Next weekend, July 13-14, Queen of Angels will welcome a Missionary speaker from the Uyo Diocese in the state of Akwa Ibom in South Nigeria. Uyo diocese is blessed with over a hundred priests and many religious. Priests of Uyo origin, except for two parishes, manned by the Capucins and Vincentians respectively operate all the parishes. The diocese has over seventy senior seminarians aspiring to become priests.

The diocese is however having problems harnessing her abundant resources because of the harsh economic climate in the country. Many of the parishes are made up of many churches with a parish headquarter in one of the churches. Rectories are built in the parish headquarters to host the priests and provide office space for the priest and the staff. For effective running of the churches, priests have Catechists in these church communities as volunteers with no adequate remuneration for their services.

Uyo Diocese participates fully in provision of healthcare to the local communities through establishment of Hospitals and clinics. She tries to reach out to the local people and to provide for the medical and sometimes material needs. In addition to obligations towards healthcare, Uyo is also has the burden of carrying out on going education for seminarians, and Catechists because of the economic climate in Nigeia.

A few years ago, the state government returned some schools to the diocese after many years of forceful possession. In effort to provide Catholic education, the diocese employs and sends teachers to these schools. The cost of employing and retaining these teachers rests solely the diocese. Hence, they seek our assistance as they try to preach the gospel through acts of kindness. Our help will go a long way to support this diocese as they try their best to provide for the needs of their people and others. Please be as generous as able.

PENANCE: MEDICINE FOR THE SOUL

“Repentance was perhaps best defined by a small girl: ‘It’s to be sorry enough to quit.’”

C.H. Kilmer

If we are forgiven our sins in confession, why do we have to do a penance? Is penance a form of punishment for sin?

Actually, penance is not punishment but the way in which we become “sorry enough to quit.” *Interior penance* is a conversion of heart toward God and away from sin. Our intention to have our “insides” change implies change because of our hope in God’s mercy. Our actions (*external penance*) reflect and strengthen our intention to turn away from sin trusting in the power of the Lord’s grace and love.

Penance comes in many different forms: prayers, good works, self-denial and almsgiving. Some forms of penance may last a long time (40 days of Lent), while others may be more intense. Penance may be voluntary or Church law might require it (fasting on Ash Wednesday and Good Friday). Penance may seem like punishment, especially since we most often receive a formal penance after confessing our sins. Seeing penance as punishment for sin is like saying that medicine is punishment for disease. Medicine offers a cure, relief from illness and hope of healing. It can also promote well-being and prevention of disease. The same can be said of penance.

When we sin, we turn from God, choosing to act in some way contrary to God’s law and God’s love. Sin always has an impact on us, on others, and on our relationship with God. As members of the Church, our own personal holiness - or lack of it - contributes to the overall holiness of the Church. When we sin, the Church feels the lack of unity and wholeness that grace can bring. Penance is a way of remedying the hurt and loss that our sin causes. We make reparation and resolve not to sin again.

In fact, the formal term for the penance we receive in the Sacrament of Reconciliation is **reparation** or **satisfaction**. Following our contrition and confession of our sins, and proceeding the prayer of absolution by the priest we celebrate God’s forgiveness and our reconciliation with God and his Church.

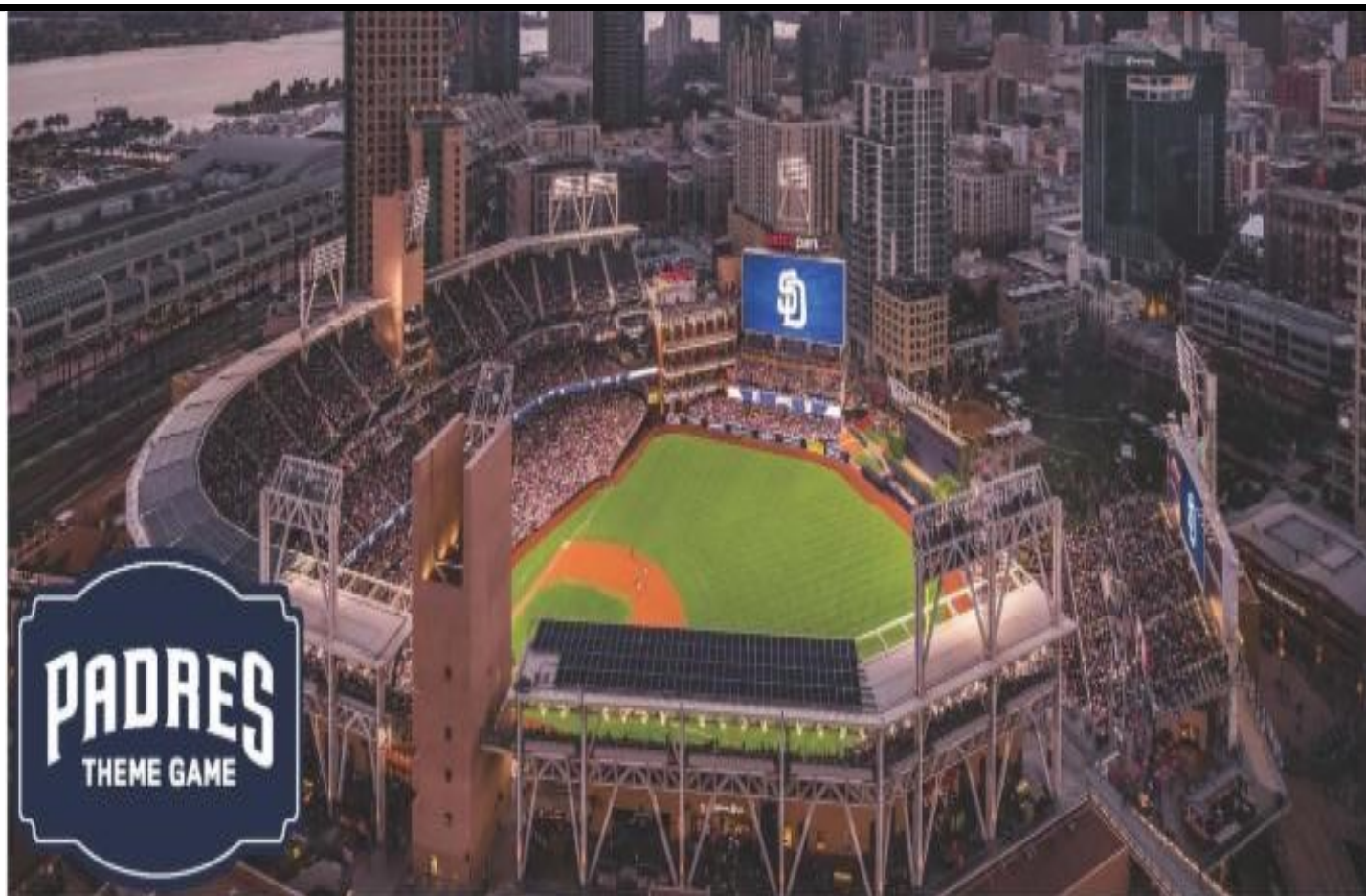
Through self-discipline, prayer and good intention, we re-focus on our faith, renew our relationship with God, self and with each other. Far from a punishment, penance is a way to receive forgiveness, extend mercy and healing, and restore grace. It also strengthens us to avoid sin by developing the habits and virtues that lead us closer to God.
