or too holy to be in the world. We are called to community, and in that community, we must be aware of our brothers and sisters in the faith. At times, we need to help them grow in their faith. Other times, we need to slow down and realize that we cannot change the world on our own. We all have unique gifts we are called to share, and we can only bear true witness to the power of the Body of Christ when we are all moving together and making each other strong.

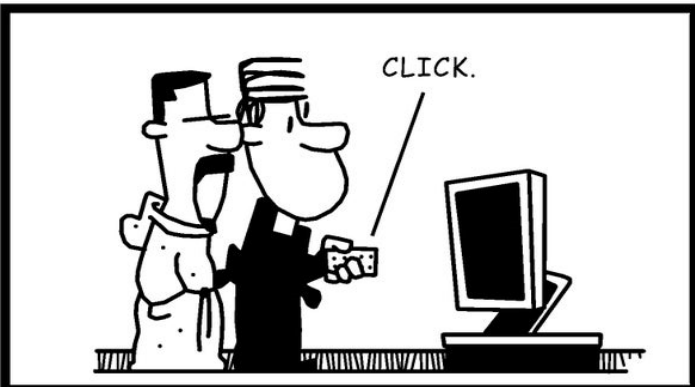
