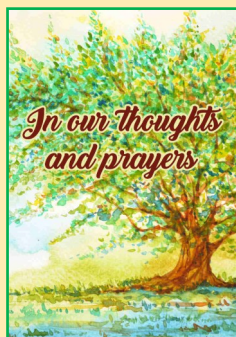

Ash Wednesday marks the first day of Lent, the 40 days of fasting and penance that will end on Easter Sunday.

Ashes are placed on the heads of Christians on Ash Wednesday, in the form of a cross (based on Genesis 3:19) used traditionally to accompany this gesture are, "Remember that you are dust, and to dust you shalt return".

Where do we get the ashes used on Ash Wednesday? They are produced by burning the Palms from the previous Palm Sunday. A little moisture is added, and maybe some olive oil to help the ashes stick to our forehead better. Catholics leave the ashes on their forehead all day to remind us that we have to fast and abstain from eating meat. It should also remind us to pray all day.

Why ashes? The practice came from the Early Christians who used ashes to show repentance. After going to confession, it was common for the priest to give the person ashes on their forehead. Catholics have been receiving ashes on Ash Wednesday since the time of St. Gregory the Great. In 1091, Pope Urban II encouraged the entire Church to use ashes on Ash Wednesday.

The distribution of Ashes is not a Sacrament. It is what the church calls a Sacramental. A practice to remind us that we are expected to make a change in our lives and that Lent is the best time to start.

Ash will be distributed on February 18, Ash Wednesday at 8:00 AM and 7:00 PM.

Music for Lent

Lent is a time of fasting, and one way this is highlighted in liturgical rituals is that the word Alleluia is not said or sung for the entire season. The Gospel Acclamation is different. We praise and honor Jesus without the usual celebratory Alleluia.

We will not be singing the Gloria during Lent. Some Feasts are exempt from this restriction because of their gravitas. Fasting from singing Alleluia and the Gloria makes us look forward to singing it again at the Vigil on Holy Saturday, when we celebrate the Resurrection of our Lord.

During Lent we will also be reducing the amount of music sung at Mass. We will not be singing an opening hymn. Instead, we will be singing the entrance Antiphon prescribed by the church. The cantor will sing a line and we will all repeat it after him. We will also dispense with the final hymn. We will sing, instead, another antiphon.

All this is to remind us that we are in the season of Lent. Sundays are special *days*. They are always a celebration of the Resurrection, except that since the church has only one day, when we are all present, to remind us that we are in Lent, we make a few changes on Sundays.

DIOCESE OF SAN DIEGO

As previously announced by the Diocese in 2022, at the conclusion of a three-year visitation, the Apostolic See (*specifically the then-Congregation for Institutes of Consecrated Life and Societies of Apostolic Life*) by means of a Decree dated 13 May 2022 and approved in forma specifica by Pope Francis, suppressed the religious institute formerly known as the Trinitarians of Mary. With this suppression, the former members of the Trinitarians were automatically dispensed from their vows and are no longer permitted to present themselves as religious. There is no right of appeal, and the Trinitarians have ceased to exist as a religious institute recognized by the Catholic Church.

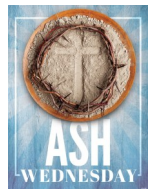
On the way home from the Ash Wednesday service, a young boy asked his mother, "Is it true that we are made of dust?"

Diocesan Decree for the Year of St. Francis of Assisi

Pope Leo has designated a Year of St. Francis from January 10, 2026 to January 10, 2027 to celebrate the Eighth Centenary of the passage of St. Francis of Assisi.

The Apostolic Penitentiary issued a decree granting “the Plenary Indulgence under the usual conditions (sacramental confession, Eucharistic communion and prayer for the intentions of the Holy Father) which can also be applied in the form of suffrage for the souls in Purgatory.

Besides offering the indulgence to all the Franciscan Families and anyone who observes the Rule of St. Francis, all the faithful without distinction can receive the *indulgence “by visiting in the form of a pilgrimage any Franciscan conventual church, or place of worship anywhere in the world dedicated to St. Francis or connected to him for any reason, and there they will devoutly follow the Jubilee rites or spend at least a suitable period of time in pious meditation and will raise prayers to God so that, following the example of St. Francis, may sentiments of Christian charity towards one’s neighbor and authentic wishes for harmony and peace among peoples spring up in hearts, concluding with the Our Father, the Creed and invocations to the Blessed Virgin Mary, St Francis of Assisi, St Clare and all the saints of the Franciscan Family”* (Eighth Centenary of the death of St. Francis of Assisi, Apostolic Penitentiary Decree).

Therefore, The Most Rev. Michael Pham, Bishop of the Diocese of San Diego, has decreed that the Churches of the

1. **Immaculate Conception**, Old Town,
 2. **Mission Basilica San Diego de Alcalá**, San Diego,
 3. **Old Mission San Luis Rey**, Oceanside,
 4. **San Luis Rey Parish**, Oceanside,
 5. **St. Anthony of Padua**, Imperial,
 6. **St. Didacus**, San Diego,
 7. **St. Francis Chapel at the Mission San Diego de Alcalá**,
 8. **St. Francis of Assisi**, Vista,
- have been designated as the pilgrimage destinations in this diocese.

The elderly, the sick and those who for serious reasons cannot leave home will also be able to obtain the plenary indulgence by spiritually joining the Jubilee celebrations and offering their prayers, pains or sufferings to God.

Conditions for receiving the Indulgence (for oneself or for the deceased)

- Sacramental confession to be in God’s grace (in the eight days before or after);
- Participation in Mass and Eucharistic Communion;
- To visit in the form of a pilgrimage any Franciscan conventual church or place of worship dedicated to St. Francis anywhere in the world, where one renews one’s profession of faith, through the recitation of the Creed, to reaffirm one’s Christian identity;
- The recitation of the Lord’s Prayer, to reaffirm the dignity of children of God, received in Baptism;
- To pray for the intentions of the Holy Father, to reaffirm belonging to the Church, whose foundation and visible center of unity is the Roman Pontiff.
