"When the wine ran short, the mother of Jesus said to Him, "They have no wine." And Jesus said to her, "Woman, how does your concern affect Me? My hour has not yet come." His mother said to the servers, "Do whatever He tells you."" John 2:1-11

At first glance Our Lord's words to His mother in the Gospel today look somewhat severe. In His reply to His mother, Christ does not say 'Mother', or 'Mom', but "woman". Why does Jesus call His own mother "woman"? What we will find is that when we look deeper into Sacred Scripture we see the whole story of the redemption unfold for the term 'woman'.

The word 'Eve' in Hebrew (which Jesus was speaking) means 'the mother of all the living'. This is the essence of what the Woman in the Genesis story is "Mother": Eve is 'The Woman, The Mother', these are convertible terms. Our Lord calls His mother Mary "Woman" therefore, because He wishes to communicate that there is a meaningful relationship between the Virgin Mary and Eve, the first woman and spouse of Adam (man).

The reasoning for this goes deeper when we realize that Jesus calls His mother "Woman" a second time, this at the foot of the cross when He says, "Woman, behold, your son." [Jn 19:25]. It is to show that as Eve was the "Mother of all the living" in the order of nature [Gen 3:20], so the Virgin Mary was to be the "Mother of all the living" in the order of grace. Hence, just as The Woman Eve was the initiator of the disobedience, whose fruit was sin and death; so The New Woman, Mary, would be the initiator of obedience, whose fruit was grace and eternal life. The Virgin Mary is rightly seen therefore The intercessor with Her Divine Son, the One through Whom the graces of God bless humanity, for it is She who gives a human nature to God The Son in the Incarnation which ultimately leads to our salvation. In Revelation 12:1ff Mary appears again as The Woman "clothed with the sun, with the moon under her feet, and on her head a crown of twelve stars". She is the heavenly woman and guides all her children safely to heaven.

<u>The Catechism of The Catholic Church</u> CCC [#2618] says: "The Gospel reveals to us how Mary prays and intercedes in faith. At Cana, the mother of Jesus asks her son for the needs of a *wedding feast*; this is the sign of another feast - that of the wedding of the Lamb where He gives His body and blood at the request of The Church, His Bride. It is at the hour of the New Covenant, *at the foot of the cross*, that Mary is heard as the Woman, the new Eve, the true "Mother of all the living."

In this the Church looks to an understanding of Sacred Scripture interpretation called 'typology'. In The CCC [128-30] we see how Old Testament typology exists in relation to, and parallels, the New Testament realities of Christ and The Church. For instance, St. Paul says to the Romans [5:11-15] we see how "... death reigned from Adam to Moses, even over those who did not sin after the pattern of the trespass of Adam, who is the type of the one who was to come. But . . if by that one man's transgression the many died, how much more did the grace of God and the gracious gift of the one man Jesus Christ overflow for the many." Again, in his letter to the Corinthians [I 15:22] St. Paul says: "...for as all die in Adam, so all will be made alive in Christ" [I Cor 15:45-48]. And again, "Thus it is written, "The first man, Adam, became a living being"; the last Adam became a life-giving spirit. But it is not the spiritual that is first, but the physical, and then the spiritual. The first man was from the earth, a man of dust; the second man is from heaven. As was the man of dust, so are those who are of the dust; and as is the man of heaven, so are those who are of heaven. Just as we have borne the image of the man of dust, we will also bear the image of the man of heaven." We see, therefore, how the primitive Church was familiar with this 'typology' in understanding the Old Testament as illuminated in the New Testament.

It should come as no surprise too, that the early Church Fathers accepted this typology of St. Paul and built upon it. Hence, in his Dialogue with Trypho [Chpt 100] St. Justin Martyr states: "For Eve, who was a virgin and undefiled, having conceived the word of the serpent, brought forth disobedience and death. But the Virgin Mary received faith and joy, when the angel Gabriel announced the good tidings to her that the Spirit of the Lord would come upon her, and the power of the Highest would overshadow her..." Other Church Fathers and Saints also concurred with this typology of Mary and Eve: Tertullian, St. Jerome, and St. Irenaeus to mention just a few. For this reason we see why the CCC [#511] explains the same in Her Faith: "The Virgin Mary "cooperated through free faith and obedience in human salvation" (LG 56). She uttered her yes "in the name of all human nature" (St. Thomas, ST III, 30, 1). By her obedience she became the new Eve, mother of the living". Cf Cardinal John Henry Newman's work Mary The Second Eve. Pope Paul VI teaches this same when he says: "We believe that the Holy Mother of God, the new Eve, Mother of the Church, continues in heaven to exercise her maternal role on behalf of the members of Christ" [#975] (Pope Paul VI, CPG § 15).

The old **man** Adam is replaced by the new man Christ. The **virgin "Woman"** Eve is replaced with the virgin "Woman" Mary. The first **paradise** was the earthly Eden, the second is the spiritual heaven. The **wood of the tree** of knowledge is replaced by the wood of the tree of the cross. The **messenger** Satan is replaced with the messenger Gabriel. The evil **word** of temptation is replaced with the good **Word** of the Annunciation. The first **woman's intercession** at temptation is to sin, the second woman's intercession at Cana is to grace. The **fruits** of the first tree are eternal death, the second is eternal life. The disobedience to **the Will of God**, is replaced by perfect obedience to the Will of God. The first family's progeny (Able) cries for vengeance, the second family's (The Church) progeny (St. Stephen) cries for forgiveness. The title of "**Mother of All the Living**" in the order of nature is given to Eve at the beginning of Paradise Lost, whereas the title of "Mother of All the Living" in the order of grace is given to Mary at the beginning of Paradise Regained.

Sanctity of Human Life Sunday - Open Houses

Sanctity of Human Life Day falls on Sunday, January 20th in 2019. This marks the 46th anniversary of the Roe v. Wade and Doe v. Bolton Supreme Court decisions which legalized abortion in all nine months of pregnancy and throughout all 50 states, so long as the mother's health is in jeopardy—including emotional stress from pregnancy. Beginning in 1984, President Ronald Reagan designated Sanctity of Human Life Day to be the third Sunday in January or closest representing the original January 22, 1973 date of the ruling. Reagan's successor, George H. W. Bush, continued the annual proclamation throughout his presidency. Bush's successor, Bill Clinton, discontinued the practice, but Bush's son and Clinton's successor, George W. Bush, resumed the proclamation. The proclamation was again discontinued in 2010 under Barack Obama but Donald Trump recognized the day at the onset of his presidency. The pro-life community continues to set this day aside each year since it's inception to pray for an end to abortion. Pregnancy Care Clinic offers pro-life material to community churches to assist in their remembrance of this day.
