The Radical and Scandalous Nature of Christ

Gospel John 1:6-8, 19-28

John the Baptist appears as a great prophet. He is sent, not to the city but, ironically, into the desert. Why would God send a prophet to prophesy in a deserted area? Why was John the Baptist so extreme as to wear a camel's hair shirt; to eat bugs like grasshoppers; and to scrounge for wild honey? How is it that this manner and plan of action was fitting to the preparation of the coming of God into the world? We must remember too that, although John appears to our modern sensibilities to be extreme, he also appeared extreme to his contemporaries, a real radical! [Mt 11:18]. One whom civilized people would most likely reject. The question again is: How is it that John the Baptist's extreme manner was fitting for the preparation of the coming of God into the world? We can perhaps find the answer when John's disciple's approach Christ.



When John the Baptist's disciples approached Jesus to ask if He is 'The One' who is to come, Jesus answered, not with some mere verbal assurance of his identity but, by pointing to His works. Jesus tells them of all that He is doing for the lame, the blind, the lepers, the poor, the sinners, and in even raising the dead. However, Jesus adds something else: that "Blest are they who find no stumbling block (i.e. scandal) in Me [Jn 11:6]". Why does Jesus add this last phrase? Essentially saying, "I hope that I am not going to scandalize any of you?" What is a scandal?

A scandal or stumbling block takes place when we see a religious, or we could even say a 'good' person, sin, or seriously fail in the expectations of what we thought them to be. Usually we see the application of the term scandal in relation to highly publicized personalities, Hollywood stars, sports figures, presidents, even church ministers. What's more, it seems that we crave to read and hear about scandals. Newspapers, TV and radio programs love scandals, it creates business for them. Perhaps we like to hear about scandals because it makes us feel that our own sins are not so bad. The trouble is that scandals, over time, can desensitize us to evil in the world, so that nothing becomes a scandal anymore. As the song says: "In olden days, a glimpse of stocking was looked on as something shocking. But now, heaven knows, Anything Goes!". It's kind of like boiling a frog in a pot of water, start with warm water and increase the heat gradually so the frog doesn't notice and jump out of the pot, and soon he'll be boiling.

So what is the scandal or 'stumbling block' that Our Lord refers to in His reply to John's disciples? The scandal of Christ was that He did not come for power, conquest, and glory; that His appearance was of that, not of a winner but of that of a loser. That He came *not to be served, but to serve and to give His life as a ransom for the many* [Mt 28:20]. The scandal of Christ was that He came *to call sinners* [Mk 2:17], *all who labor and are heavy burdened* [Mt 11:28]. Moreover, He came to die upon the cross for them, a radical measure indeed! Most of the Jews were *incapable* of recognizing their own savior because of this scandal – what we can call the 'scandal of the cross'.

The fault of the Jewish leadership was *not* that they held God in so great esteem. It was *not* that they built the most magnificent temple. It was *not* that they fought and preserved the special heritage of Divine Revelation of the ethical, monotheistic faith in the one merciful and personal God. In short, it was *not* in that the Jews held God high, *but that they did not hold themselves to be low*. The fault of the Jewish leadership was they became somewhat proud, presumptuous, and vainglorious. In their false pride they held misconceptions of who and what they were in relationship to God as His chosen people. As a result they could not humble themselves and say that they were *nothing* in relation to God [Jn 15:5]. "Their Christ" could not possibly be a king who comes to them . . . *meek and riding on an ass . . . a beast of burden* [Mt 21:5]. Thus in the end, we see the Jewish leadership goading the crucified Christ, "If you are the Son of God, come down from the *cross...*" [Mt 27:40], as if to say 'Lower your standards, so we don't have to suffer, *then* we will believe [Mk 15:32].'

In answer to our question: How is it that John the Baptist's extreme manner was fitting to the preparation of the coming of Christ into the world? The answer is: like-to-like. It was to prepare for the radical and scandalous nature of Christ, the Godman, Who would be the fulfillment of Isaiah's "suffering servant". This is why Our Lord replies, not with words, but by pointing out His works, to overcome the commonly held opinions and false expectations – the scandal -- about John and Himself, as He says in another passage, "To what shall I compare this generation? For John (the Baptist) came neither eating nor drinking, and they said, 'He is possessed by a demon!' The Son of Man came eating and drinking and they said, 'Look, he is a glutton and a drunkard, a friend of tax collectors and sinners!' [Mt 11:19]." And then Jesus adds 1/4 "But wisdom is vindicated by Her works." So then, indeed "Blest are they who find no stumbling block (i.e. scandal) in Christ [Jn 11:6]".

In other words, blessed are they who can perceive the works of God beyond the common opinions [paradox] and so-called 'wisdom' of this world. Just as the truly wise and humble three kings from the east came and did Christ homage because they were humble enough, and wise enough, to see beyond the borders of human wisdom and human pride [I Cor 1:18]. St. Paul sums this up well when he explains the lowly Christ to the Christians at Corinth: "For Jews demand signs and Greeks seek wisdom, but we preach Christ crucified, a stumbling block [a scandal] to Jews and folly to Gentiles, but to those who are called, both Jews and Greeks, Christ the power of God and the wisdom of God. For the foolishness of God is wiser than men, and the weakness of God is stronger than men [I Cor 1:22-25]."


In conclusion then, we can see why John the Baptist was so extreme. HE HAD TO BE! He had to be in order truthfully and honestly to prepare the way of the Messiah and God in the hearts of those who had fallen asleep. John appeared in the desert to prepare people to seek Jesus out a desert – the wasteland of their own empty minds and hearts. Hearts that have been disappointed by the best things this world has to offer; dissatisfied hearts that know *experientially* that 'the world is not enough'. We *need* God, we *need* 'The Infinite', and John knew that men would never find God in the clutter of their comfortable lives. John – the Elijah of the New Covenant – knew that men would need to enter the desolation of the desert experience of humble repentance from sin to finally find God, just as Elijah of the Old Covenant humbly covered his face when he found God in "¼the tiny whispering sound in the cave at Mt. Sinai [I Kings 19:12]. So, during Advent we should dwell upon the birth of Christ in its meagerness, its simplicity, and its humility so that we are sure of the kind of Messiah that we are seeking out and preparing for. Otherwise, we run the risk of underestimating the scandalous, radical measures that God wishes to take *in our own lives* by presenting a cross to us when we had other plans and expectations.

For many, of whom I have often told you and now tell you even with tears, live as enemies of the cross of Christ. Their end is destruction, their god is their belly, and they glory in their shame, with minds set on earthly things. But our true homeland is in heaven, and from it we await a Savior, the Lord Jesus Christ...


