

### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

### The Parable of The Rich Fool

The readings this Sunday focus upon the sin of greed. In the Book of Ecclesiastes [1:2; 2:21-23] we hear that "...one who has labored with wisdom and knowledge and skill, and yet to another who has not labored over it, he must leave all he has." In the Letter of Saint Paul to the Colossians [3:1-5, 9-11] we are exhorted to "...seek what is above.... [and] "Put to death . . . the parts of you that are earthly..." especially "the greed that is idolatry." And too, in the Gospel of Luke [12:13-21], Our Lord tells us directly: "Take care to guard against all greed, for though one may be rich, one's life does not consist of possessions." We should therefore reflect upon the sin of greed, also known as avarice or covetousness. First of all we should see that it is a sin; then, in what does this sin consists of; then, what are the dangers of this sin, and finally how we can protect ourselves against falling into it.

First of all, when we are talking about greed, avarice, or covetousness, we should see that it is not merely about money. Money simply represents a universal good that is translatable into all material goods. St. Paul does not say that money is the root of all evil, but rather "...the <u>love</u> of money is the root of all evils" [I Tim 6:10]. What is really at heart here is the love of this world, of its comforts, its pleasures, and a certain self-satisfaction that comes from a false sense of security which riches represent to man. Avarice is really about being satisfied with material goods as if they were the end and goal of all our activities — our very life. This sin then consists in a certain imbalance in our lives, whereby we seek after and accumulate material goods beyond the due measure of reason, instead of using them for what they are really for, which is a passing thing meant to further our life of charity as a means of giving to God and neighbor.

St. Thomas Aquinas states [Q118 a5] that whenever and wherever we seek after good things there always consists a due measure, a certain balance; evil comes about from seeking too much (excess) or too little (deficiency) of that measure. Again he says that, in all things that we seek after as an end or goal, the good consists in a certain measure: since whatever is directed to an end must necessarily be fitting to (commensurate with) the end, as, for instance, a certain measure of medicine is commensurate with health, not too much, not too little (e.g. an assembly line). Now all external good things come under the head of things useful for an end, since we only seek after some further goal in possessing material goods. Hence it is necessary that man's good in respect to material goods consists in a certain measure or balance, in other words, that man seeks, according to the measure of reason, to have external riches, in so far as they are necessary for him to live in keeping with his condition of life. Wherefore it will be a sin for him to exceed this measure, by wishing to acquire or keep them immoderately. What is immoderation in this? Sacred Scripture usually points to a multiplicity of things, in other words, 'Do I have more than one thing? [Lk 3:11; Mt 25:35; I Jn:3:17; Jms 2:15].

What are the specific dangers of this sin? St Thomas says that covetousness is incurable – on a human level – due to a defect in fallen human nature, since the more deficient one is (lonely, sorrowful, depressed, etc.) the more one seeks relief and comfort in external things, and consequently the more one gives way to covetousness (For instance, when we're down we think were in need of some 'thing', so we go shopping to fill our emptiness). Hence incurability of this kind is an indication of this sin being more dangerous than others. On the other hand, grace can conquer all things and heals our wounded human nature so we should never despair.

Another danger is that covetousness is a spiritual sin. For spiritual sins are those in which man takes pleasures in the interior of his soul, without pleasure of the flesh. Such is covetousness: for the covetous man takes pleasure in the mere consideration of himself as a possessor of riches, as in a false sense of security, as does the rich man in the Gospel lesson today, whom Our Lord calls a "Fool". In God's terms a fool is not one who is lacking education, but rather one who exchanges what is of great value for something that is empty or worthless. Just "... like Esau, who sold his birthright for a single meal". [Heb 12:16; Gen 25:32]; or persons who do not believe in the existence of God, "The fool says in his heart, 'There is no God." [Psalm 14:1; 53:1; Proverbs 14:33].

A final danger is that, of course, covetousness is a capital vice, or "Cardinal sin". A capital vice is one which, under the aspect of end (or goal), causes other vices to arise: because when an end is very desirable, the result is that through desire thereof man sets about doing many things either good or evil to attain the end in question. The 'daughters' of the cardinal sin of covetousness are: treachery, fraud, falsehood, perjury, restlessness, violence, and insensibility to mercy.

Consequently, covetousness is a three-fold sin against neighbor, self, and God: 1.) Neighbor; when a man acquires or keeps external goods more than is duly measured. In this way it is a sin directly against one's neighbor, since one man cannot over-abound in external riches, without another man lacking them, for temporal goods cannot be possessed by many at the same time. 2.) Oneself; it may signify immoderation in the internal affection which a man has for riches when, for instance, a man loves them, desires them, or delights in them, immoderately. In this way by covetousness a Continued on Page 5

man sins against himself, because *it causes disorder in his affections*, though not in his body as do the sins of the flesh. And finally, 3.) <u>God</u>; it is a sin against God, just as all mortal sins, inasmuch as man holds in contempt things eternal for the sake of temporal things. *"For what does it profit a man, to gain the whole world and lose his only soul?* [Mark 8:36"]

And finally how we can protect ourselves against falling into the sin of greed? The answer is simply: follow Our Lord's cautionary words: "Take care to guard against all greed..." and again, "Do not store up for yourselves treasures on earth, . . . But store up for yourselves treasures in heaven... [Mt 6:19]. Remember the Parable of the rich man and Lazarus [Lk 16:19], where the rich man goes to hell simply because he neglected Lazarus. Remember too covetousness was the central sin of Judas, who held the common purse of the apostles [Jn 12:4], and sold our Lord for 30 pieces of silver [Mt 26:15]. And finally, remember Our Lord's particular warning regarding this sin when Jesus said to his disciples

"Truly, I say to you, it will be hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven.

Again I say to you, it is easier for a camel to pass through the eye of a needle
than for a rich man to enter the kingdom of God." Mt 19:23

# Their "Rescuing Hug" Stunned the World



These iconic twins were born 12 weeks premature in 1995. They're lying on their bellies, and the slightly larger baby (red dot) has her stick-thin arm around her sister. One baby (yellow dot) was not expected to live, so a smart hospital nurse placed the girls together in one incubator. The stronger baby wrapped her arm around her sister, and her touch allowed the struggling baby's heart to stabilize and her temperature to return to normal.

The photograph of Kyrie hugging her little sister, dubbed the "Rescuing Hug," appeared in both Life magazine and Reader's Digest. It brought fame to the pair and spurred a growing interest in co-bedding premature twins, triplets, and quads. The University of Massachusetts Memorial, for example, has co-bedded at least 100 sets of multiple birth preemies. Observing this practice over a period of five years, the hospital staff there has not found a single case of twin-to-twin infection. In addition, clinical studies have shown that premature twins enjoy substantial benefits when they are placed in the same bed together.

## What are the Odds of Life Evolving by Chance Alone?

### **DNA Molecules and the Odds Against Evolution**

Within each cell there is an area called the nucleus which contains the all-important chromosomes. Chromosomes are microscopically small, rod-shaped structures which carry the genes. Within the chromosomes is an even smaller structure called DNA. This is one of the most important chemical substances in the human body -- or in any other living thing. Increasing scientific understanding of DNA molecules has revealed enormous problems for materialism.

DNA is a super-molecule which stores coded hereditary information. It consists of two long "chains" of chemical "building blocks" paired together. In humans, the strands of DNA are almost 2 yards long, yet less than a trillionth of an inch thick.

In function, DNA is somewhat like a computer program on a floppy disk. It stores and transfers encoded information and instructions. It is said that the DNA of a human stores enough information code to fill 1,000 books -- each with 500 pages of very small, closely-printed type. *The DNA code produces a product far more so-phisticated than that of any computer*. Amazingly, this enormous set of instructions fits with ease within a single cell and routinely directs the formation of entire adult humans, starting with just a single fertilized egg. Even the DNA of a bacterium is highly complex, containing at least 3 million units, all aligned in a very precise, meaningful sequence.

DNA and the molecules that surround it form a truly superb mechanism -- a miniaturized marvel. The information is so compactly stored that the amount of DNA necessary to code all the people living on our planet might fit into a space no larger than an aspirin tablet!

Many scientists are convinced that cells containing such a complex code and such intricate chemistry could never have come into being by pure, undirected chemistry. No matter how chemicals are mixed, they do not create DNA spirals or any intelligent code whatsoever. Only DNA reproduces DNA.

Two well-known scientists calculated the odds of life forming by natural processes. They estimated that there is less than 1 chance in 10 to the 40,000 power that life could have originated by random trials. 10 to the 40,000 power is a 1 with 40,000 zeros after it! How can one gain some conception of the size of such a huge number? According to most Evolutionists, the universe is less than 30 billion years old -- and there are fewer than 10 to the 18th Power seconds in 30 billion years. So, even if nature could somehow have produced trillions of genetic code combinations every second for 30 billion years, the probabilities against producing the simplest one-celled animal by trial and error would still be inconceivably immense! In other words, probabilities greatly favor those that believe an intelligent designer was responsible for originating even the simplest DNA molecules.
