PASTOR'S PAGE

In the Gospel [Mt 3:1-12] this Second Sunday of Advent, we hear how "At that time Jerusalem, all Judea, and the whole region around the Jordan were going out to John [him] and were being baptized...". We realize that this included people who were not Jewish, for it relates in the gospel how even Roman soldiers were going out to see John The Baptist [Lk 3:14]. It is interesting to hear how John speaks to the people with such conviction about the impending judgment of The One coming after him, who "...will baptize you with The Holy Spirit and fire." In other words, for everyone there John had the same words of warning. John did not specify to the Greeks and Romans for instance, 'You must follow your pagan gods the best that you can.' John speaks the one message of the truth of God known to the Jews. If John the Baptist did this in our own day people would call him a rigid, intolerant, hate-speech promoter of fundamentalist fanatical religious violence. Of course, many would say the same of Jesus as well.

What I am getting at is that in our Western world of pluralism we have gone beyond the notion of *religious tol-erance*, to the idea now that all religions are equally true and equally valid paths to God. Very simply, we have gone from religious tolerance to *religious indifference*, *religious relativism*. We have lost the notion of the unique historical Revelation of the one truth of God known to Christians as Jesus Christ. The "politically correct" approach to religion, though popular in this culture, represents deeply erroneous thinking. For tolerance to the point of indifference to diverse religious expressions suggests that all religions are equally valid and true. People say, *"It's all the same God"*, as if to suggest that all religious paths to this God are essentially the same, when they are manifestly not.

Religions of the world do share some common beliefs and especially moral values, moral values attributed to our common human nature and the natural law given us in creation, nevertheless, there are fundamental and irreconcilable differences divide them on crucially important issues. These include the very nature of God, the source of our knowledge of God, the problem of evil, the nature of salvation, and the destiny of mankind. For instance regarding God, only three world religions affirm monotheism, others teach polytheism, pantheism, or even atheism. In Islam God is an impersonal taskmaster; in Judaism God is personal; in Christianity God is personal, Triune and incarnate; while in Hinduism and Buddhism God is a person-less – impersonal and diffuse – "force" (as in 'the force be with you').

It all gets down to the fact that not all religious truth claims can be true at the same time and in the same way (the law of non-contradiction: for example, Jesus Christ cannot both *be* God incarnate (Christianity) and *not be* God incarnate (Judaism, Islam). These are not merely contrary, but *contradictory* religious claims having diametrically opposite meanings. Therefore exactly one is true and the other false (the world would have us believe they are all false). Accordingly, Jesus Christ must either be God incarnate, or not be God incarnate; no middle position is possible. Since Jews, Christians, and Muslims all conceive the identity of Jesus of Nazareth differently, logically speaking, their conceptions simply cannot all be true. Hence, the 'way' or 'means' of different religions will bring each to a different end.

Because of modern anthropology and sociology regarding the study of comparative religions, many people have concluded *wrongly* that all religions are the same. However, the difference is not in the similarities of these world religions (which are quite few), but in the distinctions in their approach to the divine. The secularist looks at it from an erroneous analogy or example of something called "The Elephant Analogy". In this analogy, several people encounter an elephant for the first time in a pitch-black enclosure. Not being able to see, each person *feels* a different part of the animal. They then attempt to explain the truth about what they have experienced. One man pats a leg and sees the elephant as a 'living pillar'. Another person grasps the trunk and *beholds* 'a snake'. The man who rubs the tusk *believes* the elephant to be a 'sharp plow-share'. Though all these people express one important aspect of the whole reality, none of them comprehends the complete reality of the elephant. According to this analogy, one may attribute the differences among the world's religions to mankind's inability to grasp the infinite reality of God. Thus, people encounter *the same divine reality* (Allah, Yahweh, Krishna, Jesus) differently because of their differing historical, cultural, or philosophical perceptions and preconceived notions. Each religion is thus said to be equally valid because each faith provides a genuine – though obviously limited – encounter with ultimate reality. Thus the world's religions are said to represent "different 'faces' or 'masks' or personae of God, the Ultimate Reality.

In response we can say that the elephant analogy assumes a radical skepticism concerning man's knowledge of God; namely, that no one religion, can *really know* God satisfactorily. The analogy is especially flawed, however, when viewed from the standpoint of Christian Faith. According to Christianity, God has *personally* entered the world of time and space in the historical person of Jesus Christ [Jn 1:1, 14, 18]. This same Jesus makes *exclusively unique* claims to divine authority and possesses the prerogatives of God which are incompatible with the relativism of religious pluralism [Jn 8:58; 10:30]. If the analogy were to reflect historic Christianity, one would find the elephant being born from among us, healing men's blindness, raising the dead, personally introducing himself and founding a church for our salvation. For the Christian claim is that God Himself is personally, intimately, uniquely, and decisively disclosed in The Person of

Jesus Christ! For according to Jesus' own words in the New Testament, "Anyone who has seen Me has seen The Father" [Jn 14:9]. Central to the message of historic Christianity is the astounding claim that God came to Earth in the flesh and has been personally known among men [I Jn 1:1]. What this means is that only Christianity is truly extraterrestrial! That is, a physical being not of this earth has visited us.


When asked about the way or means to God Jesus said, 'I Am the way, and the truth, and the life. No one comes to The Father except through Me" [Jn 14:6]. The apostle Peter declared concerning Jesus, "Salvation is found in no one else, for there is no other Name under heaven given to men by which we must be saved" [Acts 4:12]. IT IS AN ESSENTIAL PART OF CHRISTIAN FAITH THAT **JESUS IS GOD** in a unique and exclusive way. This one teaching alone means that those who contradict it are false. It is inherently contradictory that all religions be equally true. For, if all religions are equally true, then Christianity is false in teaching the Incarnation of God in Christ, and therefore not all religions are true.

Whether one accepts it or not, the truth-claims of Christianity are historical and factual in nature. Jesus of Nazareth was born under the reign of Roman emperor, Caesar Augustus. Jesus did suffer and die at the hands of an equally real Roman governor, Pontius Pilate. The historic Christian faith consistently resists and defies all attempts to homogenize and mythologize its central truth-claims. The apostles experienced Jesus' resurrection from the dead and reported it as an historical-factual event. The apostle Peter proclaimed: "We did not follow cleverly concocted fables when we told you about the power and coming of Our Lord Jesus Christ, but we were eyewitnesses of His Majesty" [II Pet. 1:16]. According to the laws of logic and the historical veracity of Scripture, religious pluralism and relativism, no matter how popular, cannot be true.

What this means for us this Advent season is that when the time comes for us to celebrate Christmas you will know that you are commemorating and celebrating the historical event of God's coming into the world in-the-flesh, Incarnate, like us in all ways but sin, to bring about the redemption of mankind from the clutches of the devil. All the prophets preannounced Christ's coming in the Sacred Scriptures of God's Divine Revelation. Christ fulfilled these prophecies, and surpassed them with the supreme Revelation of the Paschal Mystery, whereby Jesus suffered, died, and resurrected, so to save us all from original and personal sin. This is why we celebrate Christmas with such joy, because God-is-with-us, Emmanuel. So let us continue 'To prepare the way of The Lord'!

shredded beef with red chile



PRO-LIFE STEM CELL RESEARCH FINDS SUCCESS, SEEKS SUPPORT

A Catholic medical research institute has claimed some successes in providing alternatives to research that harvest cells from human embryos--but it says such research needs more resources to complete.

"There aren't very many research organizations that we have seen that have taken a pro-life stand that we have, namely we won't either support embryonic stem cell research or participate in it," Jay Kamath, president of the lowabased John Paul II Medical Research Institute, told CNA Nov. 7. The research institute, now based in the lowa City suburb of Coralville, was founded in 2006. It has a research staff of about 12. In recent years, the institute has pioneered a new technique to create adult stem cells, and its products have helped explore treatments for at least one rare disease. The organization hopes to build on these successes and demonstrate the effectiveness of ethical stem cell research.

Stem cell research today relies on cells taken from either human <u>embryos</u> or mature tissue. Stem cells harvested from embryos have a high degree of potential because they are capable of developing into any other tissue type in the body. However, <u>they require the destruction of a human life at an early embryonic stage</u>, making them ethically immoral. In addition, these cells can show instability and have a propensity for developing tumors. Critics note that **despite** <u>significant federal funding</u>, <u>embryonic</u> <u>stem cells have failed to deliver cures for any diseases thus far.</u>

Research on adult stem cells is more limited because these cells have less capacity to develop into various types of tissue. However, this research does not destroy a human life, because it is taken from developed tissue rather than a human embryo.

The John Paul II Medical Research Institute is a 501 (c) (3) organization that was founded in 2007 by Dr. Alan Moy. It is a secular organization that is grounded in a pro-life bioethic that respects the dignity of every human life. The Institute has chosen a name honoring the late pontiff, St. Pope John Paul II, that clearly demonstrates this unwavering commitment to the culture of life. More than 300 institutes and organizations engage in and support human embryonic stem cell research. *The John Paul II Medical Research Institute advocates for medical research that recognizes the dignity of human life from the moment of conception to natural death*. Also, the Institute advocates a new paradigm in research to address deficiencies in medical research and unmet medical needs. Still, funding for embryonic stem cell research continues, Kamath said, contrary to what some people believe. The institute's website is https://www.jp2mri.org.
