




Morning Offering of Sacrifice

PASTOR'S PAGE

In the Gospel of St. Luke [11:1-13] we hear Our Lord teaching us about prayer. Indeed, prayer is necessary for salvation; it is a distinct precept of Christ in the Gospels, as Our Lord says "when you pray..." [Mt 6:5ff], not 'if you pray...'. He also adds "Pray for your enemies..." [Mt 5:44]; and many others [Mt 18:19; 21:13; 24:20; Jn 16:23; Col 4:2; Rom 12:12; I Pet 4:7]. Following in this line The Church encourages us to pray. The precept of prayer asks only the least on our part of what is really necessary as a means of salvation. This necessity flows from the fact that without prayer we cannot resist temptation [Mt 26:41], nor be disposed toward receiving additional grace [II Thes 1:11], nor grow and persevere in grace [Lk 21:36]. This necessity to pray is incumbent on all persons (not just Christians) according to their different states in life. The obligation to pray requires a disposition towards prayer itself, that is, a habit of communion with God. In this spirit Our Lord asks "...that we ought always to pray, and not to faint" (Lk18:1). Prayer is especially pressing when we are in great need of divine assistance, when without it we cannot overcome some obstacle or perform some obligation; when, to fulfill various obligations of charity we should pray for others; and when it is specially implied in some obligation imposed by Christ and His Church, such as attendance at Mass on Sundays and feast-days. This is true of vocal prayer, and as regards mental prayer, or meditation, this, too, is necessary so far as we need to apply our mind to divine things in order to acquire knowledge of the truths necessary for salvation. Yet, with all this in mind, we still see that most people who say they believe in God do not pray formally, that is, they do not worship God in an assembly of believers. Indeed, they probably never pray as individuals either. Many reasons and excuses are given for this failure to pray and worship God in an assembly, chief among them is the idea that "I can pray on my own privately." But can we?

The problem with this 'private prayer' approach is that it is simply not Christian. If we are Christian, we are called to be 'like Christ'. Our Lord was accustomed to going to the synagogue on the Sabbath, as St. Luke's Gospel says: "He came to Nazareth, where he had grown up, and went according to his custom into the synagogue on the Sabbath day [4:16]." Moreover, Jesus begins His teaching ministry in the synagogue [Mt 4:23; 9:35; 12:9; 13:54; Mk 6:2]. As recorded in Sacred Scripture Our Lord instituted a Church of His Own, that is, an assembly of believers centered around His Twelve Apostles [Mt 16:18ff]. He further speaks of this Church as having authority, "If a man [he] refuses to listen to them, tell The church. If he refuses to listen even to The church, then treat him as you would a Gentile or a tax collector" [Mt 18:17]. Finally, Our Lord commands His Apostles to make disciples of all nations so that, through The Church all men could be saved [Mt 28:19]. Following Our Lord, the early Christians gathered in prayer – as an official Church – around The Eleven Apostles, as it is recorded in the Acts: "They devoted themselves to the teaching of the apostles and to the communal life, to the breaking of the bread, and to the prayers" [2:42, 46; 20:7].

The Church asks nothing new for Christians to follow when it teaches of an obligation to "go to Church" to pray. This simply follows upon the precepts of the natural law, the Ten Commandments [Exodus 20]. Any honest, thinking person can understand this. If a person knows that there is a God, then three things follow necessarily from that. One, there is a God and I am not Him (1st Commandment). Second, that everything comes from God, including myself and all that I possess and so I should hold God in reverence, especially His name (2nd Commandment). Therefore (thirdly), that because all things come from God as a gift I should probably make a return to God for His gifts, namely prayer of thanksgiving (3rd Commandment). How often should I thank God for His gifts? Once a year? Once a month? Perhaps once a week? Many people say they don't have the time every week. But consider this: God grants us twenty-four hours each day, seven days a week, which is a total of one hundred and sixty-eight hours a week. And God asks only one hour back! Are we really that busy? And if we are that busy, can we really say that we love God above all things with our whole heart, mind, body, soul, and strength [Mt 22:37]?

Beyond the basic Natural Law we should know that The Church which offers us the fullness of God's Divine Revelation does offer something new and unique in its worship: The Most Holy Eucharist. In the Gospel today Our Lord teaches us how to pray *simply*; but in His last Hour He went further in commanding that we worship Our Father through sacrifice by celebrating His Memorial in the Most Holy Eucharist when He said, "This is My Body. Do THIS in remembrance of Me." That is, we must DO THIS and not something else; we must pray and worship God as He reveals that we should, in spirit and in truth, in an assembly of believers ('church' literally means assembly). "For the hour is coming, and is now here, when true worshipers will worship The Father in Spirit and in truth; and indeed The Father seeks such people to worship Him. God is Spirit, and those who worship Him must worship Him in Spirit and in truth [Jn 4:23]."

God, Our Heavenly Father, is seeking people to worship Him in Spirit and in truth in the Holy Eucharist. Can you answer God's call?



How America's largest union is destroying our country...

July 16, 2019 (<u>LifeSiteNews</u>) – The largest union in the country, the National Education Association, hates America, hates God and hates children. And they are making it official.... The NEA apparently wants America to go down and they are doing their best to help that process along. Among the <u>actions taken at the NEA 2019 Representative Assembly are these new business items:</u>

- 1. Explicit defense of the "fundamental right to abortion under Roe v. Wade" as well as for "youth" to "control their own body" (NBI 56). So either killing or sexualizing children is now official NEA policy.
- 2. NEA opposes the "criminalization of border crossings," no wall, and the immediate shutdown of detention centers, which NEA agrees are "concentration camps." (NBI 37)
- 3. The union calls for "...the immediate end to the detention and criminalization of immigrant children and their families, including an end to ICE raids" and accuses the Trump administration of human rights abuses at the border.
- 4. Racial politics on parade. "Using existing resources, NEA will incorporate the concept of 'White Fragility' into NEA trainings/staff development, literature, and other existing communications on social, gender, LGBTQIA, and racial justice ... "What?
- 5. Passing the "Equality Act" is a top priority and union will work with the radical Human Rights Campaign on this.
- 6. Will support Black Lives Matter's "Week of Action" in schools during Black History Month. BLM promotes unjustified, inaccurate opposition to police and law enforcement.
- 7. Plans to collaborate and partner with those pushing for reparations for African-Americans.
- 8. Will conduct "professional development" training for homosexual club advisers in conjunction with "current partner GLSEN" and others, including how to "handle possible backlash from different stakeholders." Like parents who don't want their child to join a school club promoting sexual immorality?
- 9. NEA will develop model state legislation to mandate an "LGBTQ"-inclusive K through 12 curriculum i.e., forcing schools to subject students to homosexuality and gender rebellion throughout the school day in many classes. (Disregarding the many families who don't agree.)
- 10. In a stand against "linguistic oppression," NEA will "call on educators to refrain from discouraging or explicitly telling students to not speak a language other than English at school."
- 11. At future national conventions, NEA will create space on nametags for designating pronouns and ensure there are more gender neutral restrooms.
- 12. NEA wants a 100 percent student loan forgiveness plan and wants congressional hearings on this.
- 13. Will create a "Stonewall LGBTQ" grad school scholarship for a student who identifies with any of these immoral behaviors and studies this propaganda.
