

GOSPEL MEDITATION

October 29, 2023 30th Sunday in Ordinary Time

In our secularized culture, we all struggle with belief in God, at least to some degree. An atheist man named Robert Bridges once wrote to his friend, the Jesuit poet Gerard Manley Hopkins, asking how he could possibly learn to believe in God. Hopkins pithily responded: "Give alms." Would that help someone tempted by atheism today, like you and me?

I think so, and here's why. This week Jesus speaks of love for God and neighbor. These dual commands were nothing new when Jesus used them to sum up the Jewish law. What is new is the way he links them together in mutual dependency. In Jesus, God and man have become one. Human-love and God-love are now inseparably married forever.

The newness of the God-man means that there is now a permanently counter-intuitive way into the knowledge and love of God: love of our neighbor. To experience charity is to know God. That's what Hopkins was getting at for his friend. How we treat our fellow human beings is inseparable from faith in God. Do you want to have a stronger sense of God's loving presence and goodness? Commit to serving someone today and this week. Love him or her. Don't wait for love for God to appear in your heart before loving others. Jesus has united divine and human love. If you want to believe more in God, give alms.



THE EUCHARIST AND ART

The Gathering of Manna by a follower of Pieter Coecke van Aelst, c. 1532–1535, Philadelphia Museum of Art

The prayers of the Mass direct our gaze to the presence of the angels at every Eucharistic Celebration. In the Preface, for instance, the priest invites the faithful to join the angels in prayer: "And so, with Angels and Archangels, with Thrones and Dominions, and with all the hosts and Powers of heaven, we sing the hymn of your glory, as without end we acclaim: Holy, Holy, Holy Lord God of Hosts..." (Common Preface I). And in Eucharistic Prayer I, the priest prays these words, "In humble prayer we ask you, almighty God: command that these gifts be borne by the hands of your holy Angel to your altar on high..." As the *Catechism of the Catholic Church* notes, "In her liturgy, the Church joins with the angels to adore the thriceholy God" (CCC 335).

"Bread of Angels" is one of many titles of the Eucharist. It evokes the manna from heaven that God gave the Israelites in the desert. A painting by a follower of the renowned sixteenth-century Flemish court painter Pieter Coecke van Aelst visualizes the sixteenth chapter of Exodus that prefigures the Bread of Angels, the Eucharist.

A landscape of fields, trees, lakes, mountains, and hills leads the eye to the distant sky overcast with clouds. From a break in the clouds, a shower of round white flakes of bread fall gently to the ground. In the far distance, two figures raise their hands to the sky to catch the falling manna from heaven. On the right, two men and a young child repeat the same action, stretching their hands to heaven to catch the descending bread.

On the left, we see a well-dressed figure, clothed in regal robes with staff in hand. He turns to speak to a man while pointing to the heavenly shower that covers the landscape. Perhaps it is Moses, staff in hand, alerting Aaron to the miracle unfolding before them. At the center of the scene, an elegant kneeling woman, dressed in gold and wrapped in a delicate white robe, gazes at the sky as bread falls onto the tray she holds in her right hand.

Just as for Moses and the Israelites, God's providential care continues in the age of the Church through the Bread of Angels, the Eucharist, that nourishes us on our journey through history. Jesus gives himself to us as our true food for the daily journey of life.


