### **PASTOR'S PAGE**

Christ extends salvation to the gentiles [pagans] by breaking down the dividing wall of ceremonial and judicial precepts, fulfilling the moral law through a living faith that justifies the sinner.

The readings this Sunday center upon the whole understanding of Psalm 98: "The Lord has revealed to the nations His saving power". That is, God in Christ Jesus extends salvation beyond the Jews to the pagans (gentiles) through a living faith. The qualifier for salvation was to be transferred from the slavish obedience to The Old Law, to the 'Obedience of Faith' in Christ [Rom 1:5; 6:16; 16:26], so that all those who had a living faith would be saved. It was particularly the mark of the Messiah that when he would come he would bring the nations together in worship of the One God of Israel. This was not going to take place – as the Jews thought – through converting all pagans to Judaism and temple worship of animal sacrifices in Jerusalem. Rather, the New Israel, The Apostolic Church, would extend the salvation of Christ to all the nations so that worship would take place everywhere by everyone, not just in Jerusalem. Thus the prophecy of Malachi [1:10-11] that, "... everywhere they bring sacrifice to My Name, and a pure offering; for great is My Name among the nations, says The LORD of Hosts."



There is a foreshadowing of this salvation to the nations in the first reading (II Kings 5:14-17) when we hear that the pagan foreigner Naaman, after having been cured of his leprosy, takes soil from the land of Israel in order to, as he says "...no longer offer holocaust or sacrifice to any other god except to The LORD." So too in the Gospel [Lk17:11-19] Our Lord cures the ten lepers, but only the pagan foreigner returns to give thanks whereupon Christ assures salvation to this non-Jewish Samaritan. In many other instances Our Lord makes it clear that salvation was to be extended to other nations through Him [Lk 4:25; Mt 15:22; Lk 10:30].

How did God empower all peoples – not just Jews – to approach His sacrificial altar? How was this to take place? God would extend His law into the hearts of all men [Jer 31:33; Rom 2:14-15]. The Messiah came not to abolish the Law but to fulfill it [Mt 5:17]. The fulfillment of this law, however, would abolish the non-necessary precepts, the 613 *Mitzvoth* ordinances that had bound the Jews, making them unable to share the Torah or Law of God with others. It was these over abounding number of ceremonial and judicial precepts that kept Jew and Gentile (pagan) apart, which is described by St. Paul as a "dividing wall". Christ was the 'bridge builder' (Latin, Pontifex), Who united the two, Jew and gentile, through His cross. As St. Paul says: "For He [Christ] is our peace. He Who made both (Jews & pagans) one and broke down the dividing wall of enmity, through His flesh, abolishing the law with its commandments and legal claims, that He might create in Himself one new man in place of the two, thus establishing peace, and might reconcile both with God, in one body, through the cross, putting that enmity to death by it [Eph 2:11-18]."

St. Paul does not mean to say that the 10 Commandments of the moral law would be abolished; rather, the moral law would be made possible for all to live through the grace of Christ. As the CCC teaches: "Christ gives the strength to live according to the "new life" (1697). He fulfills in us what He has commanded for our benefit (cf.2074)". Hence, within the Old Law of Israel we distinguish three kinds of precepts. Wherefore the Apostle (Rom 7:12) after saying that the "Law is holy," adds that, "the commandment is just, and holy, and good": "just," in respect of the judicial precepts; "holy", with regard to the ceremonial precepts (since the word sanctus - holy - means consecrated to God); and "good", i.e. conducive to virtue, as to the moral precepts. Hence, two of the three precepts pass away and one is fulfilled, thus we have . .

- 1. *Moral precepts*, which are dictated by the natural law (The 10 Commandments);
- 2. Ceremonial precepts, which are determinations of the Divine worship (i.e. things liturgical like animal sacrifices, purificatory washings); and

*Judicial precepts*, which are determinations of the general precepts of justice to be maintained among men. (Circumcision, dietary (Kosher foods) stoning the sinner, ostracizing the leper).

The Old Jewish Law stood for a certain part of ancient history to hold the Jews "in custody", so to speak, so that they would be restrained from the worship of false gods and serve the Living God of Divine Revelation. Thus St. Paul tells the Christians at Galatia, "... we were confined under The Law, kept under restraint until faith should be revealed. So that The Law was our custodian until Christ came, that we might be justified by faith. But now that faith has come, we are no longer under a custodian..." [Ga 3:23–25].

By abolishing the ceremonial and judicial precepts of The Old Law and focusing only on the moral law, Christ really did fulfill the Law of God and redeem mankind from our inability to be saved. Thus, He fulfills the prophecy of Malachi: "... everywhere they bring sacrifice to My name, and a pure offering; for great is My name among the nations, says The LORD of Hosts [1:10-11]." This sacrifice "everywhere" is the Sacrifice of Calvary brought to us (who were ethnically and religiously pagan) in time and in place through the self-same Sacrifice of the Mass being offered throughout the world today "everywhere".

St. Paul is correct when he says "... that a man is justified by faith apart from works of law [Rom 3:28]." However, by "works of the law" he does not mean the Ten Commandments, as if they would be abolished. Rather St. Paul means that we are saved not by ceremonial animal sacrifices, not by purificatory washings, not by dietary 'kosher' laws, and certainly not by circumcision. But neither does he mean that we are saved by 'faith alone', St Paul never said that [Rom 2:13]. Rather, we are saved by the 'obedience of faith' [Rom 1:5; 6:16; 16:26], a 'Living Faith' that, like the Samaritan in the Gospel today, has gratitude in the heart for the grace of God freely given. The Samaritan leper acts on his faith and his reward is Our Lord's assurance of salvation "...your faith has saved you". It is from our sins against the moral law (something far worse than leprosy) that The Lord has forgiven us and saved us. Our response of gratitude is in living the moral commandments of love, and The Lord's reply to us as well is: "Stand up and go; your faith has saved you.

#### In addition:

St Paul (& St. Peter) is quoted as saying that other precepts (judicial, ceremonial, dietary, purificatory) are <u>not</u> necessary for salvation, e.g. circumcision [Gal 6:15]. However, neither he nor Our Lord is quoted as saying the moral precepts are not necessary. Indeed, Christ says repeatedly that we will be judged by our moral deeds. "...'Depart from me, you cursed, into the eternal fire prepared for the devil and his angels; for ...you gave me no food, ...you gave me no drink, ...you did not welcome me, ...you did not clothe me, ...you did not visit me." Mt 25:41–43.
