<u>Sunday Bible Reflection</u> <u>Twenty-First Sunday in Ordinary Time</u>

Isaiah 66:18–21 Psalm 117:1, 2 Hebrews 12:5–7, 11–13 Luke 13:22–30

Gateway to Life

Jesus doesn't answer the question put to Him in this Sunday's Gospel. It profits us nothing to speculate on how many will be saved. What we need to know is what He tells us today—how to enter into salvation and how urgent it is to strive now, before the Master closes the door.

Jesus is "the narrow gate," the only way of salvation, the path by which all must travel to enter the kingdom of the Father (see John 14:6).

In Jesus, God has come—as He promises in this week's First Reading—to gather nations of every language, to reveal to them His glory.

Eating and drinking with them, teaching in their streets, Jesus in the Gospel is slowly making His way to Jerusalem. There, Isaiah's vision will be fulfilled: On the holy mountain He will be lifted up (see John 3:14), and He will draw to Himself brethren from among all the nations to worship in the heavenly Jerusalem, to glorify Him for His kindness, as we sing in today's Psalm.

In God's plan, the kingdom was proclaimed first to the Israelites and last to the Gentiles (see Romans 1:16; Acts 3:25–26), who in the Church have come from the earth's four corners to make up the new people of God (see Isaiah 43:5–6; Psalm 107:2–3).

Many, however, will lose their place at the heavenly table, Jesus warns. Refusing to accept His narrow way they will weaken, rendering themselves unknown to the Father (see Isaiah 63:15–16).

We don't want to be numbered among those of drooping hands and weak knees (see Isaiah 35:3). So, we must strive for that narrow gate, a way of hardship and suffering—the way of the beloved Son.

As this week's Epistle reminds us, by our trials we know we are truly God's sons and daughters. We are being disciplined by our afflictions, strengthened to walk that straight and narrow path—that we may enter the gate and take our place at the banquet of the righteous.

QUEENSHIP OF MARY


QUESTION:

WHY DO WE HAVE A FEAST FOR THE QUEENSHIP OF MARY?

ANSWER:

FOR MANY OF US, THE LANGUAGE OF KINGS AND QUEENS MAY SEEM LIKE THEY BELONG TO HISTORY OR A MEDIEVAL MOVIE. ROYALTY HAVE ABSOLUTE AUTHORITY OVER A KINGDOM AND THEIR SUBJECTS, A CONCEPT THAT IS FOREIGN TO MANY OF US TODAY. WHILE JESUS DOESN'T RULE A POLITICAL KINGDOM, WE HONOR AND RECOGNIZE HIM AS THE KING OF KINGS, LORD OF HEAVEN AND EARTH. TO GOD ALONE BELONGS ABSOLUTE AUTHORITY OVER ALL OF EXISTENCE.

WE MAY THINK OF QUEENS AS THE SPOUSE OF THE KING, BUT THERE IS ANOTHER KEY RELATIONSHIP: THE KING'S MOTHER. IN BIBLICAL HISTORY, WE SEE INSTANCES WHERE THE MOTHER OF THE KING IS GIVEN DUE AS A QUEEN HERSELF, COMPLETE WITH A THRONE! MARY'S GUIDING INFLUENCE OVER HER SON IS SEEN MOST NOTABLY IN THE WEDDING FEAST AT CANA. MARY IS NOT QUEEN ON HER OWN MERIT. SHE IS "FULL OF GRACE" AND "BLESSED" IN "ALL AGES" BECAUSE OF THE REIGN OF HER SON.

Do You Know Him, or Just Know About Him?

Facebook, Twitter, and other forms of social media can be powerful tools of communication. They allow people to stay in touch. They provide an avenue for fresh ideas. People can be engaged in conversations and be exposed to issues of the day in ways few could have dreamed of just a few decades ago. But social media can also give the false sense of really knowing someone, when only the surface has been scratched about who a person is in reality.

You don't really know someone just because you know a lot about him or her and are linked to a profile online. Unfortunately, people develop emotional attachments to the idea of a person all the time. If they do find themselves fortunate enough to meet the person face-to-face one day, they can often find out they never really knew the person in the first place.

There are people who believe they know Jesus so very well. They can readily share their view of what Jesus would do or wouldn't do in a given situation. They own items like crosses and Bibles that seem to provide evidence of this person they know so well. Sometimes, they even strongly admonish others because their view of Jesus is certainly not in line with their own.

But in Luke 13, Jesus speaks about those who claim to know him, but they really do not belong to him at all. They make claims based upon what they have seen and heard, but they have never allowed Jesus to truly change them. They are like Facebook followers; seemingly close, but with no real relationship at all.

Do you know Jesus? Don't just be a fan. Invite Jesus into your life and let the real relationship begin.

Basilicas are churches that are so titled because of their antiquity, dignity, historical importance, or significance as centers of worship. A cathedral is the principal church of a diocese, which contains the chair of the bishop, or "cathedra" in Latin. The chair is the symbol of the bishop's teaching authority.
