**The Objective Content of the Gospel is a Higher Form
that Man Must Receive and Cultivate**

The Gospel [Jn 10:27-30] begins this Sunday with Jesus saying that His sheep hear His voice. Our Lord is drawing upon the Old Testament imagery of God as The Shepherd over the sheep of His flock, Israel [Psalms 74; 79; Ezk 34ff]. Jesus tells us directly, "*I Am The Good Shepherd. The Good Shepherd lays down His life for the sheep*" [Jn 10:11], thus the reason also for Him adding "*My sheep hear My voice.*" [Jn 10:27-30]. We are His sheep when we follow His Voice!

In ancient Palestine shepherds were poor men. The shepherds did not have fences, but would lead their flocks out during the day and gather them at night into the sheepfold; they would gather them by calling out with their voice. The sheep were *attuned* to the voice of their particular shepherd and would follow after him [Jn 5:25, 28; 10:3, 16]. The sheep had to acquire an ear to listening to their shepherd's voice. It was usually the younger sheep, or lambs, which would not listen to the shepherd's voice – not having their ears attuned to it – so that they had to be sought after and carried back to the fold. The parallel of the sheep and shepherd is therefore a good one, it helps us to see that we must listen and truly hear the voice of The Good Shepherd.

So the question is, 'Do I hear His Voice?' That is 'Do I listen attentively to God speaking to me through His Apostolic Church?' It is indeed the Apostolic Church of Christ that speaks to us and cares for us until "*the Chief Shepherd is revealed. . .*" and we "*. . . will receive the unfading crown of glory*", as St. Peter says [1 Peter 5:2-4 Acts 20:28]. Thus we must not merely hear, but truly listen to - and be informed with - the Voice of Christ [Jn 8:47; 12:47; 18:37].

But there is a difference between merely hearing and truly listening. This is based upon principles both, subjective on our part (that is, hearing without listening); and, objective (that is, listening without hearing) on the part of the content or "what" we hear. Subjectively, the human person must open their ears *and their minds*. That is, they must not only be *able* to hear a thing physically with their ears, but they must also be *willing* - at one and the same time - to listen with their hearts, their minds, and their will. They must have open ears *and open hearts*. Subjectively then, the human person must be a willing and perceptive listener. A '*comprehender*', as St. Thomas would say. You can also say 'docile'.

However, there is also the objective content of what we are listening to. What if a person listens attentively but is unable - not unwilling *but unable* - to hear something of objectively intelligible value, for ex. some people live in a totalitarian closed society (communism). The human person must therefore have something beyond a mere willingness on their part; they must also have *something of objectively perceptive value to hear*. In order for us to understand, to know, there must be something which is objectively understandable, intelligible, and rational for the mind to 'consume' and 'digest' in a logical fashion because this is how we know by nature. If we do not receive something objectively and of really essential, substantial value for our abilities and desires we basically say, "Where's the beef?" What is the value of listening to this? We become frustrated. Simply, we recognize that *in addition to our hunger and thirst for righteousness, we must have real righteousness, real truth!* We must receive that which is good, true, and beautiful, to be naturally satisfied in our highest powers of intellect and will for this is what makes us fully human (rational animal with a free will).

For example, the music of Mozart is inherently better suited to the intellect and will and therefore the emotions of man. I can say '*inherently*' because this is natural to man. Nature is that *interior principle of motion and rest*. Mozart gently raises the emotional level and then lays the emotions gently to rest through an inherent intelligibility. Actual studies show that babies and children who listen to Mozart develop higher brain capacities for thinking. Rap and rock music, on the other hand, is usually ponding and thumping that violently excites the emotional level and then drops one to the ground. Rap is usually obscene nursery rhymes set to what is called rhythm.

Becoming attuned to the voice of the Good Shepherd is much like developing appreciation of music, or any other artistic, cultivated higher form of the civilized life of the intellect. One begins as desiring a lower quality of music, simple and greatly repetitive in beat (99 bottles of beer on the wall...); but as one is introduced to the elements of pitch, tone, balance, key, harmony, etc., one begins to appreciate the objectively better music of the classical orchestra and trained voice. One must be introduced to something higher by being exposed to it again and again by a teacher who orders learning to create a true wisdom. Gradually an appreciation is born towards a higher form (think: *information*). And so the words of Christ: Jesus *gradually* opens us up to the higher forms of things of the innermost nature of the Godhead. Jesus reveals Himself as God, saying: "*The Father and I are One*". The higher forms (knowledge of God) are not given immediately but gradually - *humanely* - so that those who are docile listeners can learn, but *only* those who are docile and humble. Our Lord knows we cannot bear it all at once and therefore He teaches His flock, leading them gently: "*I have yet many things to say to you, but you cannot bear them now. When the Spirit of truth comes, he will guide you into all the truth*" [Jn 16:12].

So in the Gospel today, when our Lord says, "*My sheep hear My voice . . . and I give them eternal life, and they shall never perish*". He is stating that *there is an objective salvific truth to what He is informing us!* A truth that is valued at nothing less than eternal life with God in heaven! Our Lord made an allusion to this objective principle of hearing something of great value. He said to His disciples, ". . . *blessed are your eyes, because they see, and your ears, because they hear. Amen, I say to you, many prophets and righteous people longed to see what you see but did not see it, and to hear what you hear but did not hear it* [Mt 13:16]. We recognize therefore we need both to listen willing, and to have the objective truth presented to us; the lack of either subjective or objective hearing/listening will usually lead to failure to obtain eternal life. So truly we can understand Jesus when He says: "*My sheep hear My voice . . . and follow Me...*" Some of the hundreds of benefits of the Mozart Effect' are:

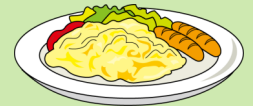
