<u>Jesus fulfills the Old Testament Signs and Prophecies,</u> we should therefore not look for other extraordinary signs and wonders.

In the Gospel [Mt 11:2-11] this Third Sunday of Advent we see that John the Baptist sends his disciples to Jesus for confirmation. John wants to have certitude about Jesus, "Are you The One who is to come, or should we look for another [Mt 11:3]?" Notice that Our Lord answers not with a simple "yes" or "no", but rather with the signs He performs: "...the blind regain their sight, the lame walk, lepers are cleansed, the deaf hear, the dead are raised, and the poor have the good news proclaimed to them [Mt 11:2]". Our Lord indicates certain particular signs as fulfilling the Old Testament prophecies [Isaiah 35:5]: these were the signs that were given to Israel and ordered toward manifesting the Divine Nature of The Christ. We therefore see a distinction between signs: some are 1) ordinary and proper; others are 2) extraordinary and improper in their demands upon God.

Our Lord Himself makes this distinction between the ordinary and extraordinary signs when He chastises some Jews for seeking other (*extra*ordinary) signs rather than those ordinary signs appointed through the prophets. Jesus states: "An evil and unfaithful generation seeks a sign...", but then He adds, "...no sign will be given it except the sign of Jonah the Prophet [Mt 12:38; Mk 8:11; Lk 11:29]. In other words, The Prophets have already left the signs – the proofs – that one is to look for to recognize God's works, and The One He would send as Messiah. Therefore, as God wants us to believe in His Divine Word He grants sufficient signs through the prophets — signs through which we should believe in His words [Mt 16:1ff; Jn 2:11]. Hence: God does give signs, wonders, miracles, and prophecies, etc.; these are the 'ordinary' or 'sufficient' signs that He wants us to believe in so as to have faith and certitude. We should therefore not seek extraordinary signs which place upon God some kind of 'litmus test' for us to believe [Mk 8:12].

God holds us to the ordinary rule of faith through the ordinary signs that He establishes in His Son, Jesus. Ultimately then, God wants us to believe, not in the signs, but *through the signs* in His Word, The Son Incarnate, Jesus. We are to look beyond the exterior material signs to the *interior spiritual experience* that they are meant to convey. After all, this is why Our Lord questions the people, "What did you go out into the desert (wasteland) to see? Not signs of luxury such as fine clothing or palaces, nor the swaying reed that tells people what they want to hear according to the prevailing wind of social opinion. They went out to the desert because they knew that John was a Prophet, not only from what he said, but from how he lived. They sought out, not extraordinary things (signs), but the ordinary manifesting in a superior extraordinary manner The Ways of God.

We must see that our failure to believe, and further, our seeking after other *extra*ordinary signs, can lead to our rejection, as in the case with Jerusalem [Mt 23:37] or Capernaum, Chorazin and Bethsaida which Jesus upbraided [Mt 11:20ff]. Another prime example would be King Saul in the O.T. [I Sam 28:4-20]; he sought after illicit signs to find God, going after witches and séances in his desperation, which condemned himself before God. The question for us then is: "Are there ordinary signs in our own day through which we are called to have faith and certitude in God and in salvation?" Does a parallel exist between the Old and the New Testament signs? The answer is 'Yes'.

Just as the Jews in the days of Jesus were to have faith and certitude in God's Presence via the ordinary signs (prophecies) established through the Prophets; so we too are called to have faith and certitude through the very signs that Jesus, God The Son, has established for us to recognize and experience God's Grace and Presence in our very midst. Now the Old Testament is ordered to the New as imperfect is to perfect. Therefore, the O.T. was merely a crude material representation – a figurative foreshadowing – of what the N. T. would be. Hence, the material reality of the O.T. is now transformed into the spiritual reality of the fullness of truth and grace in our faith in Christ [Jn 1:16]. St. John of The Cross teaches:

...now that faith is founded in Christ, now that in this era of grace the law of the Gospel has been made manifest, there is no reason to enquire of God in that manner nor for Him to speak to us or answer us as He did then. For, in giving us, as he did, His Son, Who is His One and Only Word, He spoke to us once and for all, in this single Word, and he has no occasion to speak further. [The Ascent of Mount Carmel; Office of Readings; 2nd Reading, 2nd week advent, Monday] also CCC #'s 65, 66

We look now, not to the material, but to the spiritual! Therefore, God grants us the 'ordinary signs' in our day that require, not an imperfect, but a perfect Faith. What are these signs? They are the ordinary external signs of the New Testament – established by Christ Himself – whereby an interior grace is made known to us who have the superior medium of faith. Or simply: The Seven Sacraments. The classic definition is: 'an external sign of the internal reality of God's grace' (made effective in our lives).

We notice, however, that just as in the time of Christ when people rejected the ordinary signs of the Old Testament Prophets and wanted Our Lord to perform other *extra*ordinary signs to confirm that He was of God [Jn 6:30; 20:25 Mk 15:32], so too the same exists now. Many people, even Christians, have rejected the ordinary signs of God's Presence among us and have turned to seeking after their own signs for confirmation. Many have rejected The Universal Church of Christ to establish their own 'supposedly' more immediate personal relationship with Christ. But there is a problem with this.

Because the human person needs to have certitude (to be sure), we must necessarily have something material and sensible by which we experience God's purely spiritual grace. When we cannot see a thing directly, we employ signs as an extension of the thing itself to communicate the reality of the thing not seen. Once the Protestant revolt threw out the authority of The Church and Her Seven Sacraments, they divested themselves of the moral certitude of grace. Other means had to therefore be found (nature abhors a vacuum, so the vacuum had to be filled). Hence, we have today an endless string of Christian communities that claim immediate union with God, without Church, Apostles, Sacraments, or anything else material. It is proclaimed as a personal relationship with Christ. What it really is is a personal relationship with *oneself*, with one's own imagination based upon emotions; it's a reductionist method that ends in feelings, and not faith and certitude.

Just as in the time of Christ when Our Lord used the prophetic signs as *His signature*, as His evidence of the reality of God's Presence among His people, so too, we as Christians must accept the ordinary signs established by Christ as evidence of the reality of God's Presence among us today, i.e. the Seven Sacraments. *We must have faith and certitude in The Word: that the external signs of God's internal reality of grace are indeed communicating the fullness of grace in Christ to each of us.* Then, and only then can we meet Christ personally – on His terms, not our own – and experience the coming to birth of Jesus in our hearts, minds, and souls this Christmas. Then and only then can we know that He is THE ONE and we need not look for another.


