PASTOR'S PAGE

Only when can we see Christ miraculously present in The Church in The Holy Eucharist will we be able to see Christ outside The Church, in mercy to those most in need.

In the Gospel this Sunday [Lk 4:21-30] we see how familiarity can breed contempt. That no prophet really is accepted in his own native place. While visiting His native Nazareth, Jesus refuses to work His miraculous deeds because of the lack of faith of the people there. Indeed, the people of Nazareth see the humanity of Christ, which they had experienced daily for thirty years; however, they do not see His Divinity. They see His family, Joseph, Mary, cousins and relatives, but they cannot see God in their midst. Because they don't have faith, Jesus chides them with an adage: "Physician heal thyself?" Perhaps meaning that He should heal and work wonders for His own people in Nazareth. This leads Him to relate a scriptural example to the people.

Jesus relates two stories of the prophets Elijah & Elisha. In the examples used by Our Lord, both the Widow of Zarephath [I Kings 17:7] and Naaman the Syrian [II Kings 5:1] placed their faith in the prophet's words and instructions. It was only then that they were rewarded with physical life. The main point of the stories is that these great Prophets were believed in *before* they did the miraculous for their people. Likewise, the Nazarenes should therefore place their faith in Jesus so as to gain eternal life, and then the miraculous would be done in their midst. However, they fail to believe in Him who they "know" in His lowly human nature. They cannot see with the "Eyes of Faith" beyond their prejudice of Jesus, the carpenter's son. While the people of Nazareth came to the Jewish Synagogue to pray that day, they did not really come there to meet God, and so they didn't.

In our daily life we are tempted in the same way. We wonder where God is, where is the miraculous in *our* midst? Like the Nazarenes in the Gospel we oftentimes fail to see the Divine in our midst, and hence we fail to see the miraculous. Perhaps the temptation to not see with faith comes most often when we have to sacrifice something material for the sake of seeing the spiritual. How often is it that the full Gospel message — that is, The Holy Spirit — is knocking at the door of our hearts, asking, begging, pleading, for admittance, only to be shut out by our indifference and ingratitude of the Divine Gift? Last Sunday we heard Our Lord say, "Today this scripture passage is fulfilled in your hearing." The psalmist says to us: "If today you hear the Voice of The Lord, harden not your hearts." We oftentimes take it for granted that The Lord will keep knocking, that we have plenty of time and energy to answer the Lord later in life, but not today... not now.... As we come today to our synagogue, our church, we need to see the Divinity of Christ in our midst. Jesus is present here in our church now in the tabernacle, and momentarily He will be present upon the altar, in the sacrifice that redeems us. Only when we see Christ present in the Eucharist will we then begin to see, and stop denying the miraculous in the very midst of our day.

As an example we can reflect upon Saint Mother Teresa of Calcutta. Mother Teresa could only see Christ in the poor and destitute *because she first, and foremost, saw Christ in the Holy Eucharist with the eyes of faith*. She said . . .

"The Mass is the spiritual food that sustains me — without which I could not get through one single day or hour in my life". Indeed, "The Eucharist was the spiritual hinge that united her mystical life of prayer to her daily devotion to the poor and outcast. Visitors to her home for the dying in Calcutta were often surprised that their first stop was the Eucharistic chapel. Jesus, she would tell them, was "the Master of the house" — and His Presence was the reason for her work. This was one of her most important lessons — that we, like the first Christians, should see the mysterious connection between Christ's presence under the guise of bread and wine and His presence in the poor. She said "In the Mass we have Jesus in the appearance of bread, while in the slums we see Christ and touch Him in the broken bodies, in the abandoned children". Centuries ago the people of Nazareth failed to see the true divinity of Jesus present in their synagogue because they were they could not transcend beyond His humble humanity; in turn, they failed to experience the miraculous in their midst. Let us, this day, not fail to see the divinity of Christ present before us in the greatest gift Our Lord has bequeathed upon us in this world – The Holy Eucharist – so that, with the eyes of faith, we may see the presence of Christ in those who are most in need of receiving God's mercy, which is something miraculous.

PLANNED PARENTHOOD PUSHES RADICAL SEX ED ON 13-YEAR-OLDS

America's top abortion chain is rolling out a new product meant to cut out any middleman between themselves and children searching for information and guidance about sex, contraception, and abortion: a new automated chat program to directly answer whatever questions they may have.

Roo is a "chatbot" operated by artificial intelligence and accessible via smartphones. Intended for kids between the ages of 13 and 17, it is meant to compensate for children who "don't have access to sex education or only have access to programs that teach abstinence," the *Wall Street Journal* paraphrases Planned Parenthood CEO Leana Wen as explaining.

"Roo answers all your awkward questions about sexual health, relationships, growing up, and more. Chatting with Roo is free and private, so go ahead and ask the things you don't want to ask out loud," Planned Parenthood says on its "Ask Roo" web page. Its "answers are backed by professional health educators from Planned Parenthood," and the chatbot "gets a little bit smarter every time you ask a question."

Young people will flock to the service because "they're concerned about privacy, and skeptical about anything that seems to lecture or talk down to them or sounds like parents," added Gene Liebel, a founding partner at the tech company Work & Co. that helped develop Roo.

Users can type in their own questions or choose from a selection of frequently-asked questions. Asking "What is an abortion" results in "Abortion is a legal and safe way to end a pregnancy [...] there's many reasons why someone may decide to have an abortion and only you can decide what is best for you."

"What's the right age to have sex for the first time" yields "it's all about picking the right age for you, which might be totally different than the right age for other people. It may seem like everybody you know is having sex, but that's definitely not true. The average age when people have sex for the first time is around 17." It then displays an animated graphic of the phrase "you do you."

Roo answers "When are you no longer a virgin" by claiming that while most people consider it "after the first

Roo answers "When are you no longer a virgin" by claiming that while most people consider it "after the first time they have sex," sex also "means different things to different people, so it's up to you to decide what virginity means to you."

Readiness to have sex is simply defined as a "big decision" that should be discussed "with a non-robot person you trust." In response to "How do you have sex without getting pregnant," Roo suggests various forms of birth control, but leaves out the fact that none are 100% effective.

In response to "how do I get birth control without my parents knowing," Roo says parental permission is usually unnecessary except in certain states, and that Planned Parenthood can help teens "get started on birth control." It accepts as a given that kids should bypass their parents, and makes no effort to suggest that teens at least consider discussing the matter with them. Notably, when LifeSiteNews manually typed the following queries – "when does life begin," "does human life begin at conception," "are fetuses alive," and "I heard abortion kills babies" – Roo was unable to process any of them and suggested either rephrasing the question or speaking to a live Planned Parenthood worker.
