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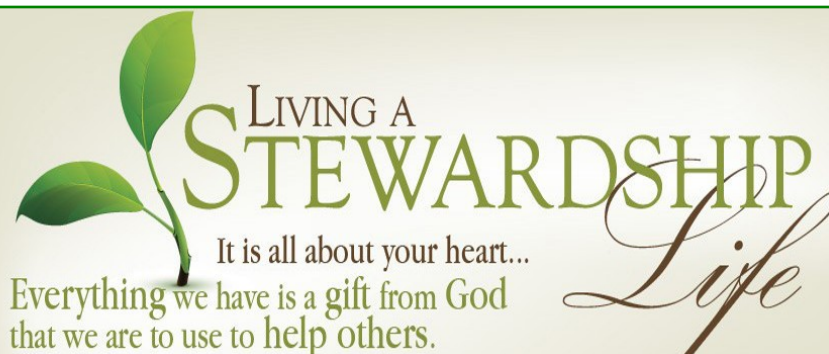

FOR FUTURE REFERENCE:

Now that public Masses **in the church** has resumed, please continue to proceed safely, and abide by the following safety guidelines:

HYGIENE

All parishioners above the age of 2 must wear facial covering.

The covering must be on for the duration of Mass. Please bring your own mask. Hand sanitizer will be available at all entrances and the restrooms. The church will be disinfected after each Mass. All holy water stoops will be empty.

All worship aides have been removed from the pews.

SOCIAL DISTANCING

As of today, we are limited to 100 people per Mass. This is our governor's stipulation and is subject to change. We plan to accommodate parishioners on a first come, first serve basis. Every other row will be closed and the available pews will be marked for distancing. Groups from the same household are permitted to sit together. The floor will be marked for proper distancing. The children's chapel will be unavailable for seating. No donuts. All faith formation activities are still suspended.

WHAT YOU NEED TO KNOW

The Sunday obligation is still dispensed. If you are in a high-risk category, or are feeling ill, you are encouraged to stay home. There will not be a collection but there will be a box for donations. Bulletins will be available but must be picked up on a table in the portico. Missals will be available in the donut room for families to take home. Personal use missals may brought to Mass but must be taken home. Please refrain from handshaking and hugging.

LITURGY CHANGES

Mass time will be shortened to limit exposure. No Gloria, no Old Testament reading, no congregational singing, no procession of gifts, no sign of Peace. Holy Communion will be distributed under the form of consecrated bread only, and only on the hand. Please remove gloves to receive. Holy Communion will be distributed at the conclusion of Mass. To receive, maintain a six foot space, bow in reverence before the blessed sacrament, lower your mask, present your ungloved hand, consume immediately, and proceed directly to the parking lot.

PASTOR'S PAGE

Should You Not Have Had Pity on Your Fellow Servant, as I Had Pity on You?

When we think of pity, we think about a person who shares in another's sorrows. We think of a person who is compassionate, loving, and merciful. On the other hand, the person who is pitiless is a person who is proud, disdainful, and arrogant. Pity can be defined as *grief for another's distress*. From the very fact that a person takes pity on anyone, it follows that another's distress grieves him. And since sorrow or grief is about one's own ills, one grieves or sorrows for another's distress, *in so far as one looks upon another's distress as one's own*; that is, *another's distress enters into them in some way*.

Now this can happen in two ways: first, through union of the affections, which is the effect of love. For, since he who loves another looks upon his friend as *another self*, he counts his friend's hurt as his own, so that he grieves for his friend's hurt as though he were hurt himself. Hence grieving with one's friend is one of the signs of friendship, as St. Paul says: "*Rejoice with them that rejoice, weep with them that weep* [Rom 12:15]." Secondly, through real union, for instance when another's evil comes near to us, so as to pass to us from him. Hence men pity such as are like to them because it makes them realize that the same may happen to themselves. This also explains why the old and the wise who consider that they may fall upon evil times, as also feeble and timorous persons, are more inclined to pity: *whereas those who deem themselves happy, and so powerful as to think themselves in no danger of suffering any hurt, are not so inclined to pity*. This explains why our Lord cautions the rich, "*Truly, I say to you, it will be hard for a rich man to enter the kingdom of heaven*." [Mt 19:23; see also 13:22 Mk 10:24; Lk 6:24; 16:1].

God has pity for us in both ways, above. For, He truly loves us and feels our pain as His own as through union of the affections. Christ said to St. Paul on the road to Damascus, "*Saul, Saul, why are you persecuting Me?*" [Acts 9:6]" Jesus completely identifies Himself with the members of His Mystical Body, The Church, whom Paul was persecuting. But we can also say that God loves us through a real union which is not just that of affection from afar. We can see that Christ suffered for us, and died for us [Rom 5:8], *in our place* [Gal 2:20]. That, in becoming like us in all ways but sin, He took on our sufferings. Hence, God in Christ Jesus has not merely loved us through affection and from a distance, but He has become one of us so as to suffer for us, and even with us, redeeming us for eternal life.

Finally, Christ also shows us an example to follow, and wants us to share in the redemption through word *and deed*. The reason why Christ came among us is to redeem us, but He does so in a human fashion, so as to call us to follow in His footsteps literally! [Mt 11:28]. We *really* are transformed through being likened unto Christ by the power of His grace. So, just as Christ was meek and humble of heart and showed it through what He suffered, so we must be as well – this is not optional. If we do not become like Christ in this way – meek and humble of heart – neither will we take pity on our fellow man, nor forgive him, nor we will inherit the kingdom. As our Lord Jesus says at the end of the Gospel today of the pitiless: "*Then in anger his master handed him over to the torturers until he should pay back the whole debt. So will My Heavenly Father do to you, unless each of you forgives your brother from your heart.*"
