



A TALE OF TWO CITIES and the Sinners Who Build Them

The readings this 24th Sunday of O.T. reflect the patient mercy of God. In the Book of Exodus [32:7-11, 13-14], although the Israelites had no sooner left Egypt and experienced the hand of God at the Red Sea, they soon turned away from the service of God. Nevertheless, God does not wipe them out but reproves them for their evil ways, to set them on the straight path again. In St. Paul's Letter to Timothy we see that St. Paul himself speaks of God's mercy, "I was mercifully treated," he says, "so that in me, as the foremost, Christ Jesus might display all his patience as an example for those who would come to believe in Him for everlasting life." So too, in the Gospel, Our Lord shows mercy, for He, "...welcomes sinners and eats with them."

It is interesting that, although Jesus "...welcomes sinners and eats with them", He nevertheless introduces a difference or distinction about "sinners". He speaks about two types of sinners; He does this when He speaks about sinners as the "lost sheep", for He ends the story with the line, "I tell you, in just the same way, there will be more joy in heaven over one sinner who repents than over ninety-nine righteous people who have no need of repentance". Of course we all understand the term "lost sheep", for as followers of Christ we are the lost sheep — sinners in need of redemption. What, however, is meant by the "righteous people who have no need of repentance"? Certainly Our Lord does not mean to say that there are two categories of human beings on earth: one, the unfortunate 'sinners' who sin and, the other, those fortunate 'righteous' people who never sin. This is the distinction among the sheep, between the repentant one, and the righteous ninety-nine.

Does this mean to say that Jesus, The Son of God, died on the cross for only one out of every hundred people? I thought that we were all sinners? Doesn't the Prophet Isaiah say "We had all gone astray like sheep, each following his own way" [Ish 53:6]. Doesn't St Paul say "...there is no distinction; all have sinned and are deprived of the glory of God" [Rom 3:23]. Exactly who then are these "people who have no need of repentance"? How are we to understand this?

Our Lord categorizes it in this way: first, that *all people* have sinned – certainly all people have need of The Savior, Jesus; secondly, however, there are *some people who consider themselves 'self-righteous'*, who do not acknowledge their sinfulness and thus consider themselves in need of neither religion nor savior. In other words, there are two types of sinners: 1) those who know they have been lost, have consequently repented, and are now being redeemed in Christ (repentant sinners); and 2) those who do not care (or do not know) that they are sinners and are therefore neither capable of repenting, nor being redeemed by Christ (*un*repentant sinners). We can – indeed *must* – say that such unrepentant sinners are incapable of being redeemed by Christ because they sin against the Holy Spirit by presumption of their own self-righteousness [Mk 3:28].

For it is as simple as this: how can persons who are genuinely lost be found if they don't consider themselves lost? As an example, take the First Step of *Alcoholics Anonymous*, one must first acknowledge that one is lost and in need of help (being found). This is the very first – and we must add the most important – of the "Twelve Steps", because without it the addicted person is going nowhere! This is the "Turning Point" (crisis or conversion point); this acknowledgement of personal guilt is the first movement toward addiction recovery. And those who sin are addicted – and enslaved – to their own inordinate desires [Jn 8:34].

With this distinction in mind we can see the reason why Our Lord said, "I did not come to call the righteous, but sinners" [Mt 9:13; Mk 2:17]. Therefore, since "all have sinned" [Rom 2:23], the real distinction is therefore between those who repent and those who do not repent. Repentance means to be sorry [L. poenitēre to feel regret]; from it follows penance which is an act of sorrow manifesting our turning away from sin. Without penance then, we must question whether a person is honestly repentant, that is sorry, as St. John The Baptist questions the repentance of the Sadducees and Pharisees [Mt 3:7].

Unfortunately, there are many unrepentant sinners (signified by the ninety-nine out of a hundred!). Some of these act out of ignorance. The worst, however, are those who deny their sins and still want to be considered as full, active members in communion with The Flock, The Mystical Body of Christ, His Church. These are the ones our Lord called 'hypocrites', actors! They want all the benefits, but they don't want to pay the cost of discipleship. As Catholic Christians, we do no favor to those unrepentant sinners when we sit by and do nothing about their situation when we have the opportunity, and sometimes the obligation, to say at least something. Or worse, when we comply and take part in their wish to have their cake and eat it too. When we enable them then we too sin. To understand where such are headed we simply need to read *The Acts of The Apostles* (Acts 5:1ff), about Ananias and Sapphira who wanted to act one way before the Apostles, to gain the respect of the Christian Community, while continuing to live another secret life altogether.

So how do we remain a repentant sinner on the road to heaven? In the end, it's really about the love we choose. The choice is between an inordinate love of self, called *cupidity*, or the ordered love of God and neighbor, called *charity*. When do we choose? We choose whenever we come face-to-face with temptation – either sins of commission or omission (failing to do what we should). For what happens is that, as we proceed through our lives, we actualize, concretize, and characterize ourselves – we build our 'self' – after the love we choose. This is called by the theologian 'connaturalization'. It's the theological version of the nutritional adage "You are what you eat", except in this case "You are – or become – what you love". In the end we all follow a holy trinity: it is either, "Father, Son, and Holy Spirit", or, "Me, Myself, and I". This tragic opposition between the two loves is described by St. Augustine, when he compared charity (the ordered love of God) and cupidity (the inordinate love of self). In his book *The City of God* he writes: "Two loves have built two cities: The love of God, even to the extent of despising self, has built up the City of God; and the love of self, even to the extent of despising God, has built the City of Man, of Babylon or perdition."

So finally one should ask, 'Am I building the Image of God, by a life of repentance?' Or, 'Am I building the City of Man, in the image of myself, rejecting penance and the discipline necessary to be a disciple of Christ?' St. Paul teaches, "...each man's work will become manifest; for The Day (of The Lord) will disclose it, because it will be revealed with fire, and the fire will test what sort of work each one has done [I Cor 3:12]." Certainly, God is Merciful; He will give us all a lot of time to think about this, to act upon this - at least until the last beat of our heart. But after that last beat of your heart, you will then inherit the city that you have built, to live in it for all eternity! Let us never neglect to confess our sinfulness to Jesus in Sacramental Confession, for He "...welcomes sinners and eats with them."
