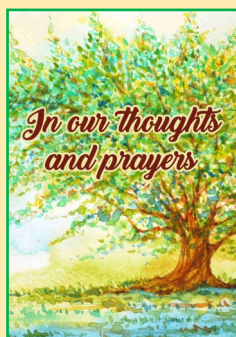

PASTOR'S PAGE

Friends,

First, I would like to simply say thank you to everyone for your graciousness a couple weeks ago when I was able to visit Austin, TX to celebrate a 10 year reunion with my seminary class. Even allowing that it doesn't seem real that that much time has passed already, I really can't adequately put into words what a blessing that time was – from the small moments of catching up with friends over coffee after Mass in the morning to the weightier ones of praying for and blessing each other, to even the silly and unexpected ones, like eating French fries by the pool while somehow still managing to have a conversation about moral theology. But without question my favorite part of the week was the evening after dinner when we assembled for grace sharing to review the past ten years of ministry in the Lord's vineyard.

I was not worried about the state or future of the Church before we did that, but I am so much more hopeful even than I already was, because I got to hear from 28 of my classmates about what God was doing in their lives and through their openness to his grace. There were some beautiful and vulnerable moments of sharing – one moment that particularly resonated was when a friend and classmate, speaking about his experience of being a priest and spiritual father, said, "I just really like being a dad." But what stood out to me most then and what still stands out to me now is how the single theme that ran through what all of us said, almost universally, was some variation of our own brokenness and complete inadequacy being made perfect in Christ. All of us were back in the seminary, and are now as priests, imperfect screwups who are just as much in need of God's grace as the people He sends us to preach to. And we need that. Jesus told St. Paul, "My grace is sufficient for you, for my power is made perfect in weakness" (2 Cor 12:9a), and Paul's reaction to that was similar to what I heard from my brothers: "I will all the more gladly boast of my weaknesses, that the power of Christ may rest upon me. For the sake of Christ I am content with weaknesses, insults, hardships, persecutions, and calamities; for when I am weak, then I am strong" (2 Cor 12:9b-10).

Dear brothers and sisters, I say this with complete sincerity, as I looked around that room that evening, the thought occurred to me, "I might be the least intelligent and least holy person here right now... and that's AMAZING!" Not in a falsely humble way, but genuinely, to be gathered with brothers like that, who are so open to what the Lord wants to do in their lives, who love Christ and his Church and his Mother so much, who strive so hard for holiness – not only despite, but precisely *because* of their shortcomings and failures... What a blessing. What an absolute blessing! So when I say that I have more hope than I already had for what God is doing in his Church, now you know why.

Jesus Christ has never, and will never, abandon his bride, the Church. He will always come for us. And he will always give us good shepherds, after his own Sacred Heart. Dear friends, please continue, as I know you already do, to pray for me, to pray for our bishops, and to pray for our Holy Father. But I would ask you to also pray for the priests who were ordained in my class. 29 of us made it to the reunion; our ordination class was 53, and 50 of us are still in ministry. We need your prayers. The Church needs your prayers. The world needs your prayers. But in a special I would ask you, as my brothers and sisters in Christ, to pray for my brother priests and me, that we continue to grow in humility, and that we continue to fall more in love with Jesus every day, especially in the Eucharist – in short, pray for us, that we are made, by his grace and in his time, worthy of the calling we received. I love you, and you are in my prayers constantly. Please keep me in yours.

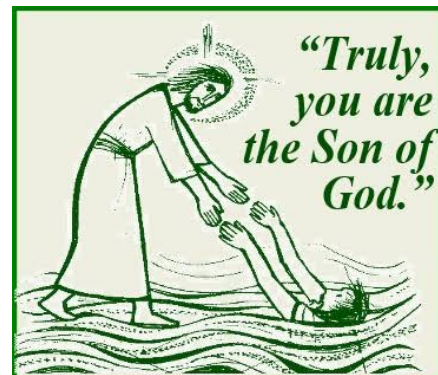

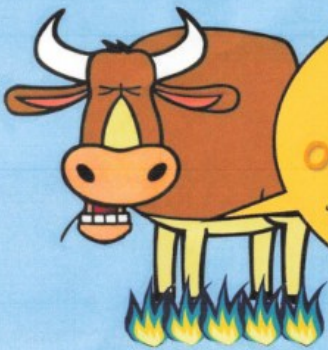

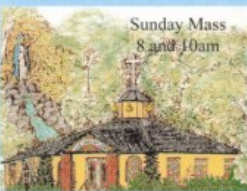
