PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

On my recent canonical retreat I took some time to read from a collection of old letters I received from extended family that included letters that had originally been written to my grandfather when he spent a few years attending seminary and discerning the priesthood. Obviously the Lord had very different plans for him, for which I am personally very grateful, but it was, to use a somewhat old-fashioned term (but what did you expect after reading those letters?), *delightful* to read family correspondence from 1946-47. It was amusing to see a '46 newspaper clipping from the funny pages with a comic of – wait for it – Donald Duck. I also had to laugh when I stumbled across a tract that spoke of the "recent" apparitions in Fatima. While most of the letters were from his mother (my great-grandmother), others came from siblings and friends. His little sister, for example, was fond of using stationery that had cute cartoon ducks on it, and she playfully signed off "Love, guess who" on one occasion. I also found it familiar and weirdly comforting to read a letter from a good friend of his where he trash-talks about their rival college and the upcoming game against said hated rival. There were a few copies of the monthly publication the seminary put out, also from '46-'47, and those really made me smile, as it was good to see that seminarians have barely changed at all in the past 80 years. It was, in the best sort of way, nostalgic.

All of which made me reflect on the beauty of the Church, her colorful and vibrant history, the Apostolic Tradition she has received and continues to pass down through the ages, and the Sacred Scriptures – love letters from her Divine Bridegroom – that she holds close to her heart. Friends, it is good for us to remember that the Tradition we have received came from real people who knew Jesus personally and talked to him face to face. It is good for us to remember that the letters we read and hear from the New Testament (NT) every Sunday were real letters written by real people to real people. In the same way I had to piece together the full conversation between my grandfather and great-grandmother while only having one half of the conversation, sometimes it can be a little tricky figuring out precisely what Saint Paul (it's usually Saint Paul) is so passionate about this time, but we can still hang on to every word of Scripture because – and this is important – *every word was written with love*. The NT epistles, and indeed, the Bible in its entirety, is no less family correspondence than the letters my great-grandmother and great-aunt wrote; they just usually contain fewer newspaper clippings and don't have ducks on the stationary. And the words and stories from the Gospels are even more important, because again, they are words that Jesus really spoke to us, actions that he really did for us. The Gospels tell us real stories about real people who really encountered the living God in the person of Jesus Christ! This is beyond remarkable.

Brothers and sisters, please always remember that our faith is rooted in reality, and not just any reality, but the reality of a person – *the* Person: Jesus of Nazareth, the Word who became flesh. It was a reality that was lived, experienced, and shared by people like you and me, people who then did their best to communicate to everyone they met what it was like when they encountered God. This is the Tradition and faith we have received, and while your letters and mine will never be included in the canon of Sacred Scripture, we still have a responsibility to pass on what we have received, which is nothing less than the divine and eternal love of God Himself.
