

Repair My Church

In 1206, a young man named Francesco Bernadone heard the words, "Go repair my Church for it is in ruin" from the crucifix at the church of San Damiano in Assisi at the time he was searching for direction in his life. These words moved him to repair the church and preserve the crucifix.

God Gave Me Brothers

With his early followers, Francesco realized that the Church is the people of God wounded by war and division, by poverty and greed. Not long after that, he heard the Gospel of St. Matthew read at the Church of St. Mary of the Angels about the command of Jesus to the apostles to proclaim the good news to all creatures which confirmed his vocation to a life in mission.

With hearts rooted in the Word of Jesus, Francesco, now known as Francis of Assisi, and his followers reached out to the world, from Assisi to neighboring Europe, North Africa, Asia, and the Americas, considering all women and men, and all creatures, as brothers and sisters. Listening

to the Word of God is also listening to the needs of the poor while serving the hungry, the sick, victims of wars and calamities, and those marginalized by society.

A s present-day followers of St. Francis of Assisi, we Franciscans continue our 800-year-old tradition of missionary work open to the needs of the times. Today, Franciscan Friars are found in more than 100 countries, responding to the spiritual and material needs of people entrusted to our care.

And God gives us generous people who support our mission to the poor

From the time of St. Francis, people of good will assist our mission ministry with their prayers and generous support. The generosity of our benefactors enables us to deliver hope to the poor, making the flow of divine providence reach the needy through soup kitchens, medical clinics, housing for people with leprosy, scholarships and education programs, orphanages, centers for people with disabilities, vocational training, housing, clean water projects, emergency disaster relief, and supporting Franciscan parishes.

The generous gifts that we receive help to pay for the training of young members of the Franciscan Order in mission countries. As the Franciscan Order grows in numbers in other parts of the world, there is a great need to support the education and spiritual formation of young friars.


