
Palm Sunday: Passion of the Lord

Pope St. John Paul II rightly taught, "To believe in Jesus is to accept what he says, even when it runs contrary to what others are saying. It means rejecting the lure of sin, however attractive it may be, in order to set out on a difficult path of Gospel virtues." Acceptance, rejection, suffering, betrayal, fear, reluctance, persecution, and painful, undeserved and unjust death are all played out in dramatic fashion today. Jesus spoke of God's unconditional love, mercy, and forgiveness. Who doesn't like hearing about love, especially God's? Jesus did not have backs turned on him, face intense suffering, and succumb to a horrific death because he spoke of God's love. All of those things occurred because of the implications of actually believing in God's love.

God's love comes with an intimate and equal bond with love of neighbor. This moves the believer outward to truly see their brothers and sisters as equals and compels them to work for a world that mirrors God's kingdom: a world based on justice, peace, mercy, and forgiveness. Sometimes, people want to keep God's love to themselves and use it solely for their own benefit. When they only want to use God's love to justify their own intentions and for their own projects, problems occur.

Sin makes something hurtful, destructive, and self-serving look very attractive and justifiable. The lure of sin creates friends who begin to believe the lie that the sin expounds. This is what happened on Calvary. When you begin actually doing what Jesus is saying and translate love into action, it inevitably will upset popular and longstanding conventions and structures. Many of these serve to protect status, foster personal gain and success, and further divide those who have from those who do not. Most people who hear the Gospel are attracted to what they hear, at first. When they realize that it means standing apart from popular opinion, even if that opinion is against the Gospel and sinful, they cower back in fear and join the throngs shouting, "Crucify him!" There is an ambivalence found in many believers as they struggle with whether their belief is strong enough "to set out on the difficult path of Gospel virtues."

It takes a lot of courage to admit that the system is broken. It takes even more courage to point out the sin. And it takes an unbreakable love of God to then accept the consequences of doing so.






Prayer for Palm Sunday

DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

April 27, 2025 We will have a special hour of adoration from 3:00 pm – 4:00 pm on Divine Mercy Sunday.

We will begin with exposition and the Divine Mercy Chaplet, and close with the Litany of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and benediction. Please join us as we come together and intercede for God's mercy.

The Second Sunday of Easter, April 7th this year, is designated as the Sunday of Divine Mercy. To encourage the celebration of God's infinite mercy, Pope St. John Paul II established this feast day and bestowed it with a plenary indul-gence. This favor is granted to the faithful under the usual conditions:

(1) Going to confession (within eight days, before or after, though before is typically better)

- (2) Receiving Holy Communion
- (3) Praying for the intentions of the Holy Father
- (4) Complete detachment from all sin, including venial sin

If one does not have complete detachment from all of his sins, he may still receive a partial indulgence.

Most of the requirements for a plenary indulgence are satisfied by attending Sunday Mass:

*In the Penitential Rite we implore the mercy of God to be detached from all affection for sin.

*In the general intercessions we pray for the Holy Father and his intentions, and for greater fidelity in our own lives to works of charity and mercy.

*In the Creed and the Our Father, we thank God for His mercy and ask to be forgiven as we forgive those who sin against us.

*We receive the Eucharistic Lord in Holy Communion.

The Lord Jesus gave the celebration of His Divine Mercy through private revelations to Saint Maria Faustina from 1925 until her death in Krakow in 1938. Jesus promised great graces to the faithful who keep this devotion. For more information please visit: www.thedivinemercy.org

DIVINE MERCY NOVENA and CHAPLET

The Chaplet of Divine Mercy can be said at any time; however, Jesus encouraged us to pray it during the hour of mercy (3 pm, the hour He died on the Cross) and especially to pray it with and for those who are dying. He also asked Saint Faustina that the chaplet be recited as a novena, specifically on the nine days before the Feast of Divine Mercy, which places the start date on Good Friday every year. This year the novena of Divine Mercy starts on Friday April 18, 2025.

At Queen of Angels Church we will pray the Divine Mercy Chaplet 15 minutes before each weekend Mass on the Second Sunday of Easter (April 26-27).

Dear Friends,

In these waning days of Lent and as we look forward to the Triduum and the Easter season, let us rejoice at the sacrificial nature of love! This love is most obviously apparent in Christ's sacrifice for humanity on the cross. On a micro-level, sacrifice is abundant in our marriages and family lives.

Radiate Love recently offered this brief reflection.

"Love-true love-is a verb! Love is a decision made every single day, sometimes every minute, to actively place the needs of the beloved ahead of one's own. This is not easy, nor popular today in an age of personal empowerment. Nevertheless, as Christians we find our inspiration for marital love in Scripture. The love between husband and wife points to the love between Jesus and his Church. Jesus lays down his life for each of us, and his last words on the cross were to ask forgiveness for those who put him to death.

Couples and families, remember that even the smallest actions you take are impactful, shaping the love and values your children carry into their future marriages. And for our parish communities, let's come together to interweave these invaluable resources into your monthly pastoral activities."
