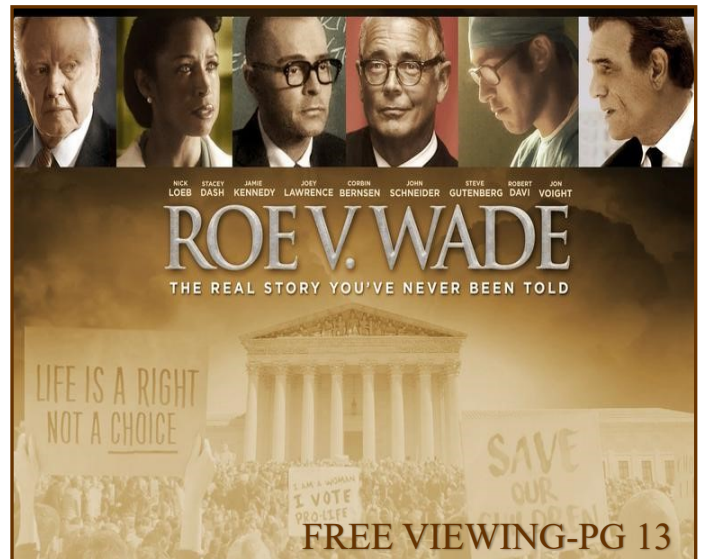
THE TRUTH COMES OUT

PASTOR'S PAGE**When the stormy seas of temptation arise
we must turn to The Lord Who Alone can calm our hearts and souls.**

the short Gospel [Mark 4:35-41] that we hear today we see how the boat in the storm is easily granted peace at the words of Our Lord, Who is "The Word" of God Himself. We can perhaps see that the boat in the storm represents an allegory of the Christian in the midst of temptations. In this example, the boat is The Church, the storm with the wind and the rain are temptations that are seemingly overtaking the boat, but a word to Jesus, like a prayer, brings calm upon the sea and tranquility of soul with it. Any Christian who has "*fought the good fight*" [I Tim 1:18] knows how temptation can be unrelenting, similar to a storm that tosses one about. We can therefore speak of temptation in this manner, for by the same token we know that God can assist at a moment's notice, end any temptation and bring peace to our beleaguered souls. The ending moral is that we must have faith and trust that God protects us and has not abandoned us; *that although it seems that He sleeps God is always watching over His children.*



In this example of temptation, we see that a word to Jesus – our Prayers — brings peace. St. Paul reminds us that we have a compassionate intercessor in heaven "*... Who in every respect has been tested as we are, yet without sinning* [Heb 4:15]". When Our Lord teaches us how to pray, He tells us to ask Our Father not to "lead" us into temptation. The translation of the Greek verb used here can mean both "*do not allow us to enter into temptation*" and "*do not let us yield to temptation*" [CCC 2846]. The Catechism of the Church reminds us that *God does not directly will temptations upon His children; rather He allows trials that we may grow in His grace* [Heb 12:5-11; Rev 3:19]. Again, we see that St. Paul encourages us in this same vein: "*God is faithful, and He will not let you be tempted beyond your strength, but with the temptation will also provide the way of escape, so that you may be able to endure it*" [I Cor 10:13].

God calls us then to use *the means available to us* to overcome trials and temptations. The Christian life is "some assembly required" (*although God does provide the batteries*). This means that we co-operate in our salvation, as St. Paul says, "*...work out your own salvation with fear and trembling* [Philipp 2:12]". We must use prayer to call upon The Holy Spirit to help us know The Way. The Church teaches us that we must implore The Holy Spirit Who helps us discern between trials [Acts 14:22; Rom 5:3ff; II Tim 3:12] (which are necessary for the growth of the inner man), and temptation [Js 1:12-16], which leads to sin and death [CCC 2847]. Thus, trials are necessary and make for strengthening in virtues, natural and supernatural; however, when we enter into temptation by willingly pursuing evil desires "*... then desire conceives and brings forth sin, and when sin reaches maturity, it gives birth to death*" [James 1:15]. *It is neither the goods of this earth, nor the temptations thereof, that are the sin; rather our own free-will pursuit of evil desires is a sin that can lead to death.*

An example. Temptations always entail a good that is seen as an end to utility or pleasure. Just as every lie has a grain of truth in it; so, every temptation has a spark of good in it. When we are tempted by something that is a proximate good – that is, something right before our very eyes – we are moved by nature to the good. We cannot help but be moved by the will, which desires the good naturally when the intellect sees the good so present. Therefore, these first motions of our passions toward a good in question (sex, alcohol, food, money, etc.) are not itself sinful! It is only natural after all to desire a good thing. It is only goodness that motivates us to act in any situation, either to preserve a good or acquire a new good. Therefore, these first movements of the passions are not sinful, but natural. *However, it is what we do with these desires that will either confirm us in virtue, or seduce us into sin.*

When our intellect grasps the good in question, we must then examine our conscience and ask whether this is a true good *for me* in my given state in life. For instance, if I am a married person, I know that the bikini clad girl selling toothpaste looks good (or perhaps the Marlboro man for ladies), but this is not a good thing *for me* because I am married and ordered toward my spouse in such things. Even if I am single (or celibate) it is not a good thing *for me*, because in each of these instances purity and continence must be invoked. We have to add too, that each and every person has their own predominant fault that they tend toward regarding the seven capital sins (pride, lust, anger, covetousness, envy, sloth, or gluttony). We must therefore, "*know thyself*" and guard against our favorite vices especially. In traditional spiritual theology, this is called "*custody of the senses*" and "*custody of the mind*". We control what we move our mind toward entertaining and reflecting upon.

This distinction between the 'first movements of the passions' toward the good, and 'the intellectual discernment about temptation being present' for my given situation, in my state in life, is crucial to understand. Otherwise, we will think that

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we are sinning constantly because we are, after all, exposed to all kinds of goods in the materialistic commercial culture in which we are immersed. Unscrupulous advertisers know that "sex sells". We cannot even pass the grocery store magazine rack without being tempted by some lewd image or headline. Hence, when we grasp the good and discern for our situation whether this is a true good *for me*, we will be able to avoid temptation and keep on the *straight and narrow path* of the virtues that lead to eternal life that Our Lord speaks about [Mt 7:13]. We only sin in our mind when we freely choose to continue to entertain evil thoughts after some good thing has aroused the passions. It is in the free will where we find the first movements of sin in man. This is when we must pray to God, Who seems to sleep while we are tempted, but Who nevertheless answers the prayers of those who seek Him first [Lk 11:10].

In closing then we can say that, just as in the area of faith *a thousand questions do not make a doubt*; so, in the area of morals *a thousand temptations do not make a sin* – it is only in giving into temptation with our free will that we fall. And we should be encouraged by The Lord Who gives us a sacrament to turn to when we sin – Reconciliation – which we should use as often as is necessary to turn again to The Lord.

Jesus said:

"For out of the heart (free will) come evil thoughts, murder, adultery, fornication, theft, false witness, slander. These are what defile a man..." Matthew 15:19
