
Queen of Angels Siving Tree November 30 – December 20

PASTOR'S PAGE

We Must Enter into the Kingdom of God in Mind and in Heart Before We Enter in Body and in Deed.

In the expression 'Kingdom of God' the innermost teaching of the Old Testament is summed up. The Jewish People understood the Land of Israel to be the kingdom of *their* God on earth; and in the fullness of time the Messiah would come and make *their* Kingdom of God *THE* Kingdom of God for the entire world! God's Kingdom was the Kingdom of *Heaven*. Indeed, St. Matthew's preference for the expression "kingdom of heaven", as being more familiar to the Hebrews for whom he wrote, is explained by this tendency in the Old Testament.

It should be noted, however, that the Hebrew word for "kingdom", melkuw, means ruling as well as a specified place; thus it signifies not so much the actual kingdom, as it does the Will of the King – [cf. Dan 4:28-29]. The Greek word for "king" of the New Testament, basileia, also has these two meanings. In The Book of Wisdom we find the most perfect realization of what was truly implied by this "rule" or kingdom of God, it says: "She [Wisdom] led the just man through direct paths and showed him the kingdom of God", i.e. in what that interior kingdom

[Wisdom] led the just man through direct paths and showed him the kingdom of <u>God</u>", i.e. in what that interior kingdom consisted. It should come as no surprise, therefore, that in the mouth of Christ the "kingdom" means primarily not a goal to be attained or a place – though those meanings are by no means excluded [cf. Mt 5:3; 9:2, etc.] – it is rather a tone of mind (Lk, 17: 20-21). It stands for an influence which must permeate men's minds if they would be one with Him and attain to His ideals [cf. Luke 9:55]. Thus, St. Paul: "Make your own the mind of Christ Jesus" [Philp 2:5; I Cor 2:16].

What this means then is that before one can enter into the Kingdom of God in a physical and material sense, he must first enter into the Kingdom of God *internally*, willfully, spiritually. So when asked by the Pharisees when the kingdom of God would actually come, Our Lord can reply, "The coming of the kingdom of God cannot be observed, and no one will announce, 'Look, here it is,' or, 'There it is.' For behold, the kingdom of God is within you [Lk 17:20]". For this reason Jesus also speaks of "The Mystery" (mysterious nature) of the kingdom of God [Mk 4:11]. To the wise scribe who acknowledges the greatest Commandment of love, our Lord can say, "You are not far from the kingdom of God [12:34]."

The understanding of an interior rule or order of the mind as being obtained before one can possess the external rule or order follows from the nature of man as being a rational animal. Namely, anything that the mind takes in through the senses will ultimately come out into worldly action through the physical body. In reality, our actions begin with previous actions or words that we have experienced in the physical world: and from there they enter into our mind: from our mind they enter into our actions.

When someone acts in a certain strange way we ask where in the (physical) world he got the idea from. When a little child uses bad language, we ask 'where has he been?' and 'who has he been with?' It's that darn Eddie Haskell! (Leave it to Beaver). So, although we all know that ideas are more deadly than poison, and the pen is mightier than the sword, nevertheless, bad example is worse than either. Following from this we know that if we want to 'change our mind', which is what the New Testament word *metanoia* "conversion" literally means, we must first change our actions or environment. We cannot remain in the presence of certain persons, places, or things when we want to change our actions regarding these same. For example, if we want to change our mind and actions about a certain habit -- or even addiction -- that we may have, we know that we must avoid those persons, places, and things that put us into close proximity to these (near occasions), otherwise we will fail. "Deliver us not into temptation', so we pray.

It is for this reason that in the New Testament when the coming of the kingdom of God is announced it is united to the understanding that one should change their actions so as to be able to enter into the Kingdom. "Do penance: for the kingdom of heaven is at hand", said John the Baptist; and Christ's opening words to the people repeat that message: Repent and believe in the Gospel! Perhaps this rending and tearing away from sinful actions is the "violence" that Jesus speaks about when He says in the Gospel of Luke [16:16] "... from [now] on The Kingdom of God is proclaimed, and everyone who enters does so with violence". Sometimes putting on the mind of Christ means doing what we may consider to be violence to ourselves. Indeed, penance is a certain kind of violence to self – a self-denial of basics, not luxuries. It hurts. In fact, it kills, that is why it is called 'mortification' [Col 3:5].

In conclusion then, if we wish to enter bodily into the physical kingdom of God (in heaven) on the Day of The Resurrection, we must first enter spiritually into the interior and spiritual kingdom of God whereby we become subjects of His Divine Majesty here, in thought, so as to affect our words and our deeds. Only then can we truly enter the Kingdom of God. In the second petition of the "Our Father" – "*Thy kingdom come*" – we follow with the words "*Thy Will be done on earth ...* (that is here and now). In other words, we pray for interior grace now as well as for external glory later. In fact, St. Thomas Aquinas taught that grace *is* glory: because grace humbly received necessarily leads to the glory of heaven that we hope to obtain through God's favor.

The Kingdom of God/Heaven means, then, the reign of <u>God</u> in our hearts! It means those principles which separate us from the kingdom of this world and the <u>devil</u> [Mt 4:8]. It means the benign sway of grace; it means The Church as that divine institution by which we have moral certitude of attaining the Spirit of Christ so to win that ultimate kingdom of <u>God</u> Where He reigns without end *"the holy city, the New Jerusalem"* [Rev 21:2]. Therefore, as the Gospel proclaims, Christ's coming is both imminent and immanent, that is, both very soon (imminent) and very interior (immanent). For The Kingdom of God is *within* you.



THE EVIL 'PLANNED PARENTHOOD' PROMOTES ABORTION ONLINE

Planned Parenthood is already the largest abortion provider in the U.S., and its new web tool aims to direct more women to its abortion clinics.

The "Abortion Care Finder" tool, located on the abortion provider's website, shows the nearest Planned Parenthood abortion clinics who are able to perform legal abortions based on the user's self-reported age, ZIP code, and last menstrual cycle.

It then shows users the nearest Planned Parenthood clinics, explains any relevant state laws and abortion methods, and describes the services of each clinic and provides information about financial assistance, the New York Times reports.

Planned Parenthood is the largest provider of abortions in the United States. In 2016, the organization performed about one out of every three abortions that year.

In cases where the nearest Planned Parenthood is more than 60 miles away, the web tool refers users to a map from the National Abortion Federation.

The Planned Parenthood app results can be misleading in states like Kentucky or Mississippi, whose abortion clinics are not Planned Parenthood-operated.

Alexis McGill Johnson, Planned Parenthood's acting president, told the New York Times that Planned Parenthood "wanted to make sure that we were connecting them directly to our centers."

In the past decade, Planned Parenthood has seen its number of patients decline. The number of cancer screenings, contraceptives distributed, and prenatal services provided by the organization decreased as well. The number of abortions, however, has increased by about 10 percent since 2006, despite Planned Parenthood seeing fewer patients.

Girl Basketball Star Traded Success Playing Hoops for a Solitary Life of Prayer

Shelly Pennefather led the Bishop Machebeuf High School girls' basketball team to victory in every game she played in. It was not surprising to her friends and classmates that she would go on to play college ball for Villanova and then play professionally in Japan. It was not even surprising that she would have a religious vocation.

What was surprising was the order she chose. In 1991, Shelly Pennefather drove to Alexandria, Va., where she entered the Monastery of the Poor Clares. She would become a cloistered nun, living a radical life that included going barefoot out of penance and poverty and praying all of the hours of the Divine Office, even at 12:30 a.m.

'I was shocked that she chose a cloistered order," said Annie Mcbournie, graduate of Machebeuf in 1984 and a friend of Pennefather's. 'I was not at all shocked that she chose a vocation."

Her story was recently featured on ESPN, who recounted how Pennefather gave up being the highest-paid women's basketball player in the world in 1991 to live a life in service to the Lord as a Poor Clare.

Pennefather took the name Sister Rose Marie of the Queen of Angels. This past June, Sister Rose Marie celebrated her 25th anniversary of her solemn profession: the long-awaited moment to greet her family from outside the screen, not to happen again for another 25 years. Villanova teammates, friends, Machebeuf classmates, and family were all in attendance.

Why? Why on God's earth would a basketball star of this magnitude just walk away from the game and the fame, or go from being one of the world's highest paid women's basketball players to taking a vow of perpetual poverty? Why would an attractive, funny, vivacious 25-year-old woman renounce marriage and family to lock herself up in a monastery? Why would a loving daughter and sister embrace a religious discipline wherein she could only see her family — through a screen —a few times a year, and hug them only once every 25 years? Why would anybody voluntarily live a life in which they could own nothing, sleep no more than four hours at a time (on a straw mat), eat no more than one full meal a day, and use telephones, TV, radio, internet and newspapers — well, never?

It all boils down to this: We're all going to die. And when we do, all of the money and the prestige and the accomplishments and the basketball awards are going to fall away. All that will be left is us and God. If we play our cards right, we will spend eternity beholding his face and praising him. And, as St. Augustine says, that is where our truest happiness lies — in this life as well as in the next: "Our hearts were made for Thee, O Lord, and will not rest until they rest in Thee."

Cloistered sisters like the Poor Clares make the radical choice to live that way now — to begin their eternal life here on earth. As religious sisters, they are brides of Christ, and they focus their lives entirely on their bridegroom, without the distractions of all the stuff that's going to fall away after death anyway. They spend their lives primarily in prayer — praying for you and for me and for this entire mixed up world and in deepening their own relationship with Christ.
