PASTOR'S PAGE

In the first reading [I Samuel 26:2-23] we hear how David spares the life of King Saul, "I would not put forth my hand against The Lord's anointed...". In the Gospel of St. Luke [6:27] -38], we hear Our Lord teaching something similar, that one should "Love your enemies, do good to those who hate you...". To this is added the words about not resisting those who do evil, the proverbial "turn the other cheek". With these things in mind, it would seem to point towards Jesus being a pacifist. Is this what Sacred Scripture teaches in its fullness however? The difficulty with Jesus as a pacifist, however, goes against other passages of sacred scripture. For instance, St. Augustine reasons in a sermon: "If the Christian Religion forbade war altogether, those who sought salutary advice in the Gospel from John the Baptist would rather have been counselled to cast aside their arms, and to give up soldiering altogether. On the contrary, the soldiers were told: 'Do violence to no man . . . and be content with your pay' [Luke 3:14]. If he commanded them to be content with their pay, he did not forbid soldiering." St. Augie went on to formulate what became The Church's understanding of Just War Doctrine. It also shows in scripture how Jesus praises a centurion, rather than condemning him: "Truly, I say to you, not even in Israel have I found such faith". So, the pacifist Jesus notion is very flawed. Rather, it can be seen that "turning the other cheek", is a counsel rather than a commandment. That is, it is for those who wish to take up something extra, as opposed to something that all Christians must do; much like celibacy for the sake of the Kingdom, "Let him who is able to accept this, accept this [Mt 9:12]."

Moreover, The Catechism of The Catholic Church [#2265] teaches:

"Legitimate defense can be not only a right but a grave duty for one who is responsible for the lives of others. The defense of the common good requires that an unjust aggressor be rendered unable to cause harm. For this reason, those who legitimately hold authority also have the right to use arms to repel aggressors against the civil community entrusted to their responsibility."

We must also make the distinction between those who "take up the sword" [Mt 26:52], as opposed to those who "have recourse to the sword". To 'take the sword' is to arm oneself in order to take the life of anyone, without the command or permission of superior or lawful authority." On the other hand, to 'have recourse to the sword' by the authority of the sovereign or judge, or privately by the authority, so to speak, of God, is not to "take up the sword," but to use it for justice as commissioned by another, wherefore it does not deserve punishment, but praise. Hence, the Apostle Paul says (Rom 13:4): "He bears not the sword in vain: [for he] who is God's minister, an avenger to execute wrath upon him that doth evil".

In examining the Just War Doctrine, we see it is based upon the understanding of resistance to the unjust aggressor. Just as in civil society we need to resist those who harm our personal private good, so we also need to resist those who would do harm to the common public good of all society. But just as there are 'rules of engagement' for the civil police and private citizen, so there are for those to whom the Common Good of public society has been entrusted. Hence, the Just War Doctrine according to the *Catechism*, all these following criteria must be met *at the same time* in order for a war to be considered just:

First of all, while the criteria themselves are not open for dispute, the determination of whether a nation meets requirements for just war is a matter of *prudential judgement* (CCC 2309). Hence, faithful Catholics may sometimes legitimately disagree on whether a particular act of war is just or not.

- Competent Authority: war is declared only by those with responsibility for public order.
- Right Intention: War can only be conducted to satisfy a just cause, i.e. to confront "a real and certain danger" to protect innocent life.

- Last Resort: all peaceful alternatives have already been exhausted.
- Probability of success: the outcome cannot be disproportionate or futile. The expected damage inflicted by the aggressor on the nation must be lasting, grave, and certain.
- Proportionality: inflicted war damage must be proportionate to the good expectant; use of arms
 must not produce evils and disorders graver than the evil to be eliminated. (The power of modern means of destruction weighs very heavily in evaluating this condition).
- There must be serious prospects of success.
- Non-combatants, wounded soldiers, and prisoners must be respected and treated humanely.

We can apply these principles of just war with the Christian foundation of always seeking charity in willing the good of our neighbor, and loving God above all things. Remembering all the while that we must not happily take up violence, war, and aggression, however, "Sometimes you have to fight when you're a man".

Rescue the poor!
And deliver the needy out of the hand of the sinner Psalm 81:4
