

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

At the time of this writing, it is still Tuesday morning, so some of the polls aren't even open yet. It is important, however, to address the topic of the recent election, since regardless of the outcome that will certainly be on everyone's mind this weekend.

My advice on election day was to **pray, vote, and don't worry!** And when I read these words again several days later, I hope that I can look back and smile that we were all able to do just that, and enjoy an anxiety-free election day full of peace and gratitude. But Wednesday is coming, and with it, the election results. So how are we as God's people – God's family – to respond? Interestingly enough, the answer is the same regardless of whether or not the politicians I voted for were elected or the ballot measures I supported passed or failed. The answer, while it might sound a few weeks early, is thankfulness.

If "my" side won, the reason why is pretty obvious. If "my" side lost, I can still be thankful that I live in a country where I am given a voice and allowed to vote, and that the results are temporary (four years). But in both cases, I should be extraordinarily thankful that it doesn't matter which aspiring "Caesar" won the election! Thanks be to God, the world has already been given a savior. His name is Jesus of Nazareth, and his kingdom will never end. He is not subject to the whims of politicians, lobbyists, opinion polls, or internet mobs. Caesar can take whatever he wants — and Caesar always does — but our salvation comes from God, not from any political platform or party or politician or policy, or any other word that begins with the letter 'p,' come to think of it. Whether "my" side wins or loses the election doesn't change the temperature of heaven even a fraction of one degree. I love the United States of America, but I'm perfectly content to let the aspiring Caesars duke it out over who gets to act important for the next four years and feel like they accomplished something. Jesus is my king, and heaven is my true home. And that, dear brothers and sisters in Christ, is something for which I am very, very thankful.



Dear Friends,

Uncertainty. We all experience it, and none of us is particularly fond of it. There is the everyday uncertainty of rain or shine, or the oscillating moods of family members or co-workers. Some of us experience long-term uncertainties around health or financial stability. Then there is the uncertainty of the upcoming election.

And most of all, a great number of us are pained over the uncertainty of whether or not our loved ones will return to Jesus in the Eucharist.

In the midst of all this, one thing is certain: the enduring love of God. Indeed, no greater love is there than to lay down one's life for one's friends (Jn 15:13)—which Jesus did for you and for me—a love that we experience in a profound and mysterious way at every Mass and in our times of Eucharistic adoration.

Our only proper response to the infinite love of God is to love one another. Love is at the heart of our Eucharistic Missionary call. Pope Francis reflects very beautifully on this missionary imperative in his new encyclical, <u>Dilexit Nos</u>. Our Holy Father's insights are a great encouragement to me to refocus my energy on what is most central and to allow all my other actions to flow from this reality. I thought we could all take this time to reflect on these few sentences from the document with the help of the Holy Spirit.

Come, Holy Spirit, help us listen to the voice of Jesus.

"In your own way, you too must be a missionary, like the apostles and the first disciples of Jesus, who went forth to proclaim the love of God, to tell others that Christ is alive and worth knowing."

Pause and allow Jesus to help you reflect on these words.

"Saint Thérèse experienced this as an essential part of her oblation to merciful Love: 'I wanted to give my Beloved to drink and I felt myself consumed with a thirst for souls.' That is your mission as well. Each of us must carry it out in his or her own way; you will come to see how you can be a missionary. Jesus deserves no less."

Pause and allow Jesus to help you reflect on these words.

"If you accept the challenge, he will enlighten you, accompany you and strengthen you, and you will have an enriching experience that will bring you much happiness."

Pause and allow Jesus to help you reflect on these words.

"It is not important whether you see immediate results; leave that to the Lord who works in the secret of our hearts. Keep experiencing the joy born of our efforts to share the love of Christ with others" (*Dilexit Nos*, no. 216).

Jesus, you are the Lord of time, the Lord of history, and the Lord of our hearts. Help us to respond to the uncertainties of life by placing our faith in the certainty of your unconditional love, and to allow that love to bear great fruit in our lives through, with, and in you.



GOSPEL MEDITATION

November 10, 2024 32nd Sunday in Ordinary Time

Once at an evening Mass as a poor college student, the collection basket was fast approaching, and I only had a tendollar bill. I was planning on using that to buy my favorite Chipotle burrito that night for dinner. Should I keep the money? Who would know if I did? If I gave it away, what would I eat? Would I be okay? I kissed my future burrito goodbye, dropped the money in the basket, and winced. But strangely, the rest of the Mass I felt more engaged than usual. I had skin in the game. I left the Mass excited to see how God would take care of me. And he did, in amazing ways.

When the poor widow places two copper coins in the temple treasury, Jesus doesn't pity her. He praises her. He blesses her. He brags about her. He celebrates her as the temple's largest benefactor. Her giving is an act of radical, concrete trust in God. It is as if she is entering a new level of giving that excites Jesus, because she contributes not out of her abundance, but she gives "everything she had."

What a challenge this is to each one of us! How easy it is to ignore this! But imagine the eruption of the energy of faith, hope, and love that would be unlocked if our financial sacrifices to the Church actually tapped into daily bread and not only our disposable income. I challenge us to try this in some way this coming week and see what happens in our hearts. Even if it costs us a burrito.
