Friends,

While I understand that we have not even gotten to Lent, let alone Easter, one of my favorite parts of the Easter Vigil Mass is how we are able to walk through the story of salvation history revealed in and foreshadowed by seven Old Testament readings before we even get to the crucifixion and resurrection of Jesus. However, because of the nature (and, to be perfectly honest, the length) of the Easter Vigil, it is difficult to justify taking longer to teach and contemplate this beautiful unfolding of salvation history and the prophecies that were given to humanity to prepare us for the coming of the Messiah and his sacrifice. To that end, over the course of the next seven Sundays, I want to look at each of the Easter Vigil OT readings in turn, so that, throughout the forty days of Lent, we can contemplate God's plan to save us in the Paschal Mystery of Jesus Christ.

OT Reading I – Genesis 1:1-2:2

There are honestly too many things to talk about in the Genesis account of creation, but for our purposes today, specifically as we are paying attention to the history of salvation, it is important for us to hone in on the end of the reading, which actually reveals two very important details that will impact everything else that comes after.

The first detail is found in Gen 1:26-27. Then God said, "Let us make man in our image, after our likeness; and let them have dominion over the fish of the sea, and over the birds of the air, and over the cattle, and over all the earth, and over every creeping thing that creeps upon the earth." So God created man in his own image, in the image of God he created him; male and female he created them. Within the context of creation, this reveals that God creates humanity as the crown, and we might also say the ruler or steward, of creation. It is only before he creates humanity that we get to hear God's inner dialogue, and it is only humanity that God pronounces to be made in his own image and likeness. This has a big impact on our story, since when man sins in Gen 3, all of creation – which is under his dominion – falls with him. It also gives us a hint as to why God never gives up on us, because we are made in his own image and likeness. The rest of Sacred Scripture is the unfolding of this story, namely, that of the Heavenly Father who will go to any length to save his lost children.

The second detail is found in Gen 2:2. And on the seventh day God finished his work which he had done, and he rested on the seventh day from all his work which he had done. Already in the beginning of the story, we are introduced to the Lord's covenant rest, which will become the foundation of both the Sabbath and the Jubilee. It is also covenantal language, which serves to remind us, among other things, that we need to rest in the Lord. Why? Because as important as all of our work is – and it is important – it is not anything we do that allows us to enter into God's family, which is to say that it is not anything we do that saves us. From the beginning, even before the fall of humanity, God is already telling us that we need him if we want to enter into his covenant rest – a covenant rest that will finally be fulfilled in his own Son.


