

for I cannot walk alone.


Morning Prayer

PASTOR'S PAGE

When we hear the Gospel this Sunday [Mt 13:24-43] of The Parable of The Weeds in The Wheat Field we cannot help but think about the classic question of the problem of evil. Why are there weeds in the wheat field? Why is there evil in the world? Or simply, 'Why do bad things happen to good people?'





So what is evil? Evil is by its very nature defined as a negation – a privation (or lacking) – of some good thing that *should be* or *ought to* exist in its fullness. Evil applies most appropriately in the moral order of things. Evil entered the world through one man's choice, and through evil, came death [I Cor 15:21]. So, while God created man as entirely good, man created evil in the world through his choice of a lesser existence. Adam and Eve were created 'to be like God', but according to God's Plan that would have brought about the fullness of the divinity for man. Adam and Eve chose a lesser path that brought evil into the world. God on His behalf, *allowed evil* to come about (*He did not directly will evil*) through the free-will decision of the first man and woman. Had God not allowed evil, man would not be free, but rather a robot forced to accept God's Plan in all things. We would be no different than the animals all around us that operate on instinct and by nature without a reason and an existence of their own. So we can say that God Wills evil in the world *only indirectly*, or put positively: *God allows evil only so that man can freely choose the path he wants to follow*. We should add that the allowance of evil will never overcome the ultimate outcome of the triumph of goodness, truth, and beauty. Hence Jesus speaks of allowing the weeds, however, they will ultimately be bundled and burned.

This leaves us with the necessity of trying to grasp evil in our midst, and having faith that good will ultimately triumph. As an example, it's much like parents leaving their son or daughter out unsupervised for the first time (college): they allow them their freedom, but at the risk that the child may choose something harmful to themselves and/or others. But why would they risk any danger to their child? Because without the risk there would never be maturity; no one could earn trustworthiness if we never trusted them. Hence, while God Directly Wills that only good things come about in the world, God also allows evil only indirectly so as to preserve man's freedom, and ultimately, to strengthen man by a superior grace [Jn 1:17] in Christ as St. Paul says to the Christians at Rome [5:15ff]: "But the free gift is not like the trespass. . . . If, because of Adam's trespass, death reigned through that one man, HOW MUCH MORE will those who receive the abundance of grace and the free gift of righteousness reign in life through the one man Jesus Christ!" For ". . . where sin abounded, grace abounded all the more, so that, as sin reigned in death, grace also might reign through righteousness to eternal life through Jesus Christ our Lord." So what we begin to see is two perspectives of viewing the evils of this world: saintly, or sinful.

The sinful perspective is to see evil only in its negative fashion, here and now as in a microcosm, solely in relation to oneself. In this sense evil is only negative pure and simple and has no redeeming factors to it at all. It is only seen in this negative fashion because the perspective is one of 'self', and how evil affects the self-centered 'me'. "Woe is me" we say, and "Why me?" When this person gives way to temptation and sin (moral evil) they see only their personal failure and become despondent in the midst of the world and its temptations. For strength they turn to the worldly philosophy of 'power through positive thinking', which falsely assures them with the lie that, they can do all things by their own power if only they set their mind to it. But this ultimately fails, for without the strength that comes from the grace of God in Christ Jesus, the truth is . . . we can do nothing [Jn 15:5]. Such a secular worldly perspective is not to see things from the Divine Perspective of God, Who sees all things in one entire glance. It is a kind of 'arrested development' that does not allow for any vision of the future outcome of what a given evil weighs in the balance in relation to all the good that is ultimately done throughout all creation. Suh is a myopic, near-sighted vision. We must remember that "...The Lord sees not as man sees; man looks on the outward appearance, but the Lord looks interiorly linto the heart] [I Sam 16:7]."


By contradistinction the perspective of the saintly is to see both the evil of temptation (which always precedes a moral evil), and sin, as opportunities to grow in God's Grace. Through this *faithfully trusting perspective* the saintly know that God our Merciful Father will never send us too much – a cross beyond our ability – which we cannot handle *through the grace of God The Son*, in Christ Jesus. The saintly person sees that the path to greater glory in God's Divine Life, offered through grace [Rom 5:3], is only possible through the humble acceptance of trials and temptations. This perspective of the saintly comes about only by setting one's eyes on the things above – the contemplation of God Alone [Col 3:1]. It is only in and through the contemplation of God that the saintly see their own nothingness and weakness [II Cor 12:10]. Through this 'self-knowledge' which comes about by contemplating God, one ceases to turn naturally inward for their strength (in self) and begins to turn (conversion - *metánoia*) supernaturally to God, Who is the source of all good things. Conversion is therefore a habit that we must acquire which says reflexively "He [God] must increase, I must decrease [Jn 3:30]."

This brings us back to the weeds and the wheat. A weed is by definition "a plant out of place". In this sense a tulip could be considered a weed if it were in the middle of a wheat field. Conversely, wheat in the middle of a tulip field could be considered a weed. God's Perspective changes everything. The Greeks (and Romans) had a flower they called the heliotropium [Latin heliotropium [Gk: helio sun + tropos turn]. It was a flower whose face always naturally turned to the sun for light and strength throughout the day, from sunrise to sunset. In the midst of the field of this world we, as Christians, must become like that sunflower (a SON-follower) and turn reflexively (and reflectively) not to the weeds, or to the other wheat, but to The Son of God for the light and strength of His grace. Only then can we stand in the midst of the weeds of this world and focus upon the fruits that we shall bear at the harvest time at the end of the world: some thirty, some sixty, and some one hundred fold. "Whoever has ears ought to hear."

LARGEST KNOWN CEMETERY BURIAL OF HUMAN BODIES IN HISTORY

After three and a half years of legal wrangling, the Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors in August of 1985 ordered the 16,433 mangled babies' bodies found in Woodland Hills in 1982 to be turned over to the Guerra-Gutirrez-Alexander Mortuary for burial. The mortuary was selected because it didn't have a religious affiliation.

To comply with a court order that the identity of the mothers, babies and abortionists be concealed, the Los Angeles County Health Department ordered the bodies to be dumped in bulk out of the individual containers into six coffin-sized plywood boxes lined with plastic. The department assured the ACLU that there would be no containers with identifying marks. While the ACLU would not object, the Feminist Women's Health Center petitioned the Los Angeles Superior Court to block the burial, but the courts refused.

The largest babies were carefully placed inside. The smaller bodies were finally placed within each box until all six coffins were filled. The weight of each of the six boxes containing the 16 thousand babies' bodies was so heavy that six adult men were needed to carry each of the six coffins.

On Sunday afternoon, October 6, 1985 six grey hearses carrying the coffins arrived at the Odd Fellows Cemetery in Boyle Heights. The non-denominational Odd Fellows Cemetery was chosen after proabortionists importuned the courts to block burial in a Catholic or other religious-affiliated cemetery, which had offered burial spaces.

Hundreds of people attended, including county supervisor Michael Antonovich, who read a eulogy from Ronald Reagan. Reagan's message stated: "Just as the terrible toll of Gettysburg can be traced to a tragic decision of a divided Supreme Court, so also can these deaths we mourn. Once again a whole category of human beings has been ruled outside the protection of the law by a court ruling which clashed with our deepest moral convictions." (Reagan had written a letter in May, 1982 encouraging a memorial for the 16,000 babies. White House counsel — now Supreme Court Chief Justice — John Roberts wanted the letter to be kept private. But the letter was published widely, including in the American Holocaust brochure.)

Others in attendance were U.S. Rep. Bob Dornan, state Senate President David Roberti, and state Sen. Joseph Montoya. Archbishop Roger Mahony was unavailable to attend, but Auxiliary Bishop John Ward attended and blessed the graves and bodies. Hank Stolk, the employee who was the Martin Container company employee involved in discovering the bodies, also gave a testimonial.

This was the largest known cemetery burial of human bodies in history.

CAT GETS VOTER REGISTRATION APPLICATION IN THE MAIL

Scratch this name off the list.

An Atlanta family said it received a voter registration form this week for their cat Cody Tims – who died 12 years ago. "There's a huge push but if they're trying to register cats, I'm not sure who else they're trying to register," the late feline's owner, Carol Tims, told Fox5 Atlanta. "I'm not sure if they're trying to register dogs, mice, snakes."

The Tims say they found the form addressed to the cat in their mailbox on Wednesday.

Carol Tims described Cody as a "great cat, indoor and outdoor" who "loved his family, loved his neighborhood" and lived to the age of 18.

But in terms of his voting prospects, "he's a cat and he's been dead for a long time," Tims told Fox5 Atlanta.

The Georgia Secretary of State's Office told the station that they did not send out the form and that third-party groups behind such applications often use mailing lists to obtain names and addresses of people — and in this case, a cat.

"Third-party groups all over the country are targeting Georgia to help register qualified individuals," it said in a statement. "This group makes you wonder what these out-of-town activists are really doing. Make no mistake about it, this office is dedicated to investigating all types of fraud."



Asked how Cody might have voted in the polls – if he could – Tims told Fox5Atlanta that he was a "Democat."

BIDEN PLANS TO END CONTRACEPTION EXEMPTION FOR LITTLE SISTERS

The Supreme Court's decision only found in favor of the executive action excusing the sisters and others with conscience objections – action that could be revoked or reversed by a subsequent administration.

WASHINGTON — Former vice president Joe Biden pledged on Wednesday to reinstate Obama-era policies that would require the Little Sisters of the Poor to ensure access to birth control and abortifacients for employees in violation of their religious beliefs.

Biden, who is the presumptive Democratic nominee for president, made the promise July 8, following the Supreme Court decision in favor of the Little Sisters of the Poor in the case *Little Sisters of the Poor v. Pennsylvania*, which upheld an exemption for the sisters from the "contraception mandate" which obliges employers to provide for contraceptive coverage for employees through their health care plans.

"If I am elected I will restore the Obama-Biden policy that existed before the [Supreme Court's 2014] Hobby Lobby ruling: providing an exemption for houses of worship and an accommodation for nonprofit organizations with religious missions," said Biden in a statement released by his campaign.

"This accommodation will allow women at these organizations to access contraceptive coverage, not through their employer-provided plan, but instead through their insurance company or a third-party administrator."

The Affordable Care Act (ACA) was signed into law in 2010, while Biden was serving as vice president. On August 1, 2011, then-Secretary of Health and Human Services Kathleen Sebellius announced an interim final rule that required all ACA-compliant insurance plans to cover at least one form of female birth control, including sterilization. At the time the bill was voted on and signed, there was no contraception mandate included.
