Friends,

On January 29th of this year, Elmo from Sesame Street tweeted on X: "Elmo is just checking in! How is everyone doing?"

Now, setting aside for a moment that Elmo even has an X account, which is more than this pastor can say, what no one (including Elmo, I'm sure) saw coming was the tidal wave of response. Thousands of people responded within hours, and as of this writing, the number of views is in excess of 200 million. The overwhelming majority of responses were, to put it delicately, extremely melancholy. In the immediate aftermath, a lot of people – rightly, I think – observed that this highlights the importance and current lack of good mental health in the world today. I think that's quite valid, and certainly there is more we can and should do, but I would like to go a bit further, if I may, because I sincerely doubt that all of the emotional well-being in the world could ever fix what's actually wrong with us. You see, I believe the root of this problem and its solution is actually spiritual. And I think that's pretty obvious, even if the only piece of evidence available was Elmo's X account.

Why did so many people – grown ups, mind you, not children watching Sesame Street! – immediately respond by pouring out their hearts to an innocent little Muppet when asked, "how are you doing?" And I don't mean that in terms of what's wrong with us, because I think it's patently obvious that we're broken, and I certainly don't mean this to be disrespectful towards anyone, but why Elmo?

What about prayer? Why not bring all of those things to the Lord? Over and over again in Scripture we're encouraged to bring every care, every concern, every burden to God. Jesus tells us to not worry or be anxious (Mt 6:25-34), which in my experience is only possible if we are trusting the Lord and bringing everything to Him. Saint Peter tells us to cast all our cares on him, because he cares for us (1 Pet 5:7), and Saint Paul tells us to be anxious about nothing, but in everything, by prayer and petition, with thanksgiving, to bring everything to God (Phil 4:6-7). And on it goes. Repeatedly we are given assurance that God cares for us and about us, and that He always listens to us.

Mental health and emotional well-being have their place, and it's an important one, but the life of grace is more important. While I wasn't a Sesame Street kid, I have always found the Muppets and their quirky brand of humor hilarious and full of fun, but prayer and relationship with God trumps anything the world, and especially the internet, can offer. Does the world need healing? Yes, of course it does. And does mental health have a role to play in all of that? Sure. But what we are offered through prayer is nothing less than intimacy and friendship with God. And with respect to Elmo, that's way better than a tweet, even coming from an adorable Muppet.

Mary, Mother Of God

Question:

If God is eternal and infinite, how can He have a mother? Why don't we call Mary just the mother of Jesus?


Answer:

The tile of "Mary, Mother of God" can be confusing. We aren't implying that Mary existed from eternity or that she is divine herself. We aren't promoting some kind of Marian superpowers. The Church has fought for this title throughout the centuries for one simple reason: Christ's identity is at stake.

As the Church grew in the early centuries, theologians wrestled with what it meant for Jesus to be both God and man. Many distortions of his identity began to emerge. One of these was propagated by a man named Nestorius. Nestorius and his followers denied that Jesus' human nature and his divine nature were inseparable. Following that logic, Mary could have only conceived Jesus' *human* nature. But people don't give birth to a "nature." They give birth to a whole person. For Jesus, his whole person is both human and divine. In 431 A.D. the Council of Ephesus denounced Nestorius. The bishops affirmed that Jesus is both fully human and fully divine and proclaimed Mary *Theotokos.* Translating the Greek to English, that means "God-bearer." Note that this isn't "God-generator" or "God-creator." Mary bore Jesus, God and man, in her womb and gave him birth. She is mother to the whole person, the whole Jesus, and therefore Mother of God.

Andrew Joseph Tompkins was born to Diana and Paul Tompkins on Easter Sunday, April 12, 1998. He is survived by two sisters, Marion and Julia. He received the sacraments of Baptism, Reconciliation, Holy Communion, and Confirmation at our family parish, Queen of Angels Church in Alpine, California. He was very active in our parish as a member of the children's choir, a long-time altar server, a member of the 412 Church Youth Ministry Group, and he attended the Steubenville Youth Conferences throughout his high school years.


Andrew graduated from Granite Hills High School in 2016 and attended the University of La Verne (ULV) on an academic scholarship to study business marketing. He received the Knights of Columbus scholarship award for the two years he attended ULV and was grateful to the Knights Council for the financial support. Andrew had a passion for learning. He was an Honor Student and an accomplished swimmer and diver in high school and college.

Unfortunately, Andrew was diagnosed with cancer in his second year of college and was forced to suspend his studies while he had surgery and went through chemotherapy for several months. After a very tough battle, the Lord called him home on September 22, 2019 at the age of 21. While Andrew's time at ULV was short, he completed enough units to receive his Associate of Arts degree (posthumous). He was a natural born student and loved school and university life. He would be honored to know that this scholarship fund is now named after him. Indeed, his family is honored that Andrew's memory will live on through all students who go off to college with big hopes and dreams and remain strong in the Catholic faith.
